REPORT ON BALANCES AND AVAILABILITY OF RESOURCES

Introduction

1. This document presents a summary of the financial adjustments indicated by the bilateral and implementing agencies (IAs) as agreed by the Fund Secretariat. The document includes statistical data, as required by decisions 28/7 and 56/2, from projects for bilateral and IAs with balances that have been held for over the allowable 12-month period following completion of the project. The data presented are based on the reporting format that has been developed pursuant to decision 31/2 and include both obligated and un-obligated balances. Further to decision 41/92(b), this document also indicates the level of resources available to the Executive Committee in cash and promissory notes as recorded in the Status of contributions and disbursements (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/67/3). The total funds to be returned addressed in this report amount to US \$2,212,058 including support costs of US \$2,098,012 returned by the IAs and US \$114,046 from bilateral agencies to the 67th meeting.

Funds being returned to the 67th meeting by Implementing Agencies

2. Information provided by the IAs indicates that a total of US \$1,958,285 excluding agency support costs will be returned to the 67th meeting, as set out in Table 1.

3. Table 1 shows that UNDP and UNEP will return US \$1,190,304 and US \$296,503 respectively to the Fund from completed projects. UNEP's return relates to the 2011 CAP budget in line with decision 35/36(d) whereby Funds approved annually for the Country Assistance Programme (CAP) but not spent should be returned to the Multilateral Fund for re-programming at the second meeting of the Executive Committee in the year following that for which they had been approved. UNIDO will return US \$26,895 from completed projects and US \$268,988 from one on-going project as a follow up to Executive Committee decision 66/4(b)(iv) to request the cancellation by mutual agreement of the phase–out of HCFC-141b from the manufacturing of polyurerthane rigid foam at Pavusin (CRO/FOA/59/INV/34) project. The World Bank will return US \$175,595 from three completed projects.

Projects with balances by year of completion

4. Table 2 presents the number of projects with balances that are still being held by the IAs and the years in which those projects were completed. It shows that for projects completed up to and including 31 May 2011 (at least over the last 12 months), IAs had balances that totalled US \$2,778,554 excluding support costs.

- 5. At its 47th meeting, the Executive Committee requested the Fund Secretariat to continue to monitor multi-year annual tranches in the context of documents on implementation delays and project balances (decision 47/50(b)(ii)).
- 6. UNDP holds a balance amounting to US \$859,044, of which US \$195,860 is attributable to 18 multi-year agreements (MYA). It also has the highest number of projects with balances (49) followed by UNEP (34) and UNIDO (32). The World Bank has zero balances.
- 7. Three of the four agencies have projects that were completed over two years ago and have remaining balances. UNDP has the largest number of projects completed over two years ago, but has decreased from 23 to 15 projects. The level of balances on UNDP's projects over two years old has decreased from US \$362,381 to US \$282,707. Out of the 15 projects, five are Multi-year Agreements (MYAs) with US \$145,433 in obligated balances.
- 8. By decision 66/2(b) the Executive Committee decided to request agencies with long outstanding obligated balances on projects completed in 2005, 2006 and 2007 to return these balances as soon as possible. No project completed in 2005 with a balance has been reported to the 67th meeting. With regards to projects completed in 2006 and 2007 UNDP maintained the explanation provided in the past meetings that balances over two years are considered still obligated because the financial procedures of UNDP require that a final budget revision be issued to mark the formal closure of a project between UNDP and the executing agency and to close the project in UNDP's systems. Until this step is taken and the executing agency is considered to have access to these funds and therefore these are considered obligated.
- 9. In its response to the Secretariat's request to justify why balances under eight projects completed in 2007 and 2008 are still obligated and would not be returned to the 67th meeting, and to give an indication on when the balances under these projects would be returned to the Fund, UNDP provided additional explanation indicating that it continues in its efforts to obtain the signed final budgets from the executing agencies and that the balances will be returned as soon as the final revisions are issued and projects closed. Out of eight projects completed in 2007 and 2008, UNDP expects to return balances for seven projects to the 68th meeting. UNDP is still working with the country office and government to clear an outstanding item for the remaining project and expects that this will be resolved and the project closed in time to return any remaining balance by the 69th meeting. UNDP indicated that it was working to financially close the seven projects completed in 2009 and can confirm at this stage that balances for at least two projects of the seven will be returned to the 68th meeting. Follow up for closure of all completed projects is also ongoing to ensure balances for projects completed in 2010 and 2011 can also be returned.
- The number of UNEP projects completed over two years ago has decreased from 13 to eight 10. projects. UNEP's balance on completed projects has decreased from US \$266,972 reported to the 66th meeting to US \$199,653. The Secretariat requested clarification on the two projects completed in 2006 and one project completed in 2007 with obligated balances on why the balance under these projects are still obligated. The Secretariat requested UNEP to advise the Committee on any action it had taken to obtain the outstanding information from its implementing partners to allow for the financial closure of these projects within reasonable deadlines. UNEP explained that it is making every effort to return the balances on completed projects. In all projects, funds have already been advanced to the respective National Ozone Units for the activities. These funds are therefore no longer available for UNEP to return to the Multilateral Fund. UNEP is working with the respective implementation partners to finalize the financial reporting. It explained that the largest balance of US \$76,350 is under project ALG/SEV/48/INS/64. In this regard UNEP is organizing a joint mission with UNIDO to Algeria scheduled by the middle of the year to resolve any pending items. UNEP is also reviewing in details the balances under the Regional Management Plan (RMP) projects in Rwanda with a total balance of US \$82,022 in an effort to financially close these projects this year. UNEP will also continue to follow up with the remaining countries for the rest of the projects.

- 11. The balance held by UNIDO for projects completed over two years ago has decreased since the 66th meeting of the Executive Committee from US \$606,446 to US \$591,153 and the number of projects decreased from 16 to 13. Out of the 13 projects, eight are MYAs with US \$517,499 in obligated balances. UNIDO has one project completed in 2007 with obligated balances. While it is a MYA the Secretariat requested UNIDO to provide additional justification on why the balance under this project is still obligated and not returned to the 67th meeting and give an indication on when it would be returned. The Secretariat also requested UNIDO to provide clarification on action it had taken to obtain the outstanding information to allow for the financial closure of these projects within reasonable deadlines. UNIDO explained in its response that out of the 13 projects on the list completed over two years ago, eight projects are MYA projects and five are individual projects. For MYA projects, UNIDO indicated that funds are not expected to be returned until the end of the MYA, and that UNIDO is however doing its utmost to clear all obligations on both MYA and individual projects. Due to these efforts, the number of projects could be reduced to 13. The remaining balances for these projects cannot be returned until financially closed and all obligations are cleared.
- 12. With regard to the one project that was completed in 2007, UNIDO explained that as soon as the Inter office vouchers (IOV) are received from UNDP, it would be able to clear the obligations and financially close the project and return any remaining balance. UNIDO reiterated that it is regularly following up on this issue in order to financially close this project before the 68th meeting of the Executive Committee. For stand-alone completed projects with balances, the Secretariat asked UNIDO to advise on action taken by it to obtain the outstanding information to allow for the financial closure of these projects within reasonable deadlines. UNIDO indicated that regular follow up is made with the field to get outstanding IOVs that will allow clearance of most obligations. Furthermore, UNIDO also informed that in case of long-standing obligations of several years, it is giving deadlines to clear such obligations; otherwise, the obligations will be cancelled. UNIDO is doing its utmost to financially close these projects by the 69th Executive Committee meeting or earlier.

Obligated and un-obligated balances

13. The level of balances classified as obligated and un-obligated for the four IAs is as follows:

- 14. Out of the total of US \$2,778,554 from completed and on-going projects, US \$2,778,554 is obligated (which means that these funds are expected to be spent). There are no un-obligated balances.
- 15. UNDP reported a decrease in obligated balances on completed projects. Its overall number of projects with balances shows a decrease from 67 projects reported to the 66th meeting to 49 reported to the 67th meeting. The overall level of obligated balances has decreased from US \$1,059,230 to US \$859,044. UNDP has 4 projects completed over 4 years ago with obligated balances.
- 16. UNEP has 34 completed projects, and holds US \$942,037 in obligated amounts and has no un-obligated balances. The overall number of projects with balances has increased from 33 projects reported to the 66th meeting to 34 reported to the 67th meeting. The overall level of balances increased

from US \$435,915 to US \$942,037. UNEP has three projects completed over four years ago with obligated balances. Out of the three projects with obligated balances, two were completed in 2006.

- 17. UNIDO reported 32 completed projects with US \$977,473 in obligated funds. The overall number of projects with balances has decreased from 42 projects reported to the 66th meeting to 32 reported to the 67th meeting, and the overall level of balances has decreased from US \$1,060,666 to US \$977,473. UNIDO has one project completed in 2007 with obligated balances.
- 18. At its 35th meeting, the Executive Committee requested IAs to return all agency support costs associated with remaining funds from completed projects. If expenditures had been incurred from these costs, the IAs should provide an explanation and return the balance of funds (decision 35/13(k)). Table 4 indicates that a total of US \$139,727 in agency support costs will be returned at the 67th meeting. This amount includes the UNIDO's return of US \$2,100 from completed projects and US \$20,174 from on-going projects, UNDP's of US \$72,986, UNEP's US \$25,094 and the World Bank's of US \$19,373 from completed projects.

19. By decision 56/2 bilateral agencies were requested to report to the Executive Committee on their proposed disposition of balances from completed projects. Table 5 provides the feedback received on returns of balances from projects completed by the Governments of Sweden. It indicates that a total US \$114,046 comprising project costs will be returned to the 67th meeting.

20. The Government of Sweden has advised the Secretariat of its intent to return US \$114,046 at the 67th meeting for one completed project in the Philippines (PHI/PHA/41/TAS /72) as shown in Annex II.

Bilateral projects with balances by year of completion

21. Table 6 presents the balances that are being held by bilateral agencies and the years in which those projects were completed. It shows that for projects completed up to and including

31 May 2011 (at least over the last 12 months) bilateral agencies had balances totalling US \$221,261 including support costs.

- 22. The Government of France advised the Secretariat that it would maintain the outstanding balances on completed projects for the 67^{th} meeting at the same level as the 66^{th} and that no balance would be returned to the 67^{th} meeting. The Government of France's balances include only one project which is over two years old.
- 23. The Government of Japan advised the Secretariat that they will not return the balances on completed projects to the 67th meeting and that it would be using the unspent balance for other projects under the bilateral cooperation of Japan.
- 24. As a result of the over programming by the Government of Germany on bilateral activities in the 2012-104 triennium it is anticipated that Germany would use the balance on completed projects to cover the shortfall under other bilateral approved projects.

SECRETARIAT'S COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

COMMENTS

- Annex I presents additional information on obligated and un-obligated balances by agency. Of the US \$2.78 million in projects with balances in this report, about US \$1.02 million is for 37 MYAs. UNIDO has the largest amount of balances, US \$977,473 of which is obligated, followed by UNEP with US \$942,037 and UNDP with US \$859,044. The Word Bank has no projects with balances. No agencies have unobligated balances. The balance on projects completed over two years ago withheld by agencies amounts to US \$1,073,513, with UNEP holding balances for three projects completed by 2007, UNDP and UNIDO hold balances for four and one completed projects each from 2007. Attention should still be given to these long outstanding obligations with a view to returning the balances to the Fund as soon as possible. No agencies have un-obligated balances of two year old and more. One bilateral agency has balances including support cost on completed projects of two year old and older.
- 26. The status of contributions and disbursements as of 8 June 2012 indicates that the Treasurer has an available balance amounting to US \$38,271,333 at 8 June 2012. The total net balance returned by IAs, including agency support costs and the returns from bilateral agencies, is US \$2,212,058. The

total level of resources available for approvals by the Executive Committee at its 67th meeting, after taking into account the Fund's balance as contained in document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/67/3 and the total amount returned by IAs is US \$40,483,391

27. Considering the total level of funding for projects and activities submitted or consideration by the Executive Committee as at 5 June 2012 amounting to US \$93.5 million including support cost there are insufficient resources available for approvals at the 67th meeting.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 28. The Executive Committee may wish to note:
 - (a) The report on balances and availability of resources contained in document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/67/4;
 - (b) That the net level of funds being returned by the implementing agencies to the 67th meeting was US \$1,958,285 against projects, which included the return of US \$1,190,304 from UNDP, US \$296,503 from UNEP, US \$295,883 from UNIDO and US \$175,595 from the World Bank;
 - (c) That the net level of support costs being returned by the implementing agencies to the 67th meeting was US \$139,727 against projects, which included the return of US \$72,986 from UNDP, US \$25,094 from UNEP, US \$22,274 from UNIDO and US \$19,373 from the World Bank;
 - (d) That implementing agencies had balances totalling US \$1,073,513, excluding support costs, from projects completed over two years previously, which included US \$282,707 for UNDP, US \$199,653 for UNEP and US \$591,153 for UNIDO;
 - (e) The feedback received from UNDP, UNEP and UNIDO on the projects with long outstanding obligated balances completed in 2005, 2006 and 2007 and to request the Implementing Agencies with projects completed in 2006 and 2007 to return the balances as soon as possible.
 - (f) That the Government of France still had un-obligated balances totalling US \$78,440, excluding support costs, attributed to a project completed over two years previously;
 - (g) The net level of funds being returned by the Government of Sweden to the 67th meeting was US \$114,046 and to request the Treasurer to follow up with Sweden on its return in cash to the Fund.
