REPORT ON BALANCES AND AVAILABILITY OF RESOURCES

Introduction

1. This document presents a summary of the financial adjustments indicated by the bilateral and implementing agencies as agreed by the Fund Secretariat. The document includes statistical data, as required by decisions 28/7 and 56/2, from projects for bilateral and implementing agencies with balances that have been held for over the allowable 12-month period following completion of the project. The data presented are based on the reporting format that has been developed pursuant to decision 31/2 and include both obligated and un-obligated balances. Further to decision 41/92(b), this document also indicates the level of resources available to the Executive Committee in cash and promissory notes as recorded in the Status of contributions and disbursements (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/64/3). The total funds to be returned addressed in this report amount to US \$1,452,449 including support costs, which constitutes the amount of US \$1,428,713 returned by Implementing Agencies (IAs) and US \$23,736 return from bilateral agencies. The amount of US \$1,428,713 is a net return from IAs to the Fund in addition to the amount of US \$46,931 to be transferred from UNDP to UNIDO.

Funds being returned to the 64th meeting by Implementing Agencies

2. Information provided by the IAs indicates that a total of US \$976,400 excluding agency support costs will be returned to the 64th meeting, as set out in Table 1.

3. Table 1 shows that UNDP will return to the Fund US \$538,420 in project costs including the balance return of the project in Argentina (ARG/PHA/55/PRP/157) in accordance with decision 63/5(i), and that US \$403,062 and US \$34,918 will be returned from completed projects by UNEP and UNIDO respectively.

Projects with balances by year of completion

4. Table 2 presents the number of projects with balances that are still being held by the IAs and the years in which those projects were completed. It shows that for projects completed up to and including 31 May 2010 (at least over the last 12 months), IAs had balances that totalled US \$3,838,325 excluding support costs.

- 5. At its 47th meeting, the Executive Committee requested the Fund Secretariat to continue to monitor multi-year annual tranches in the context of documents on implementation delays and project balances (decision 47/50(b)(ii)).
- 6. UNDP holds the highest level of balances with US \$1,250,496 of which US \$370,234 is attributable to the multi-year agreement (MYA). It also has the highest number of projects with balances (52) followed by UNIDO (32), UNEP (18) and the World Bank (4). The World Bank reported a balance of US \$1,189,821 of which the whole amount is attributable to MYA annual tranches. UNEP holds a total balance of US \$387,486 of which the amount of US \$6,000 is attributable to MYA. UNIDO holds a total balance of US \$1,010,522 of which US \$793,463 is attributable to the MYA.
- 7. All agencies have projects that were completed over two years ago and have remaining balances. Approximately thirty-six per cent of the funds (US \$656,321 out of US \$1,804,588) are attributed to World Bank's two reported projects that were completed over two years ago. UNDP has the largest number of projects (30) that were completed over two years ago, with balances totalling US \$333,721 followed by UNIDO with 13 projects totalling US \$546,436 and UNEP with 12 projects totalling US \$268,110.
- 8. UNDP's number of projects completed over two years ago decreased from 55 to 30 projects. In its explanation on why balances of US \$333,721 are still obligated for projects completed over two years ago, UNDP has reported that it reviewed the balance report with a focus on the longest out standing obligated amounts. As a result of this review, UNDP is returning to the 64th meeting all outstanding balances under projects completed from 2003 to 2005. In addition UNDP is returning to the 64th meeting balances some completed and closed projects in 2006 and 2007. UNDP is still holding balances on 5 projects completed in 2006 and 9 projects completed in 2007. The total amount of balances on UNDP projects has decreased from US \$886,174 to US \$333,721.
- 9. To the query from the Secretariat on why remaining balances on projects completed over 2 years ago are not returned to the Fund, UNDP maintained the explanation provided in the past meetings, that balances over 2 years are considered still obligated because the financial procedures of UNDP require that a final budget revision is issued to mark the formal closure of a project between UNDP and the executing agency and to close the project in UNDP systems. Until this step is taken the executing agency is considered to have access to these funds and therefore these are considered obligated.
- The number of projects for UNEP completed over two years ago shows a decrease from 58 to 12. By decision 63/2(f) the Executive Committee decided to request UNEP to justify obligated balances for projects completed over two years previously at the 64th meeting. UNEP's report on completed projects with balances to the 64th meeting shows that its balance of projects completed over two years ago decreased substantively from US \$1,124,885 to US \$268,110. Of the US \$268,110 balance against projects completed 2 years ago, US \$116,953 relates to 3 institutional strengthening (IS) projects. In its submission to the 64th meeting, UNEP indicated that it was following up with the individual National Ozone Units (NOUs) in order to financially complete the remaining projects completed over two years. There are 12 UNEP projects that are still pending financial completion. In this regard UNEP explained that the balance of US \$185,871 relates to cash advances already paid by UNEP. For these projects all the relevant financial and inventory reports need to be received by UNEP for them to be recorded as disbursements. UNEP indicated that it would discuss with the respective NOUs or relevant officials during missions to the countries as well as network meetings to further expedite the process. In addition UNEP reported that US \$24,866 relates to a balance of funds from the project in Myanmar (MYA/REF/29/PRP/03) as per decisions 55/24 and 56/70 and that this reported balance is already being used for implementation of its Terminal Phase-out Management Plan. UNEP also explained that the balance of US \$9,000 from the project in Haiti (HAI/HAL/50/TAS/10) will be used in 2011 to conduct workshops to assist the rebuilding process in the country. UNEP's report on balances on completed projects to the

- 64th meeting reveals that UNEP has made sufficient effort to return balances on completed projects over two years ago.
- 11. The balance held by UNIDO for projects completed over two years ago has decreased since the 63rd meeting of the Executive Committee from US \$634,543 to US \$546,436 and the number of projects decreased from 21 projects to 13. UNIDO drew the Secretariat's attention to the progress it made regarding the return of balances for projects completed over two years ago since the last meeting and indicated to the Secretariat that there remain 13 projects on the list of projects with balances for projects completed over two years ago at the 64th meeting of the Executive Committee. Of these 13 projects, 8 are MYAs and 5 still have balances remaining. UNIDO advised the Secretariat that it would continue to further reduce the balance on completed projects with strong emphasis on projects completed over two years ago.
- 12. The World Bank's overall number of projects with balances completed over two years ago remain unchanged at 2 projects, and the amount of balance at US \$656,321 reported at the last meeting.

Obligated and un-obligated balances

13. The level of balances classified as obligated and un-obligated for the four implementing agencies is as follows:

- 14. Of the total of US \$3,838,325 from completed projects, US \$3,554,870 is obligated (which means that these funds are expected to be spent) and US \$283,455 has not been obligated. Implementing agencies are required to report reasons why any un-obligated balances could not be returned within the required time-frame, and to indicate when they will be returned as per decision 31/2(a)(ii).
- 15. UNDP has no un-obligated balances. As a follow-up to decision 63/2(e) requesting UNDP to follow-up on clearing the obligated balances and to report progress made on the financially closed projects by the 64th meeting, UNDP reported a significant decrease in balances on completed projects. Its overall number of projects with balances shows a decrease from 90 projects reported to the 63rd meeting to 52 reported to the 64th meeting. The overall level of obligated balances has decreased from US \$2,873,077 to US \$1,250,496. UNDP's obligated balance of US \$1,250,496 includes US \$370,234 for 15 MYAs. In addition, the Secretariat advised UNDP, in accordance with decision 63/5(g), which calls for the removal of the HPMP activities in Gambia (the) from UNDP, to return the balance of the project in Gambia (the) (GAM/PHA/55/PRP/20). This project had been operationally completed in December 2010 and the balance has been obligated because funds previously advanced to the government are pending as receivables which need to be cleared before the project can be financially closed.

- 16. UNEP has 18 completed projects, and holds US \$387,486 in obligated amounts and has no un-obligated balances. The overall number of projects with balances has decreased from 83 projects reported to the 63rd meeting to 18 reported to the 64th meeting. The overall level of balances decreased from US \$1.85 million to US \$387,486.
- 17. As a follow-up to decision 63/2(f) requesting UNEP to justify obligated balances for projects completed over two years previously at the 64th meeting, UNEP advised the Secretariat that reports are being finalized to facilitate disbursements of balances on completed projects. In response to the Secretariat's query to clarify why obligated balances for the purpose of purchasing equipment under completed projects were needed, UNEP clarified that the process to acquire equipment had been completed and final payments were pending recording in the accounts. In addition the agency clarified that some of the payments were done through UNDP country offices for which the inter office charges are pending receipt and recording into the UNEP accounts. The Secretariat found UNEP explanation on obligated amounts for equipment payment acceptable.
- 18. UNIDO has 32 completed projects, and holds US \$727,067 in obligated and US \$283,455 in un-obligated balances. The overall number of projects with balances has decreased from 43 projects reported to the 63rd meeting to 32 reported to the 64th meeting, and the overall level of balances has decreased from US \$1.09 million to US \$1.01 million. Out of the 32 projects, 17 are MYAs with US \$580,130 in obligated and US \$213,333 in un-obligated balances.
- 19. UNIDO's effort in returning balances on projects completed is noticeable however the agency remains the only agency with un-obligated balances not returned to the Fund. As a general policy the Secretariat considers that all un-obligated balances should be returned to the Fund and recommends that UNIDO expedite the financial completion of projects with obligated and un-obligated balances for projects completed two years earlier with a view to returning the funds. Alternatively the Secretariat is of the view that UNIDO should be liquidating obligations to determine whether un-obligated balances are needed to finalize the financial closure of the project.
- 20. In its response UNIDO quoted the relevant clauses in the 1992 Agreement between the Executive Committee and UNIDO whereby "Notwithstanding the completion of the projects financed from the Special Account, UNIDO shall continue to hold unutilized contribution-payments until all commitments and liabilities incurred in implementation of the projects have been satisfied and project activities brought to an orderly conclusion." UNIDO explained that in line with the Agreement, and in order to avoid financial risk of over-expenditure under any project, the un-obligated balances shall remain available to UNIDO until all expenditures incurred by UNIDO have been satisfied, i.e. the financial completion of projects. The Secretariat reminded UNIDO of decision 31/2 (a)(i) and (ii) that (i) "Implementing agencies should return remaining un-obligated (unencumbered) balances as soon as possible, but not later than one year following project completion, with the amount returned specified by project; and (ii) Implementing agencies should report on the reasons why any un-obligated (unencumbered) balances could not be returned within the required time-frame and when they would be returned." The return of UNIDO's un-obligated balances is therefore long overdue.
- 21. The World Bank has no un-obligated balances, and holds US \$1,189,821 in obligated balances for completed projects, all of which are for MYAs. The World Bank explained that these obligated balances are attributed to the annual programmes of MYAs for the Philippines (PHI/PHA/38/INV/69, PHI/PHA/41/INV/71) and China (CPR/FOA/56/INV/478), (CPR/HAL/56/INV/481).

Agency support costs

22. At its 35th meeting, the Executive Committee requested implementing agencies to return all agency support costs associated with remaining funds from completed projects. If expenditures had

been incurred from these costs, the IAs should provide an explanation and return the balance of funds (decision 35/13(k)). Table 4 indicates that a total of US \$499,244 in agency support costs will be returned at the 64th meeting. This amount includes the World Banks' return of US \$390,706 against its 2010 core unit cost and UNDP's return of the balance of the project in Argentina (ARG/PHA/55/PRP/157) (decision 63/5(i)).

Funds being returned to the 64th meeting from bilateral agencies

23. By decision 56/2 bilateral agencies were requested to report to the Executive Committee in their proposed disposition on balances from completed projects. Table 5 provides the feedback received on returns of balances from projects completed from the Government of Canada. It indicates that a total US \$23,736 comprising project costs and agency support costs will be returned to the 64th meeting.

24. The Government of Canada has advised the Secretariat of its intent to return in cash the balance of US \$23,736 at the 64th meeting for three projects; Burkina Faso: (BKF/PHA/54/INV/24), Saint Lucia: (STL/PHA/52/INV/12) and Uruguay: (URU/PHA/50/TAS/47). Annex II of this document provides detailed information on the returned amounts by bilateral agencies.

Bilateral projects with balances by year of completion

25. Table 6 presents the balances that are being held by bilateral agencies and the years in which those projects were completed. It shows that for projects completed up to and including 31 May 2010 (at least over the last 12 months) bilateral agencies had balances totalling US \$165,798 including support costs. France and Japan hold balances for project completed over two years ago.

26. The Government of France advised the Secretariat that it will not return the balance on completed projects to the 64th meeting. The Government of Japan also informed the Secretariat that it would not be returning any funds at the 64th meeting and would be using the unspent balance for future projects.

SECRETARIAT'S COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

COMMENTS

- 27. Annex I presents additional information on obligated and un-obligated balances by agency. Of the US \$3.8 million in projects with balances in this report, about US \$2.3 million is for MYAs. UNDP being the agency with the largest amount of balances, with US \$1,250,496 in obligated balances followed by the World Bank with US \$1,189,821, UNIDO with US \$1,010,522 and UNEP with US \$387,486. The balance on projects completed over 2 years ago withheld by Agencies amounts to US \$1,804,588. With the exception of UNIDO, all the agencies have cleared their un-obligated balances. All bilateral agencies have returned balances on completed projects; with only France and Japan remaining with one completed project with balance each.
- 28. The status of contributions and disbursements as of 3 June 2011 indicates that the Treasurer has an available balance amounting to US \$148,146,657 in cash and promissory notes. The total net balance returned by implementing agencies including agency support costs is US \$1,428,713. The total level of resources available for approvals by the Executive Committee at its 64th meeting, after taking into account the Fund balance as contained in document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/64/3 and the total amount returned by implementing agencies, is US \$149,575,370.
- 29. Considering the total level of funding for projects and activities being considered by the Executive Committee as at 8 June 2011 amounting to US \$174.8 million including support cost there are insufficient resources available for approvals at the 64th meeting.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 30. The Executive Committee may wish:
 - (a) To note the report on balances and availability of resources contained in document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/64/4;
 - (b) To note that the net level of funds being returned by the implementing agencies to the 64th meeting was US \$976,400 against projects, which included the return of US \$538,420 from UNDP, US \$403,062 from UNEP, and US \$34,918 from UNIDO;
 - (c) To note that the net level of support costs, being returned by the implementing agencies to the 64th meeting was US \$499,244 against projects, which included the return of US \$58,920 from UNDP, US \$46,538 from UNEP, US \$3,080 from UNIDO and US \$390,706 from the World Bank;
 - (d) To note that implementing agencies had balances totalling US \$1,804,588 excluding support costs, from projects completed over two years previously, which included US \$333,721 for UNDP, US \$268,110 for UNEP, US \$546,436 for UNIDO, and US \$656,321 for the World Bank;
 - (e) To note that bilateral agencies had balances totalling US \$139,340 excluding support costs from projects completed over two years attributed to France and Japan;
 - (f) To note the net level of funds and support costs being returned by the Canada to the 64th meeting is US \$23,736;
 - (g) To approve the transfer of the Preparation of the HCFC phase-out management plan in Argentina (ARG/PHA/55/PRP/157) from UNDP to UNIDO, in accordance with decision 63/5(i) at the amount of US \$43,657 in project cost plus US \$3,274 in support cost:
 - (h) To reiterate decision 31/2 (a)(i) and (ii) and request UNIDO to update the Committee at the 64th meeting on the date at which the remaining un-obligated balances on completed projects would be returned in full.
