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**ÉTAT DE LA MISE EN ŒUVRE DES PROJETS ACCUSANT UN RETARD ET
PERSPECTIVES DES PAYS VISÉS À L'ARTICLE 5
À SE CONFORMER AUX PROCHAINES MESURES DE RÉGLEMENTATION
DU PROTOCOLE DE MONTRÉAL.**

RÉSUMÉ ANALYTIQUE

- Aucun pays ne semble être en conformité avec les mesures de règlementation, si l'on en juge par les données relatives à l'application des dispositions de l'article 7 en 2010 ou en 2011 et aux programmes de pays, soumises à compter du 12 mars 2012 ;
- Les dernières données sur la consommation indiquaient, toutefois, que la plupart des pays avaient une consommation de substances restantes (à l'exclusion des HCFC et des utilisations assujetties à dérogation) nulle, un seul pays ayant fait état d'une consommation de CFC (données sur 2009) ; deux pays ont déclaré une consommation de halons en 2009 ; 29, une consommation de bromure de méthyle (BM) ; et trois, une consommation de trichloroethane ;
- Sur les 25 questions concernant la conformité, en 2011, une a été réglée en application des données visées à l'article 7 ; dans deux cas, au vu des indications reçues, l'objectif en matière de conformité aurait été atteint, et, dans 22 cas, d'après des informations émanant des agences d'exécution et du Secrétariat de l'Ozone, il n'aurait pas été réalisé ;
- Les données sur la mise en œuvre des programmes de pays indiquent que :
 - Tous les pays ont communiqué des données selon le nouveau mode de présentation approuvé il y a plus de cinq ans, mais 59 pays ont transmis leurs données pour 2010 par voie électronique, parmi lesquels cinq pays qui se sont bornés à faire parvenir des fiches techniques ;
 - Sur un total estimé de consommation restante de SAO en 2011 de 1 057,8 tonnes PAO dans les pays visés à l'article 5, si l'on exclut les HCFC, il reste environ 830,3 tonnes PAO que le Comité exécutif doit examiner pour statuer ;
 - Toute la quantité de consommation restante (830,3 tonnes PAO) est du BM ;
 - Une consommation totale de HCFC de 506 610 tonnes métriques (33 589 tonnes PAO) a été déclarée dans les données issues des programmes de pays. Pour les 145 pays qui ont communiqué des données relatives à 2009 et 2010, la consommation de HCFC a augmenté de 7,2 pour cent ;
 - Parmi les pays qui ont transmis des informations sur les systèmes d'autorisation, 134 sur les 144 pays ayant des obligations de déclaration ont indiqué que ces systèmes fonctionnaient (ils étaient opérationnels dans 113 sur les 121 pays qui ont communiqué des données sur la période 2010-2011, ils fonctionnaient de manière « satisfaisante » ou « très bien » dans 97 d'entre eux) ;
 - Le HCFC-22, le HCFC-141b et le HCFC-142b continuent d'être beaucoup moins coûteux que les CFC en question.
- Sur les 22 projets dont la mise en œuvre est retardée, six ont été achevés, deux n'auraient, d'après les indications que l'on en a, enregistré pour la première fois, aucune avancée, un risque d'être annulé d'un commun accord, et onze font l'objet d'une recommandation concernant la poursuite de la surveillance. Israël et l'Espagne n'ont fait état d'aucun retard ;
- Un rapport supplémentaire est recommandé pour 33 projets pour lesquels des rapports de situation ont été soumis lors de la présente réunion et six rapports supplémentaires sont recommandés pour les activités de préparation de six plans de gestion des HCFC (PGEH).

Introduction

1. Le présent document est constitué de quatre parties :
 - a) La partie I a été élaborée comme suite aux décisions 32/76 b) et 46/4, qui invitait le Secrétariat à établir à l'intention des participants de chaque réunion du Comité exécutif, une mise à jour sur la situation des pays visés à l'article 5 qui sont assujettis aux mesures de réglementation du Protocole de Montréal, en matière de conformité.
 - b) La partie II comporte des informations sur les pays visés à l'article 5 qui sont assujettis aux décisions des Parties et aux recommandations du Comité de mise en œuvre sur la conformité.
 - c) La partie III présente des données sur la mise en œuvre des programmes de pays, y compris une analyse des données sur la consommation de substances appauvrissant la couche d'ozone (SAO), par secteur. Elle comprend également une partie qui traite des caractéristiques des programmes nationaux d'élimination de SAO.
 - d) La partie IV donne des indications sur les résultats enregistrés par les projets dont la mise en œuvre est retardée et pour lesquels des rapports de situation spéciaux ont été sollicités.
2. L'analyse effectuée et les conclusions tirées dans le présent document sont sans effet sur la situation en matière de conformité, constatée par la réunion des Parties, seul organe habilité à évaluer une telle situation. Les données communiquées en application de l'article 7 du Protocole servent exclusivement à déterminer annuellement la situation d'un pays en matière de conformité. L'analyse développée dans le présent document s'appuie sur un ensemble de données relatives à plusieurs périodes de conformité, qui ont été communiquées au Secrétariat du Fonds à propos de la mise en œuvre des programmes de pays, et sur les données visées à l'article A7. En conséquence, le présent document au lieu d'établir la conformité en tant que telle, évalue plutôt les perspectives qui s'offrent aux pays visés à l'article 5 de se mettre en conformité avec une ou plusieurs des mesures de réglementation prévues par le Protocole de Montréal. Son principal objet est de définir les SAO qui doivent faire l'objet de mesures soutenues par le Fonds multilatéral.

PARTIE I : SITUATION ET PERSPECTIVES EN MATIÈRE DE CONFORMITÉ (COMPTE TENU DES DERNIÈRES DONNÉES DISPONIBLES)

3. Cette partie présente les résultats de l'analyse de la situation concernant le respect des mesures de réglementation applicables à l'élimination finale d'ici 2010 des CFC, des halons, des tétrachlorures de carbone (CTC), d'ici 2015 du BM et du trichloroéthane¹, et applicables au gel en 2013 des HCFC. Cette analyse suppose que les dernières données relatives à la consommation communiquées au titre de l'article 7 ou dans les données relatives aux programmes de pays, ont pris en compte l'élimination résultant des projets achevés qui ont été approuvés par le Comité exécutif. De la création du Fonds multilatéral jusqu'en décembre 2010, 235 604 tonnes PAO de consommation et 191 246 tonnes PAO de production ont été éliminées grâce aux projets menés à leur terme. Les projets achevés ont été évalués à 1,98 milliard \$ US sur un montant total approuvé d'environ 2,48 milliards \$ US. Une description détaillée

de la méthode utilisée dans cette analyse est présentée dans le document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/37/18, qui a été soumis à la 37^e réunion du Comité exécutif.

4. L'analyse s'est appuyée sur les dernières données disponibles. À compter du 12 mars 2012, trois pays visés à l'article 5 avaient communiqué des données sur 2011, en application de l'article 7, et 141 pays sur 2010 (par comparaison à 145 en mars 2011). Un autre pays a adressé au Secrétariat du Fonds des données concernant 2011 seulement sur l'état d'avancement de la mise en œuvre des programmes de pays (décision 17/34). Pour ce qui est des pays qui n'avaient pas soumis des données sur 2011 ou 2010, l'analyse s'est fondée sur les dernières données disponibles sur la consommation. Il a donc fallu avoir recours aux données sur 2009 visées à l'article 7 pour deux pays. L'analyse suppose que les derniers niveaux de consommation de SAO, à l'exclusion des HCFC, qui ont été signalés n'ont pas augmenté, bien que deux pays pour lesquels les données sur 2010 ou 2011 n'étaient pas disponibles ne soient peut-être pas dans ce cas.

5. Les agences bilatérales et multilatérales d'exécution ont présenté à la 64^e réunion du Comité exécutif des rapports d'activité comportant des données sur l'état d'avancement de la mise en œuvre de toutes les activités et projets approuvés par le Comité jusqu'à la fin 2010. Des données sur les activités et projets susceptibles d'être approuvés en 2012 ont été tirées du *Plan d'activité général pour les années 2012-2014* (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/66/7), qui sera abordé lors de la 66^e réunion.

6. Le Secrétariat du Fonds continuera de synthétiser toutes les données - qui ont été insérées dans les versions précédentes des rapports sur la situation et les perspectives en matière de conformité -, que le Secrétariat du Fonds a exploitées à des fins analytiques. Ces données sont disponibles sur demande.

SECTEUR DE LA PRODUCTION

7. Sur les sept pays² visés à l'article 5, qui sont dotés d'installations de production de CFC, l'Argentine, la Chine, la République populaire démocratique de Corée, l'Inde, le Mexique et le Venezuela (République bolivarienne du) ont conclu des accords pour des réductions échelonnées. Tous les projets lancés dans le secteur de la production des CFC ont été achevés mais la Chine n'en a pas encore terminé avec la déclaration de ces données et la tranche restante pour l'Inde n'a pas encore fait l'objet d'un accord malgré sa soumission pour approbation à la 66^e réunion. Le Brésil a indiqué qu'il avait éliminé sa production de CFC de plein gré. S'agissant de la production de halons, la Chine a conclu un accord et le l'Inde a reçu, à titre exceptionnel, une subvention pour la clôture de ses installations de production de halons.

8. Quatre pays (le Brésil, la Chine, la République populaire démocratique de Corée, et l'Inde) ont une base de référence en matière de production de CTC. Des projets d'élimination complète des CTC dans les secteurs de la production et de la consommation de trois pays (Chine, République populaire démocratique de Corée, et Inde) ont été approuvés par le Comité exécutif. Un projet dans le secteur des agents de transformation à base de CTC a été approuvé pour le Brésil lors de la 54^e réunion. Parmi les projets de clôture de la production de trichloroéthane, seuls ceux qui concernent la Chine ont été approuvés.

9. Des projets de clôture de la production de BM ont été approuvés pour la Chine qui était le seul des deux pays visés à l'article 5 disposant d'installations de production de BM. Le deuxième pays est la République de Corée qui n'a pas sollicité l'aide du Fonds.

² Bien que la Roumanie ait bénéficié d'un financement pour l'élimination de la production et de la consommation, elle n'est pas citée puisqu'elle est reclassée en tant que pays non visé à l'article 5 depuis le 1^{er} janvier 2008.

10. En 2009 ou 2010, les six pays suivants ont produit des HCFC : Argentine, Chine, République populaire démocratique de Corée, Inde, Mexique et Venezuela (République bolivarienne du). Le sous-groupe sur le secteur de la production recevra un projet de rapport du consultant lors de sa réunion qui sera organisée en marge de la 66^e réunion du Comité exécutif sur l'audit technique du secteur de la production de HCFC en Chine.

SECTEUR DE LA CONSOMMATION

11. Cette partie présente un résumé des résultats d'une analyse détaillée du degré de non-conformité, qui ont été observés, semble-t-il, dans les pays ou d'une situation caractérisée par des chiffres de consommation (les derniers) supérieurs à ceux prévus par les mesures de réglementation. Des tableaux récapitulatifs sont proposés pour l'ensemble des six substances soumises à une réglementation. Les tableaux récapitulatifs montrent les pays qui semblent ne pas être en conformité avec les mesures de réglementation de 2010 et qui s'appuient sur les données de 2010 ainsi que sur des chiffres de consommation supérieurs à ceux que prévoient les prochaines mesures de réglementation, y compris des données de 2009. Le résumé est fondé sur les données figurant à l'annexe I, qui comporte des renseignements détaillés pour chaque pays, présentés par substance. L'annexe I indique également si les pays ont reçu du Fonds multilatéral toute l'aide qu'il était censé leur apporter.

12. L'évaluation de la conformité visée à l'annexe I comporte des informations sur la période d'approbation de l'activité favorable à la conformité et sur le point de savoir si le pays a signalé l'instauration d'un système d'autorisation. Ces informations devraient en outre permettre au Comité exécutif d'évaluer les perspectives qui s'offrent aux pays en matière de conformité parce que la date d'approbation indique la durée de la période de mise en œuvre du projet ou de l'accord. De plus, l'information sur la création d'un système d'autorisation indique qu'il existe des mesures réglementaires pour favoriser à l'avenir la conformité, indépendamment du niveau de consommation actuel. Les renseignements sur l'approbation des projets émanent de l'Inventaire des projets approuvés. Le Secrétariat de l'Ozone a fourni une mise à jour des données sur la création des systèmes d'autorisation au 12 mars 2012.

CFC

13. Un résumé de la situation des pays en matière de conformité avec les mesures de réglementation des CFC figure au tableau 1.

14. Le Yémen, seul pays dont les derniers chiffres de consommation sont supérieurs à ceux prévus par la mesure de réglementation de 2010, a bénéficié d'un soutien du Fonds multilatéral.

Halons

15. Le tableau 2 présente un résumé de la situation des pays en matière de conformité avec les mesures de réglementation sur les halons. Soixante-quinze pays ont déclaré une consommation nulle de halons entre 1995 et 2010. Soixante et un pays dont certains participent à des banques régionales de halons, ont reçu un soutien pour des activités liées aux banques de halons ou des accords d'élimination.

16. Tous les pays dont les derniers chiffres de consommation sont supérieurs à ceux prévus par la mesure de réglementation de 2010, ont reçu un soutien du Fonds multilatéral.

Bromure de méthyle

17. Le tableau 3 présente un résumé de la situation des pays en matière de conformité avec les mesures de réglementation du BM (à l'exclusion de la quarantaine et des opérations préalables à l'expédition). Sur les 146 pays visés à l'article 5, qui ont ratifié l'Amendement de Copenhague, 144 ont communiqué des données de référence complètes. Le seul pays visé à l'article 5 qui n'a pas ratifié l'Amendement de Copenhague est le Népal. Sur les 146 pays qui ont ratifié l'Amendement de Copenhague, 57 ont fait état d'une consommation de base et d'une consommation la plus récente nulle, dans les deux cas. Parmi les pays visés à l'article 5 qui ont reçu un soutien du Fonds multilatéral pour des activités et/ou des projets d'élimination du BM, cent ont reçu un soutien du Fonds multilatéral.

18. Le Turkménistan est le seul pays dont les derniers chiffres de consommation sont supérieurs à ceux visés par la mesure de réglementation de 2005. Le Turkménistan a approuvé des projets qui déboucheront sur une élimination complète du BM.

Tétrachlorure de carbone

19. Le tableau 4 présente un récapitulatif de la situation des pays en matière de conformité avec la mesure de réglementation des CTC. Les données récapitulatives excluent les produits de départ et n'établissent pas de distinction entre les utilisations finales spécifiques (tels que les solvants et les agents de transformation). Sur les 146 pays ayant communiqué des données de référence, 90 d'entre eux ont déclaré une consommation de base et une consommation la plus récente nulles.

Trichloroethane

20. Le tableau 5 présente un récapitulatif de la situation des pays en matière de conformité avec les mesures de réglementation du trichloroéthane. Sur les 146 pays qui ont communiqué des données de base, 103 d'entre eux ont signalé une consommation de base et une consommation la plus récente nulles.

21. Tous les pays dont les derniers chiffres de consommation sont supérieurs à ceux visés par les prochaines mesures de réglementation ont reçu un soutien de la part du Fonds multilatéral, à l'exception de la République de Corée. La République de Corée a convenu de ne pas recevoir de financement du Fonds multilatéral.

HCFC

22. L'appendice VI de l'annexe I comporte une analyse des dernières données de consommation de HCFC et elle indique si le pays a reçu un financement pour la préparation de son PGEH, de même que le nombre de projets d'investissement approuvés, le nombre de projets de démonstration approuvés, la quantité totale approuvée en tonnes PAO et les activités prévues dans les plans d'activités pour 2012. Des informations supplémentaires ont été transmises pour signaler les PGEH qui ont été approuvés jusqu'à ce jour, ceux qui ont été soumis à la 66^e réunion et la durée de mise en œuvre des PGEH (tels que les PGEH approuvés pour atteindre un objectif de réduction de la consommation de 10 pour cent en 2015, ou de 35 pour cent en 2020). Le Comité exécutif a approuvé 106 accords concernant les PGEH jusqu'à ce jour.

23. Parmi les pays visés à l'article 5, 145 d'entre eux ont communiqué des données sur la consommation de base et sur la consommation la plus récente, au 12 mars 2012.

24. Tous les pays ont bénéficié de fonds pour la préparation de projets de PGEH, à l'exception de la République de Corée, de Singapour et des Émirats arabes unis. La République de Corée et Singapour ont convenu de ne pas recevoir de financement du Fonds multilatéral. Les Émirats arabes unis ont des activités prévues dans leur plan d'activités pour 2012-2014. Un pays ayant bénéficié de fonds pour l'établissement de son PGEH (le Népal) n'a pas ratifié l'Amendement de Copenhague. La ratification de cet amendement est un préalable au financement des PGEH, en application de la décision 53/37.

25. Le tableau 6 présente un récapitulatif des pays en conformité avec les mesures de réglementation des HCFC.

26. Sur les 75 pays, 53 d'entre eux ont reçu un financement du Fonds multilatéral pour l'application d'accords en matière d'élimination des HCFC. Sur les 22 restants, 10 pays ont présenté des projets d'élimination de HCFC à la 66^e réunion, 11 pays n'ont pas soumis de PGEH mais ont prévu des activités en matière de HCFC dans les plans d'activités pour 2012-2014 et la République de Corée a accepté de ne pas recevoir de financement de la part du Fonds multilatéral.

PARTIE II : ÉTAT D'AVANCEMENT DE LA MISE EN ŒUVRE DES PROJETS DANS LES PAYS ASSUJETTIS AUX DÉCISIONS DES PARTIES EN MATIÈRE DE CONFORMITÉ

27. Cette partie traite des pays visés à l'article 5 qui sont assujettis aux décisions en matière de conformité.

28. Il y a 25 décisions des Parties en matière de conformité qui s'appliquent à 23 pays. Une des questions en matière de conformité a déjà été résolue grâce aux données visées à l'article 7. Deux questions en matière de conformité auraient été réglées d'après les indications et d'après les informations émanant des agences d'exécution et du Secrétariat de l'Ozone, aucun résultat positif n'a été signalé s'agissant de 22 questions. Le tableau 7 indique la mesure dans laquelle des progrès ont été réalisés quant aux décisions du Comité de mise en œuvre, sur la base des informations fournies au Secrétariat de l'Ozone et aux agences.

Informations visées à l'annexe II

29. L'annexe II présente des informations sur les pays assujettis aux décisions des Parties en matière de conformité, en 2012. Elle est organisée par question de conformité et par pays. L'annexe II comporte également deux colonnes intitulées « Observations de l'agence d'exécution » et « Évaluation du Fonds multilatéral fondée sur les observations préliminaires des agences, les données visées à l'article 7 et les informations émanant du Secrétariat de l'Ozone ».

PARTIE III : DONNÉES SUR LA MISE EN ŒUVRE DES PROGRAMMES DE PAYS

30. La partie III comporte des données sur la mise en œuvre des programmes de pays, qui sont soumises au Secrétariat du Fonds au plus tard le 1^{er} mai de chaque année, ainsi que des données sur la consommation de SAO, par secteur. Cette partie présente aussi des informations supplémentaires sur les caractéristiques d'un programme de pays en matière d'élimination des SAO. Le mode de présentation pour la communication des données relatives aux programmes de pays a été approuvé à la 35^e réunion du Comité exécutif et stipulé dans la décision 35/58 e), puis il a été modifié en application des décisions 46/39 et 60/4 b) iv).

DONNÉES RELATIVES A LA CONSOMMATION DE SAO PAR SECTEUR, À L'EXCEPTION DES HCFC

31. Le Secrétariat du Fonds a reçu, à compter du 12 mars 2012, les derniers rapports sur la mise en œuvre des programmes de pays pour 3 des 144 pays tenus de soumettre de tels rapports sur 2011, pour 118 pays sur 2010, pour 21 pays sur 2009 et pour un pays sur 2008. Il conviendrait de noter que les données du programme de pays de la Namibie sur 2010 n'avaient pas été présentées au moment de l'analyse. Un pays n'a jamais fait état de données sur son programme de pays : l'Afrique du sud. L'Afrique du sud ne remplit les conditions pour bénéficier d'une assistance du Fonds multilatéral que pour les HCFC. Il conviendrait de noter que les projets de prorogation du renforcement des institutions sont subordonnés à la réception de telles données. En outre, les données relatives à la mise en œuvre du programme de pays doivent être présentées avant la dernière réunion de l'année et les suivantes puisqu'elles constituent un préalable à l'approbation et à la mise à disposition d'un financement pour les projets. Tous les pays ayant sollicité un financement à la 66^e réunion ont également présenté des données relatives aux programmes de pays sur 2010.

32. Bien que les niveaux de consommation enregistrés portent sur différentes années et puissent ne pas nécessairement correspondre aux données visées à l'article 7 qui ont été notifiées, les données des programmes de pays permettent d'établir l'évaluation sectorielle la plus récente par pays, et à l'échelle mondiale. Ces données devraient aider les pays visés à l'article 5 concernés et le Comité exécutif à éliminer sur une base sectorielle tout ce qui doit encore être éliminé.

33. Le tableau 8 présente la consommation totale de SAO restante (à l'exclusion des HCFC) qu'il faudra éliminer par secteur, en tenant compte des projets qui ont été approuvés mais n'ont pas encore été exécutés. Il inclut aussi l'élimination totale de la consommation des projets qui ont été approuvés mais dont la mise en œuvre n'a pas été achevée.

34. Les réductions totales de SAO (à l'exclusion des HCFC) qui ont été approuvées, mais n'ont pas été mises en œuvre (tableau 8), n'incluent pas celles qui ont été approuvées quant au principe pour les accords pluriannuels ou la réduction censée découler de la mise en œuvre des plans de gestion des frigorigènes (PGF) et des activités des banques de halons. Outre les réductions déjà financées, le Comité exécutif a approuvé quant au principe, des projets sectoriels et des projets nationaux d'élimination pour lesquels des tranches annuelles sont débloquées sur la base des réductions programmées effectivement appliquées.

35. Les réductions financées par les futures tranches annuelles porteront sur une quantité substantielle de la consommation restante apparaissant au tableau 8. En outre, les PGF pour les pays à faible volume de consommation de SAO (PFV) totalisent 85 pour cent de la consommation de base de ces pays et les plans de gestion de l'élimination finale (PGEF) représentent la consommation de base restante. Cependant, les données concernant les projets qui ont été approuvés mais n'ont pas encore été exécutés ne tiennent pas compte de tout ce tonnage. En outre, l'élimination approuvée mais non exécutée des SAO apparaissant au tableau 8 ne tient pas compte d'une partie de la consommation de halons pour certains pays qui ont déjà un projet de banque de halons.

36. La consommation totale restante de SAO (à l'exclusion des HCFC) qui n'a pas encore été prise en compte (eu égard à l'élimination que représentent les PGEF et les PGF pour les PFV, les activités des banques de halons, les projets d'élimination totale et les accords pluriannuels approuvés quant au principe) s'élève, semble-t-il, à 830,3 tonnes PAO (tableau 9). Ce chiffre est en baisse par rapport aux 1 057,8 tonnes PAO qui avaient été déclarées à la 63^e réunion.

DONNÉES RELATIVES AUX HCFC

37. Le tableau 10 présente les niveaux de consommation de HCFC fondés sur les dernières données disponibles. Il fait apparaître une consommation de HCFC de 506 610 tonnes métriques (33 589 tonnes PAO) constituées essentiellement de HCFC-22 (61 pour cent du total) et de HCFC-141b (32 pour cent du total). Les 506 610 tonnes métriques de HCFC représentent une augmentation de 35 430 tonnes métriques par rapport à la quantité déclarée (471 180 tonnes métriques) à la 63^e réunion. Par comparaison, le Fonds a réduit de 233 087 tonnes métriques (244 343 tonnes PAO) la consommation de SAO au 31 décembre 2010. Le niveau indiqué dans ce rapport est fondé sur les données de 2011 pour 3 pays, de 2010 pour 118 pays, de 2009 pour 21 pays et de 2008 pour un pays. S'agissant des pays qui ont communiqué des données sur 2009 et 2010, leur consommation de HCFC a augmenté de 7,2 pour cent.

CHARACTÉRISTIQUES DES PROGRAMMES DE PAYS

38. Le nouveau mode de présentation pour la communication des données relatives aux programmes de pays, qui a été adopté en vertu de la décision 46/39 et modifié lors de la 60^e réunion (décision 60/4 b) iv)) donne aux UNO l'occasion d'évaluer les perspectives de conformité tant du point de vue quantitatif que qualitatif.

Exhaustivité des données

39. La nouvelle forme de présentation des données communiquées sur les programmes de pays est utilisée depuis cinq ans. Dix pays ont fourni des données sur 2010 en continuant d'utiliser le modèle approuvé lors de la 46^e réunion et 111 pays ont utilisé sa version modifiée qui a été approuvée à la 60^e réunion. Cela étant, la majeure partie des données présentées sous cette nouvelle forme était incomplète du triple point de vue: qualitatif, quantitatif et réglementaire. Seuls 11 pays, les Bahamas, le Burkina Faso, la Côte d'Ivoire, la Guinée équatoriale, la Guinée Bissau, le Kenya, la Malaisie, le Paraguay, la République de Moldavie, le Sierra Leone et le Turkménistan ont communiqué toutes les informations concernant ces trois aspects.

40. Conformément à la décision 59/4 b) iv), le Secrétariat a examiné les données sur la mise en œuvre du programme de pays, qui ont été transmises par voie électronique. Le Secrétariat a fait remarquer que seuls 59 pays avaient communiqué des données sur 2010 par voie électronique - système qui a commencé à être utilisé le 25 avril 20007 -, y compris cinq pays n'ayant soumis que des fiches techniques.

41. Seuls 118 sur les 144 pays tenus de le faire, ont présenté des données relatives à leur programme de pays pour 2010 et trois l'ont fait pour 2011, dans les délais voulus, afin qu'elles puissent être analysées dans le présent document. Tous les pays ayant présenté des demandes de financement à la 66^e réunion ont également soumis des données relatives aux programmes de pays pour 2010, à l'exception de la Namibie.

Récapitulatif des données

Tous les SAO à l'exception des HCFC

42. Sur les 121 pays dotés de PGF/PNE/PGEF, seuls 100 pays ont signalé des avancées ou ont achevé la mise en œuvre de leurs projets. Compte tenu des pays qui ont communiqué des données avant 2010, 119 sur 143 pays ont réalisé des progrès ou achevé la mise en œuvre de leur PGF/PNE/PGEF.

43. Si l'on tient compte des pays qui ont communiqué des données avant 2010, en tout, 13 267 machines de récupération et 5 675 machines de recyclage sont opérationnelles. Sur les pays qui emploient de telles machines, 75 pour cent d'entre eux ont indiqué qu'elles avaient fonctionné de « manière satisfaisante » ou « très bien ». En tout, 2 420,4 tonnes PAO de CFC-11 dont 2 153,2 tonnes PAO ont été réutilisées, ont été récupérées, et, sur un total de 25 800,2 tonnes PAO de CFC-12 qui ont été récupérées, 21 342,4 tonnes PAO ont été réutilisées. Aucune statistique concernant les autres SAO n'est recueillie. Les dernières données communiquées pour 2006-2011, considérées conjointement avec celles contenues dans les rapports des années précédentes, montrent que, en tout, 61 430 techniciens en entretien d'appareils de réfrigération ont été formés, 50 210 ont été certifiés, et 2 892 formateurs de techniciens ont été formés.

44. Sur les 143 pays qui ont communiqué des données (y compris des données issues des rapports pour les années précédentes), 110 d'entre eux ont indiqué que des systèmes de contingentement avaient été instaurés. En outre, 121 pays ont fait savoir que l'immatriculation des importateurs était une exigence.

Au total, 14 248 agents des douanes auraient été formés, d'après les indications données. Cela étant, ne sait pas avec une absolue certitude si ces données sont annuelles ou cumulatives.

45. Sur les 144 pays tenus de communiquer des rapports, 134 d'entre eux ont signalé la mise en œuvre de systèmes d'autorisation (113 des 121 pays qui ont communiqué des données sur 2010 et 2011 avaient instauré des systèmes d'autorisation dont 97 d'entre eux fonctionnaient de « manière satisfaisante » ou « très bien »).

Données concernant les prix des CFC, des HCFC et de leurs produits de substitution

46. Le tableau 11 récapitule les coûts de certains SAO et produits de substitution.

47. De telles données n'ont pas été communiquées pour le halon, le BM ou le CTC.

48. Le tableau 11 montre que en 2010, le HCFC-22, le HCFC-141b et le HCFC-142b restent encore beaucoup moins coûteux que les CFC comparables, sur la base de cet échantillon de données. Il conviendrait de noter que seuls 14 pays ont communiqué des données relatives au prix du CFC-11 et 32 pays des données relatives au prix du CFC-12 et que l'on ne peut savoir avec certitude si des CFC sont proposés à la vente dans la plupart des pays puisque de ces CFC proviendraient de stocks. S'agissant du HCFC-134a et du propane (HC-290) par exemple, les prix indiqués au tableau 11 sont plus élevés que ceux des différents CFC, mais ce tableau ne prend pas en compte le manque de disponibilité des CFC.

HCFC

49. C'est la deuxième année que ce nouveau mode de présentation est utilisé afin de prendre en considération les renseignements pertinents concernant l'élimination des HCFC, approuvée lors de la 60^e réunion (décision 60/4 b iv)). Sur les 121 pays, 111 ont communiqué des données sur 2010-2011, notamment celles qui concernent les HCFC, en ayant recours au nouveau mode de présentation.

50. Sur les 137 pays qui ont transmis des données, 64 d'entre eux ont indiqué qu'ils avaient instauré des systèmes de contingentement et 98 pays ont fait savoir que l'immatriculation des importateurs était une exigence. En tout, 38 697,9 tonnes PAO de HCFC-22 dont 37 841,8 tonnes PAO ont été réutilisées, ont été récupérées. Au total, d'après les indications fournies, 4 312 agents des douanes auraient été formés aux HCFC. En tout, 1 317 machines de récupération et 476 machines de recyclage sont opérationnelles,

9 449 techniciens ont été certifiés, 18 640 techniciens ont été formés et 1 472 formateurs de techniciens ont été formés à la récupération et au recyclage des HCFC.

PARTIE IV : PROJETS DONT LA DE MISE EN ŒUVRE EST RETARDEE ET POUR LESQUELS DES RAPPORTS DE SITUATION SPÉCIAUX ONT ÉTÉ SOLICITÉS

51. Il y a 22 projets en cours d'exécution qui ont été classés comme projets dont la mise en œuvre est retardée et qui font l'objet de procédures d'annulation établies par le Comité. Dans cette catégorie, figurent les projets suivants : i) ceux dont l'achèvement de la mise en œuvre est censée être retardée de plus de 12 mois et/ou ii) ceux pour lesquels aucun décaissement n'a été effectué dans les 18 mois ayant fait suite à l'approbation du projet. Le tableau 12 fait apparaître une ventilation des projets accusant un retard, par une agence bilatérale/d'exécution, comme suit : ONUDI (sept) ; PNUD (six) ; Banque mondiale (deux) ; Japon (deux) ; PNUE (un) ; Italie (un) et Portugal (un). Aucun rapport n'a été reçu d'Israël (un) et Espagne (un). Ces retards sont d'ordinaire provoqués par des raisons techniques.

Progrès réalisés dans la résolution des problèmes liés aux causes des retards

52. Dans leurs rapports, les agences d'exécution et bilatérales ont fait savoir que s'agissant de la résolution du problème des retards, les progrès ont été plus ou moins importants. Six des projets énumérés à l'annexe III, dont la mise en œuvre accusait un retard lors de la 65^e réunion, sont désormais achevés.

Projets ayant enregistré certains progrès

53. Les projets ayant été classés comme affichant « certains progrès » sont au nombre de onze, et les agences d'exécution et bilatérales ont indiqué qu'ils continueraient de faire l'objet d'une surveillance (annexe IV). Nonobstant ces avancées, il conviendrait de noter que les projets approuvés il y a plus de trois ans doivent continuer de faire l'objet d'une surveillance en application de la décision 32/4. Ceux-ci ne peuvent donc pas être retirés de la liste de ceux qui sont à surveiller avant leur achèvement définitif, quelque soit leur degré d'avancement éventuel. Ils font donc l'objet d'une recommandation aux fins d'une surveillance continue.

Projets n'affichant aucune avancée – lettre d'annulation éventuelle

54. Il y a deux projets qui n'affichent aucun progrès depuis la 65^e réunion (annexe V). En vertu des procédures existantes, le Secrétariat du Fonds adressera des avis d'annulation éventuelle concernant ces projets puisque aucune avancée n'a été réalisée.

Projet susceptible d'être annulé d'un commun accord

55. Il y a un projet qui est susceptible d'être annulé d'un commun accord (annexe VI).

Projets à propos desquels des rapports de situation supplémentaires ont été sollicités

56. Les projets de renforcement des institutions, de banques de halons, de formation d'agents des douanes, de récupération et de recyclage, et les projets de démonstration ne sont pas subordonnés aux procédures d'annulation. Néanmoins, le Comité exécutif a décidé de continuer de les surveiller selon que de besoin (décision 36/14 b)). À l'occasion de sa 65^e réunion, le Comité exécutif a demandé 56 rapports de situation supplémentaires. De tels rapports sont nécessaires lorsqu'il n'y a eu aucune indication d'avancement depuis la transmission du dernier rapport et/ou dans les cas où des obstacles supplémentaires à leur mise en œuvre ont été signalés. Des progrès ont été enregistrés dans 23 projets. Des rapports de situation supplémentaires concernant 33 projets (annexe VII), assortis d'un exposé des raisons précises motivant la demande de soumission de tels rapports supplémentaires, ont été sollicités aux fins de présentation à la 67^e réunion des Parties.

57. L'annexe indique qu'il existe encore des activités en matière de CFC qui ne font pas l'objet d'accords signés et pour lesquelles aucun équipement de récupération et de recyclage n'a été acheté. Il y a deux projets concernant les CTC au sujet desquels aucun progrès n'a été signalé quant à l'acquisition d'équipement du projet. Il reste trois projets concernant des appareils de refroidissement à propos desquels des accords avec les banques nationales continuent de faire l'objet de concertations, dans les cas de modification touchant à la conception, dans ceux où un consultant est choisi pour mettre en œuvre le projet, et dans ceux où le décaissement est faible. Il y a plusieurs projets de destruction des SAO qui devaient être présentés à la 65^e réunion mais ne l'ont pas été jusqu'à la 66^e. Le décaissement pour un projet de banque de halons est resté faible pendant trois réunions consécutives. Le décaissement est également faible pour un projet de démonstration de HCFC et un projet d'investissement de HCFC dont le document de projet n'a pas encore été signé, tandis que d'autres projets ont été de l'avant. Sur les dix rapports de situation relatifs aux signatures de documents de projet intéressant le renforcement des institutions, trois projets n'ont pas été signés, et les rapports financiers de cinq projets n'ont pas été communiqués, bien qu'ils répondent à une exigence. La préparation de projet pour un projet concernant le bromure de méthyle, qui était censé être communiqué à la 65^e réunion est encore en cours, et la clôture d'un de ces projets peut être recommandée. Il y a un faible décaissement pour un PGEF et un PGEH.

Élaboration d'un PGEH/signature de document de projet

58. À ce jour, le Comité exécutif a approuvé l'exécution d'activités de préparation de 297 PGEH et de projets d'élimination de HCFC dans 144 pays ce qui a entraîné l'approbation d'activités de PGEH dans 106 pays pour un montant de 439,3 million \$ US, sur lesquels 209 millions \$ US ont été approuvés pour les activités de la première tranche annuelle. Sur la base du nombre des PGEH déjà approuvés et des PGEH soumis à la 66^e réunion, 23 pays présenteront leurs PGEH après la 66^e réunion.

59. Lors de la 65^e réunion, le Comité exécutif a demandé sept rapports de situation supplémentaires pour des projets d'élaboration de PGEH. De tels rapports sont nécessaires lorsqu'aucun progrès n'a été enregistré depuis le dernier rapport et/ou dans les cas où des obstacles supplémentaires à la mise en œuvre ont été signalés. Les PGEH concernés se trouvent à différents stades d'achèvement, l'un d'entre eux est à un stade initial d'élaboration, trois font actuellement l'objet d'études, les études de deux d'entre eux sont achevées et un a été soumis à la 66^e réunion et retiré à la demande du gouvernement pour vérification de données. Des rapports de situation supplémentaires concernant six projets ont été sollicités aux fins de soumission à la 67^e réunion (annexe VIII).

RECOMMANDATIONS

60. Le Comité exécutif peut souhaiter prendre les dispositions suivantes :

a) Noter :

- i) Avec satisfaction, les rapports de situation et les rapports sur les projets faisant apparaître des retards de mise en œuvre, qui ont été communiqués au Secrétariat par les agences d'exécution ainsi que par les gouvernements de la France, de l'Italie, du Japon et du Portugal et qui figurent dans le document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/66/6 ;
- ii) Que cinquante-neuf rapports de mise en œuvre de programme de pays pour l'année 2010 ont été transmis par voie électronique, système utilisé pour la première fois le 25 avril 2007 ;
- iii) Que six des vingt-deux projets énumérés à l'annexe III, dont la mise en œuvre est retardée, ont été achevés ;
- iv) Que le Secrétariat et les agences d'exécution prendraient des mesures importantes conformément aux évaluations du Secrétariat (certains progrès conformément à l'annexe IV) et qu'ils feraient rapport aux gouvernements et aux agences d'exécution et les en aviseraient, selon que de besoin ;

b) Demander :

- i) Que les lettres d'une éventuelle annulation soient adressées à propos des projets suivants :

Annex I

DETAILED ANALYSIS OF THE STATUS OF IMPLEMENTATION IN COUNTRIES SUBJECT TO DECISIONS OF THE PARTIES ON COMPLIANCE AND THOSE WHOSE LATEST CONSUMPTION DATA EXCEEDS THE CONTROL MEASURES

1. Annex I presents the detailed analysis of the status of implementation in countries subject to decisions of the Parties on compliance and those whose latest consumption data exceeds the next control measures. The data tables in Appendices I-VI indicate whether a country has received a total phase-out agreement for a specific controlled substance. The analysis of halons (Appendix II) indicates whether a halon banking activity has been approved. Halon banking guidelines require that regulations facilitating production and import bans are established within six months of the establishment of a reclamation centre (decision 18/22). The methyl bromide analysis (Appendix III) indicates further whether a country has received funding for a phase-out to meet the 2005 control measures. Appendices IV and V present information on the carbon tetrachloride (CTC) and methyl chloroform (TCA) phase-out, respectively. Appendix VI provides information on HCFC consumption only.

ANALYSIS OF COMPLIANCE FOR CFCs (Appendix I)

2. Countries have been grouped into one category: (a) those whose latest consumption exceeds the 2010 100 per cent phase-out target.

(a) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the 2010 phase-out target

3. This category consists of 8 countries which may need to achieve additional CFC phase-out amounting to 1,702 ODP tonnes by 2010 in order to comply with the 100 per cent reduction target.

4. The Executive Committee has approved national CFC phase-out agreements for all of these countries.

5. Seven of the 8 countries that have 2010 consumption that exceeded zero consumption either have essential use authorizations for CFC consumption (Bangladesh, China, Egypt, India, Iran (Islamic Republic of) and Syrian Arab Republic) as per decision XXI/4 or emergency essential use for CFC-113 2010-2011 consumption as per decision XXII/4 para. 7 (Dominican Republic (the)).

ANALYSIS OF COMPLIANCE FOR HALONS (Appendix II)

6. Seventy-five countries have reported no consumption of halons between 1995 and 2010.

7. Sixty-one countries have received support for halon banking activities or phase-out agreements. This includes those countries participating in regional halon banks. Halon banking is presumed to be the last funded activity in the halon consumption sector for most countries but there are some halon phase-out activities that are part of multi-sectoral phase-out agreements.

8. Countries have been grouped into the following one category: (a) those whose latest consumption exceeds the 2010 100 per cent phase-out target.

(a) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the 2010 phase-out target

9. This category consists of two countries that may need to phase-out additional halons amounting to 3 ODP tonnes by 2010 in order to comply with the 100 per cent reduction targets. These countries have received support from the Multilateral Fund.

ANALYSIS OF COMPLIANCE FOR METHYL BROMIDE (Appendix III)

10. This section presents the analysis for compliance with methyl bromide control measures. It should be noted that all data reported and used in this analysis relate to controlled use only, which means that the data exclude quarantine and pre-shipment (QPS). 144 of the 146 Article 5 countries that have ratified the Copenhagen Amendment have reported complete baseline data. Of these 146 countries, 57 reported zero for both the baseline consumption and the latest consumption.

11. One-hundred Article 5 countries have received support from the Multilateral Fund for methyl bromide activities and/or projects. This includes projects that will lead to a complete phase-out of methyl bromide in 63 of these countries, partial phase-out in an additional 8, and other forms of assistance received by 29.

12. Countries have been grouped into the following two categories: (a) those whose latest consumption exceeds the 20 per cent reduction target of 2005 that applies until December 2014; and (b) those whose latest consumption exceeds the 2015 100 per cent phase-out target. Appendix III identifies those countries that have not ratified the Copenhagen Amendment.

(a) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the 20 per cent MB baseline reduction target

13. This category consists of only one country, Turkmenistan. This country may need to meet additional combined reduction amounting to 0.02 ODP tonnes in order to comply with the 20 per cent reduction targets. Turkmenistan has approved projects that will lead to complete phase-out of methyl bromide.

(b) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the 2015 phase-out target

14. This category consists of 29 countries that may need to meet additional combined reduction amounting to 2,456.4 ODP tonnes by 2015 in order to comply with the 100 per cent reduction targets. Of the 29 countries, 24 countries have approved projects that will lead to complete phase-out of methyl bromide. Four countries may need additional assistance from the Multilateral Fund to achieve the phase-out of methyl bromide by 2015. The remaining country (Singapore) is currently not eligible to receive funding from the Multilateral Fund.

CARBON TETRACHLORIDE (CTC) (Appendix IV)

15. This section presents the analysis of compliance with CTC control measures. All data reported and used in this analysis are those related to controlled use only, which excludes feedstock. Reported CTC consumption was not differentiated by specific end use, such as solvents, process agents and laboratory use.

16. Of the 146 countries with reported baseline data, 90 reported zero both for the baseline and the latest consumption.

17. Countries have been grouped into the following one category: (a) those whose latest consumption exceeds the 2010 100 per cent phase-out target. Appendix IV notes those countries that have not ratified the London Amendment.

(a) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the 2010 phase-out target

18. This category consists of 5 countries that may need to phase out additional CTC amounting to 283 ODP tonnes to meet the 100 per cent reduction by 2010. Four of the 5 countries have received

funding for CTC phase-out agreements or projects from the Multilateral Fund. The Republic of Korea has agreed not to receive CTC funding from the Multilateral Fund.

19. Countries with 2010 CTC consumption that exceeded zero consumption have process agent use exemptions for CTC consumption as per decision XXII/8 (China) or CTC consumption for laboratory and analytical uses (Croatia, Mexico, Nepal), except Republic of Korea (the).

METHYL CHLOROFORM (TCA) (Appendix V)

20. This section presents the analysis for compliance with TCA control measures. Of the 146 countries that have reported baseline data, 103 reported zero both for the baseline and the latest consumption.

21. Countries have been grouped into two categories: (a) those whose latest consumption exceeds the 70 per cent reduction target of 2010; and (b) those whose latest consumption exceeds the 2015 100 per cent phase-out target. Appendix V specifies those countries that have not ratified the London Amendment.

(a) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the 70 per cent TCA baseline reduction target

22. All countries are in compliance with the 70 per cent TCA baseline reduction target.

(b) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the 100 per cent TCA baseline reduction target

23. This category consists of three countries that may need to meet additional combined reduction amounting to 76.5 ODP tonnes by 2015 in order to comply with the 100 per cent reduction target. Two of those three countries have received funding for TCA phase-out agreements or projects from the Multilateral Fund. The remaining country (the Republic of Korea) is not eligible to receive TCA funding from the Multilateral Fund.

HCFCs (Appendix VI)

24. Appendix VI also includes an analysis of the latest consumption and baseline data on HCFCs and indicates whether the country had received HPMP preparation funding, the number of investment projects approved, the number of demonstration projects approved, total phase-out approved in ODP tonnes and activities planned in the 2012 business plans. 145 of the 147 countries already reported both the baseline and the latest consumption.

25. All countries have received HPMP project preparation funds except the Republic of Korea, Singapore and the United Arab Emirates. The Republic of Korea and Singapore had agreed not to receive funding from the Multilateral Fund. The United Arab Emirates has activities planned in the 2012-2014 business plans.

(a) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the freeze reduction target

26. This category consists of 75 countries that may need to phase out additional HCFC amounting to 1,483 ODP tonnes to meet the freeze reduction target by 2013.

27. 53 of the 75 countries have received funding for HCFC phase-out agreements from the Multilateral Fund. Of the 22 remaining countries, 10 countries have submitted HCFC phase-out projects to the 66th meeting, 11 countries have activities planned in the 2012-2014 business plans and the Republic of Korea has agreed not to receive HCFC funding from the Multilateral Fund.
