**SITUACIÓN DE LA EJECUCIÓN DE LOS PROYECTOS CON DEMORAS Y PERSPECTIVAS  
DE LOS PAÍSES QUE OPERAN AL AMPARO DEL ARTÍCULO 5 EN RELACIÓN CON EL  
CUMPLIMIENTO DE LAS MEDIDAS DE CONTROL SIGUIENTES  
DEL PROTOCOLO DE MONTREAL**

## **RESUMEN EJECUTIVO**

- No parece que ser que en 2010 y 2011 haya ningún país en situación de incumplimiento respecto de los datos atinentes al Artículo 7 (A7) y al programa de país presentados al 12 de marzo de 2012;
- No obstante, según los datos de consumo más recientes, la mayoría de los países tienen un consumo nulo del resto de las sustancias (excluidos los HCFC y usos exentos), habiendo solo 1 país que notificó consumo de CFC (datos de 2009); 2 que notificaron consumo de halones; 29 que notificaron consumo de metilbromuro; y 3 que notificaron consumo de 1,1,1-tricloroetano (TCA);
- De las 25 cuestiones conexas al cumplimiento en 2011, 1 se ha resuelto con arreglo a los datos relativos al A7; 2 se han notificado como solventadas, no habiéndose notificado solución alguna para 22 de dichas cuestiones que se fundamenta en la información procedente de los organismos de ejecución y de la Secretaría del Ozono;
- Los datos sobre la ejecución de los programas de país indican que:
  - Todos los países facilitaron los datos de acuerdo con el nuevo formato aprobado hace más de cinco años, pero sólo 59 lo hicieron sirviéndose del sistema de la Web en su presentación de datos para 2010, incluidos 5 países que sólo presentaron la hoja de datos;
  - De un total estimado de consumo remanente de SAO en 2011 que asciende a 1 057,8 toneladas PAO en los países que operan al amparo del Artículo 5 (A5), excluyendo los HCFC, quedan aún 830,3 toneladas PAO respecto de las que el Comité Ejecutivo tiene que tomar medidas;
  - El total de las 830,3 toneladas PAO de consumo remanente corresponde a consumo de metilbromuro;
  - Los datos de los programas de país notificados arrojan un consumo total de HCFC de 506 610 toneladas métricas (tm) (33 589 toneladas PAO). En 145 países que notificaron los datos de 2009 y de 2010, el consumo de HCFC aumentó un 7,2 por ciento;
  - De los 144 países que debían presentar información acerca del sistema de concesión de licencias, 134 han notificado que dichos sistemas se encuentran operativos (113 de los 121 países que presentaron datos para 2010/2011 contaban con sistemas operativos de concesión de licencias, de los que el 97 por ciento funciona ‘satisfactoriamente’ o ‘muy bien’);
  - El precio de HCFC-22, HCFC-141b y HCFC-142b sigue siendo muy inferior al de los CFC pertinentes.
- De los 22 proyectos con demoras en su ejecución, 6 ya han sido terminados, de 2 de ellos no se ha recibido por primera vez informe alguno sobre la marcha de las actividades, hay 1 proyecto para el que cabe la posibilidad de que se cancele por acuerdo mutuo, habiendo 11 para los que se recomienda que se continúe su supervisión. No se han recibido informes de demora de Israel ni de España;
- Se recomienda además que se presente un informe adicional para 33 proyectos presentados a la reunión en curso, recomendándose además informes adicionales sobre las actividades de preparación de 6 planes de gestión de eliminación de HCFC.

## **Introducción**

1. Este documento consta de cuatro partes:
  - a) La Parte I se preparó atendiendo a las Decisiones 32/76 b) y 46/4, en las que se pedía a la Secretaría que preparase una actualización, para cada Reunión del Comité Ejecutivo, de la situación de cumplimiento en los países que operan al amparo del Artículo 5 que están sujetos a las medidas de control del Protocolo de Montreal.
  - b) La Parte II proporciona información acerca de aquellos países que operan al amparo del Artículo 5 que están sujetos a decisiones de las Partes y recomendaciones del Comité de Aplicación acerca del cumplimiento.
  - c) La Parte III presenta datos sobre la ejecución de los programas de país, incluido un análisis por sector de los datos de consumo de sustancias que agotan la capa de ozono. También incluye una sección que se ocupa de las características de los programas nacionales de eliminación de SAO.
  - d) La Parte IV presenta la información acerca de los resultados de los proyectos con demoras en su ejecución y para los que se pidieron informes especiales sobre la situación.
2. El análisis realizado y las conclusiones a las que se llega en el presente documento no menoscaban en modo alguno la situación de cumplimiento que determine la Reunión de las Partes, único órgano facultado para ello. Los datos notificados de conformidad con el Artículo 7 del Protocolo se utilizan exclusivamente para determinar la situación de los países respecto del cumplimiento cada año. El análisis que se realiza en este documento utiliza una combinación de datos notificados a la Secretaría del Fondo sobre la ejecución de los programas de país para diversos períodos de cumplimiento y datos con arreglo al Artículo 7. Por lo tanto, este documento no determina el cumplimiento per se. Por el contrario, evalúa las perspectivas de que los esfuerzos de los países que operan al amparo del Artículo 5 les permitan cumplir con lo estipulado por una o más medidas de control del Protocolo de Montreal. Su principal finalidad es identificar las SAO que aún deben ser abordadas por medidas que respalde el Fondo Multilateral.

## **PARTE I: SITUACIÓN Y PERSPECTIVAS DE CUMPLIMIENTO (SEGÚN LOS DATOS MÁS RECIENTES DISPONIBLES)**

3. Esta sección presenta los resultados obtenidos del análisis de la situación de cumplimiento, además de las medidas de control para la eliminación definitiva de los clorofluorcarbonos (CFC), halones, y tetracloruros de carbono (CTC) para 2010, de metilbromuro y 1,1,1-tricloroetano (TCA)<sup>1</sup> para 2015, y de la estabilización del consumo de HCFC para 2013. En el análisis se asume que en el consumo más recientemente notificado en virtud de A7 y en los datos de programa de país se han tenido en cuenta los datos de eliminación resultantes de los proyectos ya terminados que fueron aprobados por el Comité Ejecutivo. Desde la creación del Fondo Multilateral hasta diciembre de 2010, se habían eliminado 235 604 toneladas PAO de consumo y 191 246 toneladas PAO de producción como resultado de los proyectos terminados. El desembolso por estos proyectos terminados alcanzó los 1,98 mil millones de un total aprobado de aproximadamente 2,48 mil millones de \$EUA. En el documento

UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/37/18 se recoge una descripción pormenorizada de la metodología seguida en el análisis, documento que se presentó a la 37<sup>a</sup> Reunión del Comité Ejecutivo.

4. Para este análisis se utilizaron los datos más recientes disponibles. Al 12 de marzo de 2012, tres de los países que operan al amparo del Artículo 5 habían notificado datos de 2011 en cumplimiento del A7, y 141 países habían notificado datos para 2010 (en comparación con 145 en marzo de 2011). Otro país notificó datos de 2011 a la Secretaría del Fondo relativos únicamente a progresos en la ejecución de los programas de país (Decisión 17/34). En el caso de los países que no presentaron los datos para 2011 o 2010, el análisis utilizó los datos más recientes disponibles sobre el consumo. Ello conllevó utilizar los datos para 2009 correspondiente al cumplimiento del Artículo 7 para 2 países. En el análisis se parte del supuesto de que los niveles de consumo de SAO más recientemente notificados, excluidos los HCFC, no han aumentado, si bien puede que no sea este el caso para 2 de estos países de los que no se dispuso de los datos para 2010 ni 2011.

5. Los organismos de ejecución bilaterales y multilaterales presentaron a la 64<sup>a</sup> Reunión del Comité Ejecutivo informes anuales sobre la marcha de las actividades, en los cuales facilitaron datos sobre la situación de la ejecución de todas las actividades y los proyectos aprobados por el Comité hasta fines de 2010. Los datos sobre las aprobaciones potenciales en 2012 han sido tomados del *Plan administrativo refundido del Fondo Multilateral para los años 2012–2014* (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/66/7), que se examinará en la 66<sup>a</sup> Reunión.

6. La Secretaría del Fondo seguirá sintetizando todos los datos incluidos en las versiones previas de los informes sobre la situación y perspectivas de cumplimiento que hayan sido utilizados por la Secretaría del Fondo con fines analíticos. Estos datos están a disposición de quien los solicite.

## **SECTOR DE PRODUCCIÓN**

7. De los siete<sup>2</sup> países que operan al amparo del Artículo 5 que disponen de instalaciones para la producción de CFC, los Gobiernos de Argentina, China, la India, México, la República Bolivariana de Venezuela y la República Democrática Popular de Corea han concertado acuerdos para llevar a cabo las reducciones previstas. Se han terminado todos los proyectos del sector de producción de CFC, si bien la notificación sigue en el caso de China y el tramo remanente para India no ha alcanzado aún un acuerdo, a pesar de haber sido presentado a la 66<sup>a</sup> Reunión con miras a su aprobación. El Gobierno del Brasil indicó que ha eliminado por cuenta propia la producción de CFC. En lo tocante a la producción de halones, el Gobierno de China tiene un acuerdo vigente, y el Gobierno de la India recibió una donación por única vez para el cierre de sus instalaciones de producción de halones.

8. Cuatro países (Brasil, China, la India, la República Popular Democrática de Corea) tienen establecido un nivel básico de referencia para la producción de CTC. El Comité Ejecutivo ya ha aprobado proyectos para la eliminación definitiva del CTC en los sectores de producción y consumo de tres países (China, la República Popular Democrática de Corea y la India). En la 54<sup>a</sup> Reunión se aprobó un proyecto para el sector de agentes de proceso de CTC en Brasil. Solo se aprobaron proyectos para el cierre de las instalaciones de producción de TCA en China.

9. Se aprobaron proyectos para el cierre de la producción de metilbromuro para China, que era uno de los dos únicos países que operan al amparo del Artículo 5 con instalaciones de producción de metilbromuro. El segundo es la República de Corea, que no ha solicitado asistencia del Fondo.

10. Hay seis países que han producido HCFC en 2009 o 2010: Argentina, China, la India, México, la República Bolivariana de Venezuela y la República Popular Democrática de Corea. El Subgrupo del sector de producción recibirá del asesor un proyecto de informe en su reunión auxiliar de la 66<sup>a</sup> Reunión del Comité Ejecutivo al respecto de la auditoría técnica del sector de producción de HCFC en China.

## **SECTOR DE CONSUMO**

11. En esta sección se presenta un resumen de los resultados de un análisis detallado del grado en que los países parecen encontrarse en situación de incumplimiento o para los que el consumo más reciente excede de lo permitido por las medidas de control. Se facilitan cuadros sinópticos para todas las seis sustancias controladas. Estos cuadros muestran países que parecen encontrarse en situación de incumplimiento de las medidas de control para 2010 tras utilizar los datos de 2010, así como países cuyos datos de consumo exceden lo permitido por las siguientes medidas de control, incluidos los datos para 2009. Los datos sobre los que se basa este resumen se incluyen en el Anexo I, que contiene información pormenorizada para cada país, desglosada por sustancia. Asimismo, en el Anexo I se indica si los países han recibido toda la asistencia que preveían les fuese proporcionada por el Fondo Multilateral.

12. En la evaluación del cumplimiento que figura en el Anexo I se incluyó información relativa al momento en que se aprobó la actividad que permitió el cumplimiento y si el país ha notificado el establecimiento de un sistema de concesión de licencias. Esta información debería servir de mayor ayuda al Comité Ejecutivo para evaluar las perspectivas de cumplimiento de los países, dado que la fecha de aprobación indica cuánto tiempo ha durado la ejecución del proyecto o del acuerdo. Asimismo, la información relativa al establecimiento de un sistema de concesión de licencias indica que existen controles que permitirán un futuro cumplimiento, sea cual sea el nivel actual de consumo. La información sobre aprobación de proyectos se toma del Inventario de proyectos aprobados. Los datos actualizados relativos a los sistemas de concesión de licencias establecidos han sido facilitados por la Secretaría para el Ozono al 12 de marzo de 2012.

## **CFC**

13. En el Cuadro 1 se presenta un resumen de la situación de los países en relación con el cumplimiento de los controles de CFC.

14. Yemen, el único país cuyos datos de consumo más recientes superan lo permitido por las medidas de control de 2010, ha recibido apoyo del Fondo Multilateral.

## **Halones**

15. En el Cuadro 2 se presenta un resumen de la situación de los países respecto del cumplimiento de los controles previstos para los halones. Setenta y cinco países han notificado un consumo de halones nulo entre 1995 y 2010. Sesenta y un países han recibido apoyo para actividades de bancos de halones o acuerdos de eliminación, incluidos los países que participan en bancos de halones regionales.

16. Todos los países cuyos datos de consumo más recientes superan lo permitido por las medidas de control de 2010 ha recibido apoyo del Fondo Multilateral..

## **Metilbromuro**

17. En el Cuadro 3 se presenta un resumen de la situación de los países con respecto al cumplimiento de las medidas de control para el metilbromuro (excluidos usos de cuarentena y preembarque). De los 146 países que operan al amparo del Artículo 5 que han ratificado la Enmienda de Copenhague, 144 han notificado datos de consumo básico completos. El único país que opera al amparo del Artículo 5 que no ha ratificado la Enmienda de Copenhague es Nepal. De los 146 países que han ratificado la Enmienda de Copenhague, 57 notificaron un consumo nulo, tanto para el consumo de referencia como para el consumo más reciente. Cien países que operan al amparo del Artículo 5 recibieron ayuda del Fondo Multilateral para actividades y/o proyectos relacionados con la eliminación del metilbromuro.

18. Turkmenistán es el único país cuyo consumo más reciente es mayor que lo permitido por sus medidas de control para 2005. Turkmenistán tiene proyectos aprobados que conducirán a la eliminación completa del metilbromuro.

#### **Tetracloruro de carbono**

19. En el Cuadro 4 se presenta un resumen de la situación de los países con respecto al cumplimiento de las medidas de control de CTC. Los datos resumidos excluyen las materias primas y no establecen diferencias sobre su uso final específico (tales como solventes y agentes de proceso). De los 146 países que comunicaron datos de niveles básicos de referencia, 90 notificaron un consumo nulo tanto para el consumo básico de referencia como para el consumo más reciente.

#### **1,1,1-tricloroetano**

20. En el Cuadro 5 se presenta un resumen de la situación de los países con respecto al cumplimiento de las medidas de control del TCA. De los 146 países que suministraron datos de nivel básico de referencia, 103 notificaron un consumo nulo tanto para el consumo básico de referencia como para el consumo más reciente.

21. Todos los países cuyos datos más recientes sobre el consumo superan lo permitido en sus medidas de control han recibido apoyo del Fondo Multilateral, salvo la República de Corea. La República de Corea ha acordado no recibir financiación del Fondo Multilateral.

### **Hidroclorofluorocarbonos (HCFC)**

22. En el Apéndice VI del Anexo I se incluye un análisis de los datos de consumo más reciente sobre HCFC y se indica si el país ha recibido fondos para la preparación de un plan de gestión de eliminación de HCFC, el número de proyectos de inversión aprobados, el número de proyectos de demostración aprobados, la eliminación total aprobada en toneladas PAO y las actividades planificadas en los planes administrativos para 2012. Se ha suministrado información adicional para indicar los planes de gestión de eliminación de HCFC aprobados hasta la fecha y presentados a la 66<sup>a</sup> Reunión y la duración que abarca el plan (como, por ejemplo, un plan de gestión de eliminación de HCFC aprobado para alcanzar la reducción del 10 por ciento en 2015 o del 35 por ciento en 2020). El Comité Ejecutivo ha aprobado hasta la fecha 106 acuerdos para planes de eliminación de HCFC.

23. 145 países que operan al amparo del A5 notificaron tanto los datos del consumo básico de referencia como los del consumo más reciente al 12 de marzo de 2012.

24. Todos los países han recibido fondos de financiación para la preparación de proyectos de planes de gestión de eliminación de HCFC, excepto los Emiratos Árabes Unidos, la República de Corea y Singapur. La República de Corea y Singapur han convenido en no recibir financiación del Fondo Multilateral. Los Emiratos Árabes Unidos tienen planificadas actividades en sus planes administrativos de 2012-2014. Un país que recibió preparación para planes de gestión de eliminación de HCFC (Nepal) no ha ratificado la Enmienda de Copenhague. La ratificación de dicha enmienda es condición necesaria para la financiación de los planes de gestión de eliminación de HCFC, conforme a la Decisión 53/37.

25. En el Cuadro 6 se presenta un resumen de la situación de los países con respecto al cumplimiento de las medidas de control del TCA.

26. De estos 75 países, 53 han recibido financiación del Fondo Multinacional para cumplir con los acuerdos de eliminación de HCFC. De los restantes 22 países, 10 han presentado a la 66<sup>a</sup> Reunión proyectos de eliminación de HCFC, 11 no han presentado proyectos de eliminación de HCFC pero tienen planificadas actividades al respecto en sus planes administrativos para 2012-2014 y la República de Corea ha convenido en no recibir financiación del Fondo Multilateral para eliminar los HCFC.

## **PARTE II: SITUACIÓN DE LA EJECUCIÓN EN LOS PAÍSES SUJETOS A LAS DECISIONES DE LAS PARTES SOBRE EL CUMPLIMIENTO**

27. Esta sección se ocupa de los países que operan al amparo del Artículo 5 que están sujetos a decisiones sobre cumplimiento.

28. Hay 25 decisiones de las Partes conexas al cumplimiento que se aplican a 23 países. Una de las cuestiones conexas al cumplimiento ya ha sido solventada con arreglo a los datos A7. Dos cuestiones conexas al cumplimiento se han notificado como logradas y hay otras 22 cuestiones cuyo logro no se ha notificado partiendo de información procedente de los organismos de ejecución y de la Secretaría del Ozono. En el Cuadro 7 se indica el grado de progreso alcanzado respecto de las decisiones del Comité de Aplicación según la información suministrada por la Secretaría del Ozono y los organismos.

#### **Información que se recoge en el Anexo II**

29. El Anexo II contiene información sobre los países sujetos a Decisiones de las Partes acerca del cumplimiento en 2012. Esta información se ha organizado por tema y por país. El Anexo II incluye también dos columnas tituladas “Observaciones del Organismo de Aplicación” y “Evaluación del Fondo Multilateral partiendo de las observaciones preliminares de los organismos, los datos relativos a A7 e información procedente de la Secretaría del Ozono”.

## **PARTE III: DATOS SOBRE LA EJECUCIÓN DE LOS PROGRAMAS DE PAÍS**

30. La Parte III contiene datos sobre la ejecución de los programas de país, que se presentan a la Secretaría del Fondo a más tardar el 1 de mayo de cada año, e incluyen datos del consumo de SAO por sector. Esta sección también presenta información adicional sobre las características de los programas de eliminación de SAO de los países. El formato de notificación de los datos de los programas de país se aprobó en la 35<sup>a</sup> Reunión del Comité Ejecutivo, en la Decisión 35/58 e), la cual se modificó en cumplimiento de las Decisiones 46/39 y 60/4 b) iv).

### **DATOS DEL CONSUMO DE SAO POR SECTOR, EXCEPTO LOS HCFC**

31. Al 12 de marzo de 2012, la Secretaría del Fondo había recibido los informes más recientes sobre la ejecución de los programas de país de 3 de los 144 países que debían presentar tales informes para 2011, 118 países para 2010, 21 países para 2009 y 1 país para 2008. Obsérvese que el programa de

país de Namibia para 2010 aún no se había presentado en las fechas en que se efectuó el análisis. Un país no ha notificado nunca datos de programa de país, a saber: Sudáfrica. Sudáfrica sólo puede recibir asistencia del Fondo Multilateral en materia de HCFC. Cabe señalar que la renovación de los proyectos de fortalecimiento institucional está supeditada a la recepción de dichos datos. Además, la presentación de los datos relativos a la ejecución de los programas de país debe presentarse con antelación a la celebración de la última reunión del año y de las reuniones posteriores como prerrequisito para la aprobación y liberación de fondos para proyectos. Todos los países que presentaron solicitudes de financiación a la 66<sup>a</sup> Reunión presentaron también los datos de su programa de país para 2010.

32. Si bien los niveles de consumo registrados son de años diferentes y no corresponden necesariamente con los datos notificados conforme al Artículo 7, los datos de programa de país presentan la evaluación sectorial más reciente por país y a nivel mundial. Estos datos servirán de ayuda a los países que operan al amparo del Artículo 5 interesados y al Comité Ejecutivo para determinar lo que queda por eliminar en cada sector.

33. En el Cuadro 8 se muestra el consumo total de SAO (excluyendo los HCFC) que queda por eliminar en cada sector, después de tener en cuenta los proyectos aprobados pero que aún no se han ejecutado. También incluye la eliminación del consumo total correspondiente a proyectos aprobados que no han sido completados.

34. La reducción total de SAO (excluyendo los HCFC) aprobada, pero no ejecutada (Cuadro 8), no incluye aquella aprobada en principio para acuerdos plurianuales, ni el nivel de eliminación que se espera alcanzar como resultado de la ejecución de planes de gestión de refrigerantes y bancos de halones. Además de las reducciones ya financiadas, el Comité Ejecutivo ha aprobado en principio proyectos sectoriales y nacionales de eliminación para los que se liberan tramos anuales de financiación a condición de que se hayan logrado las reducciones previstas.

35. Las reducciones que se lleven a cabo en futuros tramos anuales abordará una cantidad significativa del consumo remanente identificado en el Cuadro 8. Además, los planes de gestión de

refrigerantes para los países con bajo volumen de consumo de SAO cubren el 85 por ciento del consumo de referencia de estos países y los planes de gestión de eliminación definitiva cubren el consumo básico remanente. No obstante, los datos de los proyectos que se han aprobado, pero que aún no se ejecutaron, no cubren todo este tonelaje. Además, la eliminación de SAO aprobada pero no ejecutada indicada en el Cuadro 8 no incluye una parte del consumo de halones en los países que ya han recibido un proyecto de banco de halones.

36. El volumen total de SAO remanente (excluyendo los HCFC) que aún debe ser abordado (tomando en consideración la eliminación que representan los planes de gestión de eliminación definitiva y los planes de gestión de refrigerantes en países de bajo volumen de consumo, los bancos de halones, los proyectos de eliminación definitiva y los acuerdos plurianuales aprobados en principio), asciende a 830,3 toneladas PAO (Cuadro 9). Es decir, una reducción respecto de la cifra de 1 057,8 toneladas PAO que se había notificado a la 63<sup>a</sup> Reunión.

#### DATOS SOBRE HCFC

37. En el Cuadro 10 figuran los niveles de consumo de HCFC según los datos más recientes de los que se dispone. Se observa que el consumo de HCFC asciende a 506 610 tm (33 589 t. PAO) principalmente de HCFC-22 (61 por ciento del total) y HCFC-141b (32 por ciento del total). Las 506 610 tm de HCFC representan un incremento de 35 430 tm respecto del monto notificado (471 180 tm) a la 63<sup>a</sup> Reunión. A efectos comparativos, el Fondo ha eliminado 233 087 tm (244 343 t. PAO) de consumo de SAO al 31 de diciembre de 2010. El volumen que se recoge en el presente informe se basa en datos de 2011 correspondientes a 3 países, de 2010 para 118 países y de 2009 para 21 países. En el caso de los países que notificaron los datos de 2009 y 2010, el consumo de HCFC aumentó un 7,2 por ciento.

**CARACTERÍSTICAS DE LOS PROGRAMAS DE PAÍS**

38. El nuevo formato para la notificación de datos de programas de país aprobado en la Decisión 46/39 y revisado en la 60<sup>a</sup> Reunión (Decisión 60/4 b iv)) permite a las dependencias nacionales del ozono determinar las perspectivas de cumplimiento de manera cualitativa y cuantitativa.

**Integridad de los datos**

39. Este es el quinto año que se usa el nuevo formato para notificar los datos de país. Diez países facilitaron los datos para 2010 sirviéndose aún del formato aprobado en la 46<sup>a</sup> Reunión, siendo 111 los países que utilizaron el formato revisado que se aprobó en la 60<sup>a</sup> Reunión. Sin embargo, la mayor parte de los datos suministrados en el nuevo formato estaban incompletos en las tres secciones principales correspondientes a los ámbitos, a saber: cualitativo, cuantitativo y normativo. Tan sólo once países, a saber: Bahamas (las), Burkina Faso, Cote d'Ivoire, Guinea Ecuatorial, Guinea-Bissau, Kenya, Malasia, Paraguay, República de Moldova (la), Sierra Leone y Turkmenistán, facilitaron la información pertinente en estas tres secciones.

40. De conformidad con la decisión 59/4 b iv), la Secretaría examinó los datos sobre la ejecución del programa de país presentados por la Web. La Secretaría tomó nota de que solo 59 países habían presentado los datos de 2010 sirviéndose del sistema de Web, el cual se inició el 25 de abril de 2007, incluidos cinco países que solo presentaron la hoja de cálculo.

41. Sólo 118 de los 144 países que debían presentar datos de programa de país para 2010 y tres para 2011 los suministraron a tiempo para poder realizar el análisis en el presente documento. Todos los países que presentaron solicitudes de financiación a la 66<sup>a</sup> Reunión presentaron también los datos de programa de país de 2010, salvo Namibia.

**Resumen de los datos**Todas las SAO, excepto los HCFC

42. Cien de los 121 países que presentaron informes y tienen planes de gestión de refrigerantes/planes nacionales de eliminación/planes de gestión de eliminación definitiva indicaron progresos o completaron la ejecución de sus planes de gestión de refrigerantes/planes nacionales de eliminación/planes de gestión

de eliminación definitiva. Incluidos los países que notificaron datos anteriores a 2010, 119 de los 143 países registraron progresos en la ejecución de sus planes de gestión de refrigerantes/planes nacionales de eliminación/planes de gestión definitiva o la completaron.

43. Contando los países que notificaron datos anteriores a 2010, se encuentra en funcionamiento un total de 13 267 máquinas de recuperación y 5 675 máquinas de reciclaje. El 75 por ciento de los países que emplean máquinas de recuperación y reciclaje indicaron que las máquinas han estado funcionando ‘satisfactoriamente’ o ‘muy bien’. Se ha recuperado un total de 2 420,4 toneladas PAO de CFC-11, de las cuales se ha reutilizado 2 153,2 toneladas PAO, y se ha recuperado un total de 25 800,2 toneladas PAO de CFC-12, de las que se ha reutilizado 21 342,4 toneladas PAO. No se recopilaron datos para las restantes SAO. Los datos más recientes notificados para 2006-2011, considerados junto con los datos de los informes de años anteriores, indican que se ha impartido capacitación a 61 430 técnicos de servicio y mantenimiento de equipos de refrigeración, se han extendido certificados a 50 210 y se ha impartido capacitación en servicio y mantenimiento de equipos de refrigeración a 2 892 instructores de técnicos.

44. Ciento diez de los 143 países que notificaron datos (incluidos los datos de años anteriores) indicaron que disponen de un sistema de cuotas en vigor. Además, 121 países indicaron que exigen a los importadores que se registren. Se ha informado de que ha recibido capacitación un total de 14 248 funcionarios de aduanas. No está claro si se trata de datos anuales o acumulativos.

45. Ciento treinta y cuatro de los 144 países que debían presentar informes han notificado que tienen en vigor un sistema de concesión de licencias (113 de los 121 países que notificaron datos de 2010/2011 disponían de sistemas de concesión de licencias, de los cuales el 97 por ciento funciona ‘satisfactoriamente’ o ‘muy bien’).

#### Datos de precios de los CFC y los HCFC y de sus productos alternativos

46. En el Cuadro 11 se presenta un resumen de los costos de algunas SAO y los productos sustitutivos.

47. No se han proporcionado dichos datos para halones, metilbromuro o CTC.

48. El Cuadro 11 indica que en 2010 el HCFC-22, el HCFC-141b y el HCFC-142b seguían siendo mucho más baratos que los CFC comparables, según esta muestra de datos. Se tomará nota de que sólo 14 países facilitaron los datos del precio de CFC-11 y 32 países los del CFC-12 no quedando claro si en la mayoría de los países hay algún CFC a la venta dado que éstos procederían de existencias. Por

ejemplo, en lo tocante al HFC-134a y al propano (HC-290), los precios indicados en el Cuadro 11 son superiores a los de los respectivos CFC, si bien en el cuadro no se tiene en cuenta la falta de disponibilidad de tales CFC.

#### Hidroclorofluorocarbonos (HCFC)

49. Este es el segundo año que se utiliza el formato revisado para incluir información pertinente sobre la eliminación de los HCFC aprobado en la 60<sup>a</sup> Reunión (decisión 60/4 b) iv)). De los 121 países que proporcionaron datos de 2010 ó 2011, 111 utilizaron el nuevo formato con información sobre los HCFC.

50. De los 137 países que notificaron datos, 64 informaron que disponían de un sistema de quotas en vigor y 98 países notificaron que se exige el registro de los importadores. Se recuperaron 38 697,9 toneladas PAO de HCFC-22 en total, de las cuales se reutilizaron 37 841,8 toneladas PAO. Se informó que se ha impartido capacitación sobre HCFC a 4 312 funcionarios de aduanas en total. Hay en funcionamiento un total de 1 317 máquinas de recuperación y 476 máquinas de reciclaje, se han expedido certificados a 9 449 técnicos, se ha capacitado a 18 640 técnicos, habiéndose capacitado también a 1 472 instructores de técnicos para la recuperación y reciclaje de HCFC.

#### **PARTE IV: PROYECTOS CON DEMORAS EN LA EJECUCIÓN E INFORMES DE SITUACIÓN ESPECIALES**

51. Hay 22 proyectos en curso que se han clasificado como proyectos con demoras en la ejecución y están sujetos a los procedimientos del Comité para la cancelación de proyectos. Los proyectos con demoras en la ejecución son aquellos: i) que se prevé completar con una demora de más de 12 meses, y/o ii) en los que no se ha efectuado ningún desembolso en un plazo de 18 meses después de la aprobación del proyecto. El desglose de los proyectos con demoras en la ejecución, por organismo de ejecución y bilateral, se presenta en el Cuadro 12 como sigue: ONUDI (siete); PNUD (seis); el Banco Mundial (dos); el Japón (dos); PNUMA (uno); Italia (uno) y Portugal (uno). No se han recibido informes de Israel (uno) ni de España (uno). Las demoras se deben más frecuentemente a factores externos.

*Progreso en la solución de las causas de las demoras*

52. En sus informes, los organismos de ejecución y bilaterales informaron que el progreso en la reducción de las demoras había sido variable. Seis de los proyectos de la lista con demoras en la 65<sup>a</sup> Reunión ya se han terminado (Anexo III).

*Proyectos con algún progreso*

53. Once proyectos han sido clasificados en la categoría “con algún progreso”, y los organismos de ejecución y bilaterales indicaron que se seguirían supervisando dichos proyectos (Anexo IV). Pese al progreso observado, cabe señalar que los proyectos aprobados hace ya más de tres años deben continuar siendo supervisados en virtud de la Decisión 32/4. Por consiguiente, estos proyectos no pueden ser retirados de la lista de supervisión antes de su terminación definitiva, independientemente de los progresos que puedan haberse logrado. Por lo tanto, se recomienda continuar con la supervisión de los mismos.

*Proyectos sin progreso alguno: notificación de posible cancelación*

54. Hay dos proyectos en los que no se ha experimentado progreso alguno desde la 65<sup>a</sup> Reunión (Anexo V). De conformidad con los procedimientos vigentes, la Secretaría del Fondo enviará avisos sobre la posible anulación de estos proyecto por no haberse logrado progreso alguno.

*Proyectos que es posible se cancelen de mutuo acuerdo*

55. Hay un proyecto que es posible se cancele de mutuo acuerdo (Anexo VI).

*Proyectos para los que se pidieron informes de situación adicionales*

56. Los proyectos de fortalecimiento institucional, bancos de halones, capacitación aduanera, recuperación y reciclaje, y los de demostración no están sujetos a los procedimientos de la cancelación de proyectos. Sin embargo, el Comité Ejecutivo ha decidido continuar supervisándolos según corresponda (Decisión 36/14 b)). En su 65<sup>a</sup> Reunión, el Comité Ejecutivo pidió 56 informes de situación adicionales. Dichos informes son necesarios cuando se carece de indicación alguna acerca de los progresos realizados desde el último informe y/o cuando se ha informado de la existencia de impedimentos adicionales a la ejecución. Ha habido progresos en 23 proyectos. Se solicitan informes de situación adicionales respecto de 33 proyectos para su presentación a la 67<sup>a</sup> Reunión (Anexo VII) dándose razones específicas por las que se piden tales informes.

57. En el anexo se indica que sigue habiendo actividades relativas a los CFC sin que se hayan firmado acuerdos y para las que no se han adquirido equipos de recuperación y reciclaje. Hay dos proyectos conexos a los CTC de los que no se informó progreso alguno en la adquisición de equipos. Sigue habiendo proyectos de enfriadores cuyos acuerdos siguen debatiéndose con los bancos nacionales, en los que el proyecto se están redefiniendo, en los que el proyecto está pendiente de que se seleccione y contrate a un asesor, y otros en los que el desembolso es insuficiente. Hay varios proyectos de destrucción de SAO que tenían que haberse presentado a la 65<sup>a</sup> Reunión pero que a fechas de celebración de la 66<sup>a</sup> Reunión aún no se han presentado. Hay un proyecto relativo a bancos de halones cuyo desembolso ha venido siendo insuficiente durante tres reuniones consecutivas. Existe también un desembolso insuficiente para un proyecto de demostración de HCFC y otro proyecto de proyecto de inversión relativa a los HCFC que está pendiente de que se firme el documento, al tiempo que otros han

progresado. De los 10 informes de situación sobre proyectos de fortalecimiento institucional con problemas relativos a la firma del documento, 3 proyectos aún no se han firmado, habiendo además otros 5 proyectos de los que no se han facilitado los informes financieros necesarios. La preparación de proyecto para un proyecto de metilbromuro que debería haberse presentado a la 65<sup>a</sup> Reunión sigue aún en curso, habiendo un proyecto para el que cabe la posibilidad de que se recomiende su cancelación y cierre. Existe un plan de gestión de eliminación definitiva y otro de gestión de eliminación de HCFC cuyos desembolsos son insuficientes.

*Firma de documento para proyecto/desarrollo de plan de gestión de eliminación de HCFC*

58. A fechas de hoy, el Comité Ejecutivo ha aprobado 297 planes de gestión de eliminación de HCFC y actividades conexas a la preparación de tales planes en 144 países, de lo que resultan actividades aprobadas para dichos planes en 106 países por una cuantía que asciende a 439,3 millones de \$EUA de los que 209 millones de \$EUA han sido aprobados para realizar las actividades del primer tramo. Partiendo del número de planes de gestión de eliminación de HCFC ya aprobados y de los que se presentaron a la 66<sup>a</sup> Reunión, hay 23 países que deberán presentar sus planes de gestión de eliminación de HCFC a la 66<sup>th</sup> meeting.

59. En su 65<sup>a</sup> Reunión, el Comité Ejecutivo pidió que se presentaran 7 informes adicionales sobre la situación del desarrollo de los planes de gestión de eliminación de HCFC. Dichos informes son necesarios cuando se carece de indicación alguna acerca de los progresos realizados desde el último informe y/o cuando se ha informado de la existencia de impedimentos adicionales a la ejecución. Los planes de gestión de eliminación de HCFC en cuestión se encuentran en diversas fases de culminación, habiendo uno que se encuentra en la etapa inicial de desarrollo, tres con sus encuestas en curso, dos con sus encuestas terminadas y uno que se presentó a la 66<sup>a</sup> Reunión y después fue retirado por petición de gobierno pertinente alegándose la necesidad de verificar los datos. Se han solicitado informes de situación adicionales de seis proyectos que deberán presentarse a la 67<sup>a</sup> Reunión (Anexo VIII).

## RECOMENDACIÓN

60. El Comité Ejecutivo pudiera considerar:

- a) Tomar nota:
  - i) con reconocimiento de los informes de situación y de los informes sobre proyectos con demoras en su ejecución que presentaron a la Secretaría los Gobiernos de Francia, Italia, el Japón y Portugal, los cuales se examinan en el documento UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/66/6;
  - ii) de que sólo se presentaron 59 informes de ejecución de programa de país para el año 2010 sirviéndose del sistema de notificación por la Web, el cual se inició el 25 de abril de 2007;
  - iii) de la terminación de seis de los 22 proyectos de la lista de proyectos con demoras en la ejecución, como se recoge en el Anexo III;
  - iv) de que la Secretaría y los organismos de ejecución podrían adoptar las medidas establecidas de conformidad con las evaluaciones de la Secretaría (algún progreso, con arreglo al Anexo IV), e informar y notificar a los gobiernos y organismos de ejecución según procediese;

## Annex I

### DETAILED ANALYSIS OF THE STATUS OF IMPLEMENTATION IN COUNTRIES SUBJECT TO DECISIONS OF THE PARTIES ON COMPLIANCE AND THOSE WHOSE LATEST CONSUMPTION DATA EXCEEDS THE CONTROL MEASURES

1. Annex I presents the detailed analysis of the status of implementation in countries subject to decisions of the Parties on compliance and those whose latest consumption data exceeds the next control measures. The data tables in Appendices I-VI indicate whether a country has received a total phase-out agreement for a specific controlled substance. The analysis of halons (Appendix II) indicates whether a halon banking activity has been approved. Halon banking guidelines require that regulations facilitating production and import bans are established within six months of the establishment of a reclamation centre (decision 18/22). The methyl bromide analysis (Appendix III) indicates further whether a country has received funding for a phase-out to meet the 2005 control measures. Appendices IV and V present information on the carbon tetrachloride (CTC) and methyl chloroform (TCA) phase-out, respectively. Appendix VI provides information on HCFC consumption only.

#### ANALYSIS OF COMPLIANCE FOR CFCs (Appendix I)

2. Countries have been grouped into one category: (a) those whose latest consumption exceeds the 2010 100 per cent phase-out target.

(a) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the 2010 phase-out target

3. This category consists of 8 countries which may need to achieve additional CFC phase-out amounting to 1,702 ODP tonnes by 2010 in order to comply with the 100 per cent reduction target.

4. The Executive Committee has approved national CFC phase-out agreements for all of these countries.

5. Seven of the 8 countries that have 2010 consumption that exceeded zero consumption either have essential use authorizations for CFC consumption (Bangladesh, China, Egypt, India, Iran (Islamic Republic of) and Syrian Arab Republic) as per decision XXI/4 or emergency essential use for CFC-113 2010-2011 consumption as per decision XXII/4 para. 7 (Dominican Republic (the)).

#### ANALYSIS OF COMPLIANCE FOR HALONS (Appendix II)

6. Seventy-five countries have reported no consumption of halons between 1995 and 2010.

7. Sixty-one countries have received support for halon banking activities or phase-out agreements. This includes those countries participating in regional halon banks. Halon banking is presumed to be the last funded activity in the halon consumption sector for most countries but there are some halon phase-out activities that are part of multi-sectoral phase-out agreements.

8. Countries have been grouped into the following one category: (a) those whose latest consumption exceeds the 2010 100 per cent phase-out target.

(a) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the 2010 phase-out target

9. This category consists of two countries that may need to phase-out additional halons amounting to 3 ODP tonnes by 2010 in order to comply with the 100 per cent reduction targets. These countries have received support from the Multilateral Fund.

### **ANALYSIS OF COMPLIANCE FOR METHYL BROMIDE (Appendix III)**

10. This section presents the analysis for compliance with methyl bromide control measures. It should be noted that all data reported and used in this analysis relate to controlled use only, which means that the data exclude quarantine and pre-shipment (QPS). 144 of the 146 Article 5 countries that have ratified the Copenhagen Amendment have reported complete baseline data. Of these 146 countries, 57 reported zero for both the baseline consumption and the latest consumption.

11. One-hundred Article 5 countries have received support from the Multilateral Fund for methyl bromide activities and/or projects. This includes projects that will lead to a complete phase-out of methyl bromide in 63 of these countries, partial phase-out in an additional 8, and other forms of assistance received by 29.

12. Countries have been grouped into the following two categories: (a) those whose latest consumption exceeds the 20 per cent reduction target of 2005 that applies until December 2014; and (b) those whose latest consumption exceeds the 2015 100 per cent phase-out target. Appendix III identifies those countries that have not ratified the Copenhagen Amendment.

(a) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the 20 per cent MB baseline reduction target

13. This category consists of only one country, Turkmenistan. This country may need to meet additional combined reduction amounting to 0.02 ODP tonnes in order to comply with the 20 per cent reduction targets. Turkmenistan has approved projects that will lead to complete phase-out of methyl bromide.

(b) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the 2015 phase-out target

14. This category consists of 29 countries that may need to meet additional combined reduction amounting to 2,456.4 ODP tonnes by 2015 in order to comply with the 100 per cent reduction targets. Of the 29 countries, 24 countries have approved projects that will lead to complete phase-out of methyl bromide. Four countries may need additional assistance from the Multilateral Fund to achieve the phase-out of methyl bromide by 2015. The remaining country (Singapore) is currently not eligible to receive funding from the Multilateral Fund.

### **CARBON TETRACHLORIDE (CTC) (Appendix IV)**

15. This section presents the analysis of compliance with CTC control measures. All data reported and used in this analysis are those related to controlled use only, which excludes feedstock. Reported CTC consumption was not differentiated by specific end use, such as solvents, process agents and laboratory use.

16. Of the 146 countries with reported baseline data, 90 reported zero both for the baseline and the latest consumption.

17. Countries have been grouped into the following one category: (a) those whose latest consumption exceeds the 2010 100 per cent phase-out target. Appendix IV notes those countries that have not ratified the London Amendment.

(a) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the 2010 phase-out target

18. This category consists of 5 countries that may need to phase out additional CTC amounting to 283 ODP tonnes to meet the 100 per cent reduction by 2010. Four of the 5 countries have received

funding for CTC phase-out agreements or projects from the Multilateral Fund. The Republic of Korea has agreed not to receive CTC funding from the Multilateral Fund.

19. Countries with 2010 CTC consumption that exceeded zero consumption have process agent use exemptions for CTC consumption as per decision XXII/8 (China) or CTC consumption for laboratory and analytical uses (Croatia, Mexico, Nepal), except Republic of Korea (the).

### **METHYL CHLOROFORM (TCA) (Appendix V)**

20. This section presents the analysis for compliance with TCA control measures. Of the 146 countries that have reported baseline data, 103 reported zero both for the baseline and the latest consumption.

21. Countries have been grouped into two categories: (a) those whose latest consumption exceeds the 70 per cent reduction target of 2010; and (b) those whose latest consumption exceeds the 2015 100 per cent phase-out target. Appendix V specifies those countries that have not ratified the London Amendment.

(a) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the 70 per cent TCA baseline reduction target

22. All countries are in compliance with the 70 per cent TCA baseline reduction target.

(b) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the 100 per cent TCA baseline reduction target

23. This category consists of three countries that may need to meet additional combined reduction amounting to 76.5 ODP tonnes by 2015 in order to comply with the 100 per cent reduction target. Two of those three countries have received funding for TCA phase-out agreements or projects from the Multilateral Fund. The remaining country (the Republic of Korea) is not eligible to receive TCA funding from the Multilateral Fund.

### **HCFCs (Appendix VI)**

24. Appendix VI also includes an analysis of the latest consumption and baseline data on HCFCs and indicates whether the country had received HPMP preparation funding, the number of investment projects approved, the number of demonstration projects approved, total phase-out approved in ODP tonnes and activities planned in the 2012 business plans. 145 of the 147 countries already reported both the baseline and the latest consumption.

25. All countries have received HPMP project preparation funds except the Republic of Korea, Singapore and the United Arab Emirates. The Republic of Korea and Singapore had agreed not to receive funding from the Multilateral Fund. The United Arab Emirates has activities planned in the 2012-2014 business plans.

(a) Countries whose latest consumption exceeds the freeze reduction target

26. This category consists of 75 countries that may need to phase out additional HCFC amounting to 1,483 ODP tonnes to meet the freeze reduction target by 2013.

27. 53 of the 75 countries have received funding for HCFC phase-out agreements from the Multilateral Fund. Of the 22 remaining countries, 10 countries have submitted HCFC phase-out projects to the 66<sup>th</sup> meeting, 11 countries have activities planned in the 2012-2014 business plans and the Republic of Korea has agreed not to receive HCFC funding from the Multilateral Fund.
