## Corrigendum

## REPORT ON THE EXTENDED DESK STUDY ON CLEARING HOUSE EVALUATION

This corrigendum is issued to:

• <u>Delete</u> paragraph 11 and <u>replace</u> paragraph 25 and 26 by the following:

25. Out of the 617 projects approved for UNEP, 141 projects with a value of US\$ 14,532,100 are for clearing house activities as defined by Decision 21/14. This excludes the single "CAP project", which is a special case as it is not sub-divided according to clearinghouse activities and non-clearinghouse activities. Clearinghouse projects represent 26% of all funding approved so far for projects to be implemented by UNEP or 1.28% of all Multilateral Fund approvals to date. The majority of the clearing house projects are in the "Global" category. With one exception (Philippines Information Exchange project), the others are for methyl bromide awareness projects in specific countries. The projects consist of the following categories:
