### OVERVIEW OF ISSUES IDENTIFIED DURING PROJECT REVIEW

- 1. This document consists of the following sections:
  - (a) An overview of projects and activities submitted by bilateral and implementing agencies;
  - (b) Issues identified during the project review process:
    - (i) Extension of dates of completion of projects;
    - (ii) Years to be included in verifications of HCFC consumption in low-volume consuming (LVCs) countries under HCFC phase-out management plans (HPMPs);
    - (iii) Proposals for HFC-23 by-product demonstration projects;
  - (c) HFC-related projects for funding under additional contributions to the Multilateral Fund:
    - (i) Funding requests for enabling activities;
    - (ii) Funding requests for fully developed stand-alone HFC investment projects;
  - (d) Project and activities submitted for blanket approval; and
  - (e) Investment projects for individual consideration.

# Projects and activities submitted by bilateral and implementing agencies

2. Bilateral and implementing agencies submitted 169 funding requests for tranches of approved multi-year agreements, projects and activities amounting to US \$106,937,768 (US \$110,660,439 including

amount requested in principle), including agency support costs, where applicable. The funding requests covered:

- (a) Stage II of the HPMP for two non-LVC countries;
- (b) Tranches of approved HPMPs for 23 countries;
- (c) Renewals of institutional strengthening (IS) projects in 32 countries;
- (d) Preparation for stage II of HPMPs for 35 countries and for stage III for four countries;
- (e) Verification report on the implementation of HPMPs for 28 countries; and
- (f) UNEP's Compliance Assistance Programme and core unit costs for UNDP, UNIDO and the World Bank.
- 3. Following the project review process, 124 projects and activities totalling US \$11,706,735, including agency support costs, are recommended for blanket approval, and 27 projects and activities totalling US \$82,890,421, of which US \$31,395,787 is for the third tranche of stage II of the HPMP for China, are being forwarded for individual consideration. Together, the projects for blanket approval and those for individual consideration amount to US \$94,597,156.
- 4. In addition, 18 HFC-related projects and activities totalling US \$4,120,570, including agency support costs, are being forwarded to the 82<sup>nd</sup> meeting following the project review process. These activities include funding for enabling activities in 11 countries (amounting to US \$1,637,100 recommended for blanket approval), fully-developed stand-alone HFC investment projects in five countries. HFC-related projects and activities are discussed separately, as part of their funding will be from the additional contributions to the Multilateral Fund by a group of non-A5 countries.

Project proposals submitted and subsequently withdrawn

- 5. The request for funding for the third and final tranche of stage I of the HPMP for Morocco was withdrawn by UNIDO for submission to a future meeting due to a number of factors: change, without revision of the Agreement, to the HCFC consumption baseline of 51.35 ODP tonnes from 59.67 ODP tonnes at the time of the approval of stage I of the HPMP; redundancy of an activity to phase out 1.1 ODP tonnes (10 mt) of HCFC-141b used for flushing equipment of refrigeration circuits at the national railways at a time when the Government has since 2014 reported zero HCFC-141b consumption annually; and only 11.5 per cent disbursement of the second tranche for an overall disbursement of 23 per cent of the two tranches so far approved.
- 6. The request for funding for the fourth tranche of stage I of the HPMP for Sierra Leone was withdrawn by UNEP for submission to a future meeting due to a low level of fund disbursement.
- 7. UNDP submitted requests for the preparation of stage III of HPMPs for four countries (Dominican Republic, Nigeria, Panama, and Uruguay) as part of their work programme amendments. The request for Nigeria was also submitted by UNIDO as part of its work programme amendments, as cooperating agency. After initial review of these requests, both agencies were requested to withdraw these requests, as during the consideration of the consolidated 2018-2020 business plan of the Multilateral Fund at its 80<sup>th</sup> meeting, the Executive Committee decided to remove all activities related to stage III of HPMPs<sup>1</sup>. Further, this issue

is also being considered as part of agenda item 8(c), Consolidated business plan of the Multilateral Fund for 2019-2021.<sup>2</sup>

- 8. UNEP included a request for enabling activities for the Democratic People's Republic of Korea in its work programme amendments, which the Secretariat has also requested it to be removed in line with decision 80/34(c)(iii)b.
- 9. The World Bank has included a request for project preparation of a technology demonstration project for HFC-23 by-product conversion for India in their work programme submission. The Secretariat subsequently requested that this be removed from the work programme due to the lack of an endorsement letter from the Government concerned, which was not consistent with procedure for project submissions.
- 10. A request for funding for a demonstration project on accelerating energy efficiency as a co-benefit from HFC phase-down in a domestic refrigerator manufacturing enterprise in the Islamic Republic of Iran was withdrawn by UNIDO for submission to a future meeting before entering into in-depth discussions with the Secretariat.

### IS renewal requests

11. The Secretariat reviewed the terminal reports and requests for extension of IS funding for 32 countries against relevant decisions including decision 74/51(c) on the funding level for IS projects, and decision 74/51(e) on the requirement to include specific performance indicators for planned activities.<sup>3</sup> All requests were cross-checked against: previous IS reports; progress reports on the implementation of country programmes (CP); data reported under Article 7 of the Montreal Protocol; the latest reports on implementation of HPMPs; bilateral and implementing agencies' progress reports submitted to the 82<sup>nd</sup> meeting; and relevant decisions on compliance adopted by the Parties to the Montreal Protocol. All countries had 2017 country programme implementation data as at issuance of the present document. Thirty countries reported on specific performance indicators as part of the progress report for the previous IS phase. In this regard, all 30 countries achieved all, or the majority of the targets set. The Secretariat recommended all IS projects submitted to the 82<sup>nd</sup> meeting for blanket approval.

Funding withheld pending submission of verification reports or meeting specific conditions

12. At the 81<sup>st</sup> meeting, funding for tranches of the HPMPs for Colombia and Indonesia were withheld pending submission of the relevant verification reports. Subsequent to the meeting, the Secretariat received satisfactory verification reports from both countries, resulting in the disbursement of funds by the Treasurer to the relevant implementing agencies. In the course of reviewing the verification report for Colombia, it was noted that the Government of Colombia considers the use of imported (bulk) HCFC-141b for the manufacture of pre-blended polyols as domestic consumption, irrespective of whether the pre-blended polyols are used in the country or exported. However, the quota for HCFC-141b contained in exported pre-blended polyols can be restituted to an enterprise, which could create a loophole related to the control of HCFC-141b. The Government is exploring measures to address this possible, minor loophole in the future.

Summary of prices of the controlled substances and alternatives

13. In line with decision 79/4(c),<sup>4</sup> the Secretariat is presenting a summary of the prices of the controlled substances and the alternatives to be phased in for the new stage II of HPMPs submitted to the 82<sup>nd</sup> meeting. Out of the two stage II of HPMPs submitted, only Thailand included an investment project in the polyurethane (PU) spray foam sector. The calculations provided by the World Bank on Thailand indicated that the enterprises in the PU spray foam sector obtain a price of US \$4.15 per kg of HCFC-141b, which is consistent with the price of HCFC-141b given in the CP data (US \$4.15 per kg). The World Bank also informed the Secretariat that import price of HCFC-141b is US \$3.03 per kg, and the price of HFO is US \$12 to US \$14 per kg, based on the prices presented in the Ozone Operations Resource Group (OORG) meeting.

## Issues identified during project review

### Extension of date of completion of projects

- 14. At the 80<sup>th</sup> and 81<sup>st</sup> meetings, the Executive Committee had approved the extension of the stage I of the HPMPs for Bahrain, India, Malaysia and Nigeria; the stage I and stage II of Brazil; the stage I of the HPPMP for China; eleven low-GWP demonstration projects and three feasibility studies for district cooling; and a chiller project. It also allowed for an extension for enabling activities, following a recommendation by the Secretariat after a review of a request for extension.
- 15. At the 82<sup>nd</sup> meeting, the Secretariat received requests for extending the project completion dates for four multi-year projects (i.e., stage I of the HPMPs for Bangladesh, China (industrial and commercial refrigeration and PU foam sectors), Indonesia, Jordan, and Qatar); two low-GWP demonstration projects (i.e., the Argentina component of a global project and the global project in Eastern Africa and the Caribbean). It also received extension requests for the methyl bromide production, process agent II and the halon sector plans in China.
- 16. During the review of the projects submitted to the 82<sup>nd</sup> meeting, it was noted that the reasons given to justify the extension varied by project, including: delays in implementation; delays in the commercial availability of low-GWP alternatives; challenges in the uptake of a technology in the market; and delays in signing relevant agreements. Notwithstanding implementation delays, the above-mentioned Article 5 countries have recorded consumption and, where relevant, production that was below their respective compliance targets.

#### 17. The Secretariat further noted that:

- (a) Implementing agencies appeared to have continued implementation beyond the approved completion date without a request for extension (i.e., HPMPs in Jordan and Qatar, and a low-GWP demonstration project in Saudi Arabia);<sup>5</sup>
- (b) In the case of requests related to stage I of the HPMPs, the overlap with implementation of stage II was a concern, highlighting the need to ensure separate reporting and financial

- management for each stage, as well as to consider minimizing overlapping activities between similar projects (e.g., CFC PU foam sector and stage I PU foam sector plan); and
- (c) Delays in the completion of low-GWP demonstration projects (approved with specific implementation periods) engendered potential delays in other, related activities.

#### Recommendation

18. The Executive Committee <u>may wish</u> to consider requesting bilateral and implementing agencies to submit a justification for requests for extension of a project at least six months in advance of the date of completion, where an extension was required, for consideration and approval by the Executive Committee on a case-by-case basis.

## Years to be included in verifications of HCFC consumption in LVC countries under HPMPs

- 19. At its 61<sup>st</sup> meeting, the Executive Committee requested the Secretariat to provide to the Executive Committee at the first meeting of each year, starting in 2012, a list of all countries with a HCFC consumption baseline up to 360 metric tonnes that had an approved HPMP and an indication of a sample of 20 per cent of countries from that list to enable the Executive Committee to approve such a sample for the purposes of verification of that country's compliance with the HPMP agreement for that year (decision 61/46(c)).
- 20. At the same time, the Agreements between LVC countries and the Executive Committee (paragraphs 5(a) and (b)) require countries to meet and verify targets set out in row 1.2 of Appendix 2-A for all relevant years since the approval of the Agreement, except if the Executive Committee decided that such verification would not be required.
- 21. As a result, some verification reports submitted to the Secretariat for LVC countries cover all relevant years of stage I, while others only cover the years since the approval of the previous tranche (including or excluding that year).

## Recommendation

22. The Executive Committee <u>may wish</u> to request relevant bilateral and implementing agencies, when submitting reports for verification of compliance of LVC countries with their HPMP agreement as part of the tranche request, to ensure that they cover all years since the approval of the previous tranche including the year of that tranche approval.

### HFC-23 by-product demonstration projects

23. The Government of China, through the World Bank, had submitted to the 82<sup>nd</sup> meeting a proposal for a demonstration project to validate an industrial process to convert HFC-23 by-product from the production of HCFC-22 to valuable product(s) for commercialization as an alternative approach to destruction. The Secretariat noted, however, that the proposal was not submitted in line with decision 79/47(g), which invited implementing agencies to submit proposals for such projects to the 81<sup>st</sup> meeting, and therefore did not review the proposal.

- 24. In addition, UNDP submitted at the 80<sup>th</sup> meeting a report on the status of the project preparation for the technology demonstration project to convert HFC-23 by-product to valuable organic halides by reaction with hydrogen and carbon dioxide for Liaocheng Fuer New Material Technology Ltd., in China (decision 80/48). The project proposal could not be submitted to the 81<sup>st</sup> meeting due to the lack of an agreement between the technology provider and the intended beneficiary in China. Accordingly, UNDP sought guidance on how to proceed, noting that project proposals to convert HFC-23 by-product to valuable product(s) could only be submitted to the 81<sup>st</sup> meeting.
- 25. As part of its work programme amendment,<sup>7</sup> the World Bank had submitted to the 82<sup>nd</sup> meeting a request for funding for project preparation for an HFC-23 by-product demonstration project for India; however, that request was withdrawn as an endorsement letter could not be provided in time.
- 26. Recalling the interest expressed by the Executive Committee in submitting such projects, the Secretariat is seeking the Executive Committee's guidance on whether it wishes to invite implementing agencies to submit, up to the 84<sup>th</sup> meeting, proposals for feasible technology demonstration for HFC-23 by-product mitigation or conversion technologies with the potential for cost-effective, environmentally sustainable conversion of HFC-23.

#### Recommendation

27. The Executive Committee <u>may wish</u> to consider whether to invite bilateral and implementing agencies to submit, up to the 84<sup>th</sup> meeting, proposals for the demonstration of feasible technology for HFC-23 by-product conversion technologies with the potential for cost-effective, environmentally sustainable conversion of HFC-23.

## HFC-related projects for funding under additional contributions to the Multilateral Fund

- 28. The Treasurer has submitted a document on the status of additional contributions pledged by a group of donor countries intended to provide fast-start support for the implementation of the HFC phase-down, and availability of resources.<sup>8</sup> As at 11 September 2018, the Treasurer has received US \$25,513,071 from 17 countries and has disbursed US \$22,590,700;<sup>9</sup> of which US \$513,600 accounted as bilateral contribution. The balance available for programming at the 82<sup>nd</sup> meeting is US \$2,408,771.
- 29. The four implementing agencies submitted to the 82<sup>nd</sup> meeting 13 funding requests for enabling activities in 11 Article 5 countries and five HFC-related investment projects. The Secretariat has presented below an overview of these requests.

### Funding requests for enabling activities

30. On behalf of 11 Article 5 countries, implementing agencies submitted 13 funding requests for enabling activities (i.e., three from Africa, two from Latin America and the Caribbean, one from South Asia, three from South East Asia, and two from West Asia). Out of these requests, two are from Article 5 group 2 countries. The requests by Article 5 countries are summarized in Table 1.

#### Secretariat's review

- 31. Each funding request for enabling activities contained a set of activities (that were adjusted according to the requirements of each country), institutional arrangements to support the implementation of the enabling activities, implementation plans and budgets. The Secretariat has recommended blanket approval for all enabling activities, and individual consideration for funding for a preparation of an HFC investment project. A total of US \$1,209,100 (US \$1,130,000, plus agency support cost of US \$79,100) corresponds to funding for Article 5 group 1 countries.
- 32. The Executive Committee may wish to note that if the requests for enabling activities submitted to the 82<sup>nd</sup> meeting are approved, funding of US \$18,815,950 (including agency support costs) would have been approved for 130 Article 5 countries. Only 14 out of 144 Article 5 countries would not have an approved enabling activity (funding for these remaining countries would be no more than US \$2,332,600).
- 33. The Executive Committee may wish to consider the enabling activities for HFC phase-down in line with decisions 81/31(a)(ii)<sup>10</sup> and (iii),<sup>11</sup> as contained in the respective implementing agencies' work programmes under agenda item 9(c).

### Funding requests for stand-alone HFC investment projects

34. On behalf of five Article 5 countries, implementing agencies submitted their funding requests for five fully-developed stand-alone HFC investment projects at a total cost of US \$4,078,573 (excluding support costs), contained in Table 2.

#### Secretariat's review

- 35. The Secretariat reviewed the stand-alone HFC projects using the same approach when reviewing stand-alone investment projects. Three of the five projects are for the domestic and/or commercial refrigeration sector and related to the conversion from HFC-134a and/or R-404A to isobutane (R-600a) or propane (R-290). Two projects are for the PU foam sector, one for the conversion of cyclopentane/HFC-245fa to cyclopentane/HFO-1233zd(E) as insulation foam in domestic refrigerators and the other for conversion from HFC-134a in PU foam manufacturing to HCO/HFO. Two of the proposals are from the Asian region, two from Africa and one from the Latin America. None of the countries included have previously received approval of funds for HFC investment projects.
- 36. Given the balance of additional contributions available for programming at the 82<sup>nd</sup> meeting of US \$2,408,771, and the US \$1,209,100 (including support costs) requested for enabling activities by Article 5 group 1 countries, there is a balance of US \$1,199,671 from additional contributions available for HFC investment projects.

#### Secretariat's recommendation

37. The Executive Committee may wish to consider each of the funding requests for HFC-related investment projects under agenda item (9)(f) "Investment projects" and also to consider, during its deliberation, the funding source for each project either from the regular contributions or from the balances

remaining from the additional voluntary contributions provided by a group of non-Article 5 Parties, after giving priority to the enabling activities submitted to the 82<sup>nd</sup> meeting.

# Projects and activities submitted for blanket approval

38. Annex I to the present document lists 137 projects and activities totalling US \$13,343,835, including agency support costs, that are recommended for blanket approval. The approval of these projects would include the relevant conditions or provisions in the corresponding project evaluation sheets as well as the approval of implementation programmes associated with the relevant tranches of multi-year projects.

### **Investment projects for individual consideration**

39. Thirty-two projects/activities totalling US \$85,373,891, including agency support costs, of which US \$31,395,787 is for the third tranche of stage II of the HPMP for China (US \$88,751,691 including amount requested in principle), and five HFC-related projects and activities totalling US \$2,483,470<sup>12</sup> including agency support costs, after the review by the Secretariat, are proposed for individual consideration. To facilitate the Executive Committee's consideration of the investment projects for individual consideration, the Secretariat has classified the projects by sector, and has grouped them according to the issues, as shown in Table 3. Table 3 also includes a section on individual investment projects to phase out HFCs as per decision 78/3(g).
