Corrigendum 2000 WORK PROGRAMME AMENDMENTS OF UNEP

- Page 1: *Replace* with the attached.
- Page 2, sub-heading above para 5, items (b), Congo and (i), Paraguay: *Replace* US \$47,400 *with* US \$41,527 and US \$44,200 *with* \$44,740.
- Page 13, para 61: *Replace* the paragraph with the following:
 - 61. The Fund Secretariat also requested an explanation for the request of two recovery units and ancillary equipment in light of the small amount of CFCs used in the country. UNEP indicated that the two units would be required for the implementation of the training programmes. UNEP also informed the Secretariat that ODS identification kits were not included in the original project submitted to the 32nd Meeting, and therefore, requested the cost of the project to be adjusted (from US \$46,500 to US \$53,500).
- Page 2, Annex I, line 4 of table relating to Congo:
 Replace the amount requested for renewal of institutional strengthening (US \$47,400)
 with US \$41,527.
- Page 3, Annex I, line 4 of table relating to El Salvador:
 Replace the amount requested for renewal of institutional strengthening (US \$66,900)
 with US \$44,600.
- Page 9, Annex I, line 4 of table relating to Paraguay:
 Replace the amount requested for renewal of institutional strengthening (US \$44,200)
 with US \$44,740.

- 1. UNEP is requesting approval from the Executive Committee for US \$2,045,780 as amendments to its 2000 Work Programme (approved at the 29th Meeting) with agency support costs of US \$265,951.
