BUSINESS PLAN FOR THE YEAR 2002 OF UNIDO

COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE FUND SECRETARIAT

COMMENTS

1. This document presents a summary of planned activities in, and highlights the changes made to, the draft business plan of UNIDO for 2002 considered at the 35th Meeting, lists UNIDO's business plan performance indicators, and provides recommendations for the consideration of the Sub-Committee on Monitoring, Evaluation, and Finance.

Planned 2002 activities of UNIDO

2. The total value of investment projects currently proposed to be submitted by UNIDO in 2002 is US \$35.24 million including 15 per cent over-programming and agency support cost for the phase out of 2,918 ODP tonnes. The cost of preparing these projects amounts to US \$2.428 million (including an expected US \$399,000 carryover from 2001 project preparation approvals and US \$153,000 for project preparation for contingency projects).

3. The largest amount of funding, excluding agency fees, is targeted for the refrigeration sector (US \$10.39 million) followed by the fumigation sector (US \$6.93 million).

4. UNIDO is expected to submit requests for US \$700,600, including agency fees, for non-investment activities in 2002 for 6 non-investment projects including one country programme update at a cost of US \$67,800, one RMP project at a cost of US \$113,000, one technical assistance project at a cost of US \$339,000, and 3 training projects at a cost of US \$180,800.

5. UNIDO's contingency list (Table 5), contains projects valued at US \$4.872 million including agency fees in 8 countries: Algeria, India, Indonesia, Kenya, Morocco, Nigeria, Pakistan and Zimbabwe. These projects would replace projects that UNIDO identified as having policy issues. UNIDO identified the following projects with policy issues: Domestic, refrigeration and compressor manufacturing sector phase-out plan in China; MDI sector projects in China, India, Iran and Romania; a fumigation sector project in the Dominican Republic and Honduras; a process agent project in Indonesia; an extruded foam project in Syria; and solvent sector project in Turkey.

Changes from the Draft Business Plan

6. After reviewing UNIDO's business plan, the Executive Committee requested UNIDO to finalise its business plan based on the draft business plan in the light of Decision 35/6.

7. The Executive Committee requested UNIDO to take into account the comments in document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/35/9 concerning planned activities in Egypt, Kenya, and Oman when finalizing its 2002 business plan.

8. Concerning Egypt, the Secretariat noted in its comments on UNIDO's draft business plan that Egypt had received funds through a German project for customs training and UNIDO responded that Germany and Egypt had indicated that the German project did not contain customs training. UNIDO addressed this issue by increasing the amount for customs training in Egypt from US \$60,000 in the draft business plan to US \$100,000 in its final business plan.

9. Concerning the other requests, UNIDO removed the US \$1 million end user project for Kenya and the halon bank for Oman that were included in its draft business plan.

10. The Executive Committee also requested UNIDO to indicate in its final business plan the actions it would take to expedite the implementation of approved projects and those that could be critical to compliance (Decision 35/6(b)(iv)). UNIDO did not specifically address this part of the decision in its final business plan. The Executive Committee may wish to request UNIDO to report to the meeting on these actions or, if it decides to request all implementing agencies to submit addenda to their 2002 final business plans, requests UNIDO to include a report on Decision 35/6(b)(iv) in its addendum.

11. The Executive Committee also requested UNIDO to ensure that the projects included for the methyl bromide sector were consistent with the Multilateral Fund's guidelines for that sector when finalising its 2002 business plan. UNIDO has maintained methyl bromide activities in its investment allocation for Honduras that has not ratified the Copenhagen Amendment. Moreover, UNIDO included in its non-investment allocation the preparation of a sector strategy for methyl bromide for China. As of this writing, China has not ratified the Copenhagen Amendment. UNIDO has also included a methyl bromide awareness project for Mali, which hosted the methyl bromide regional workshop for French-speaking Africa. Although not a requirement for noninvestment activities, Mali has not ratified the Copenhagen Amendment as of this writing.

12. The Executive Committee requested all agencies to reach out to those countries at risk of non-compliance to provide proposals for activities to be included in the agencies' final business plans (Decision 35/2(i)). UNIDO removed projects for Kenya, Oman, and Panama, all countries at risk for the initial control measures due to conflicts with bilateral and other implementing agencies.

13. With the exception of a CTC project in Korea DPR and a CTC/TCA project in Turkey, UNIDO did not add any projects for countries that appear to be at risk. The following projects were added for countries that do not appear to be at risk of not achieving the control measures through 2005:

- 3 aerosol projects in Algeria valued at US \$440,000 with US \$25,000 in project preparation and an additional 5 projects to be submitted after 2002.
- An RMP implementation project in Algeria to be submitted after 2002 with project preparation of US \$70,000.
- An RMP preparation project for Argentina of US \$100,000.
- A domestic refrigeration and compressor sector phase out plan with a first tranche valued at US \$2.5 million (US \$16.5 million total) with US \$70,000 for preparation. In the context of its consideration of the Report on Evaluation of Completed Compressor Projects in China, the 34th Meeting decided future

proposals for the domestic and commercial refrigeration compressor sectors would be considered <u>inter alia</u> in light of the Government of China's assessment of its additional need for non CFC domestic and commercial refrigeration compressors (Decision 34/13).

- An MDI phase-out plan in China with US \$75,000 for preparation. No value has been provided for the project.
- An umbrella commercial refrigeration project in India valued at US \$900,000 with US \$30,000 in project preparation.
- 3 rigid and integral skin foam projects in Indonesia valued at US \$700,000 with US \$20,000 in project preparation
- A solvent sector phase out plan in Nigeria valued at US \$2 million to be delivered in 2003 with project preparation from 2002 of US \$70,000.

Other changes since the draft business plan

14. UNIDO replaced individual project submissions with sector and/or substance phase out projects in the following cases:

- 6 refrigeration projects in Algeria valued at US \$300,000 with US \$20,000 in project preparation were replaced with a refrigeration sector phase out plan of the same value with US \$50,000 in project preparation
- 5 domestic refrigeration projects in China valued at US \$4 million with US \$40,000 in project preparation were replaced with a domestic refrigeration and compressor sector phase out plan with a first tranche valued at US \$2.5 million (US \$16.5 million total) with US \$70,000 for preparation.

15. UNIDO also added a country programme update for Romania (US \$60,000) and the expected disbursement in 2002 for the terminal umbrella project for China's extruded polystyrene/polyethylene foam subsector, the latter of which was approved at the 35th Meeting.

Data Discrepancies

16. Decision 35/2(b) requested agencies to resolve data discrepancies before including projects in the final business plans. Data discrepancies can be of two types: those based on the remaining sectoral consumption and those based on remaining consumption on a substance basis. Concerning those with a discrepancy on a sector level, the Secretariat advised agencies to ensure that the country concerned was aware of the discrepancy but still wanted the projects put forward in the context of their remaining funding eligibility per Decision 35/57 because all of the countries concerned had significant levels of fundable CFC consumption.

17. UNIDO did not indicate if the countries have confirmed this understanding for the following countries and sectors with data discrepancies: Argentina (refrigeration), India

(refrigeration and solvent sectors), Indonesia (foam sector), Mexico (refrigeration sector), Syria (foam and refrigeration sectors), and Yemen (refrigeration manufacturing). UNIDO indicated that Argentina, India, Indonesia, and Syria were in the process of revising/reconciling their sectoral consumption data. It noted the Secretariat's comments about Yemen.

Potential overlaps with other agencies' business plans

18. The Secretariat identified several potential overlaps between bilateral and implementing agencies' business plans. For example, UNIDO is developing a MDI project in India while UNDP is developing an aerosol terminal phase out plan. In Iran, UNIDO is planning a foam umbrella project in Iran while Germany and UNDP are planning other foam activities. Also in Iran, Japan is planning a refrigeration sector project as is UNIDO while UNDP is planning a terminal refrigeration manufacturing project and France an SME project that could involve both foam and refrigeration sector projects.

19. In Lebanon, UNDP would prepare the country programme update and terminal CFC project for the refrigeration servicing, aerosol and foam sectors while co-ordinating with France, as it implements its ongoing recovery and recycling and a chiller project, and UNIDO, which plans to conduct a terminal umbrella project for the commercial refrigeration sub-sector. In Mexico, UNDP is planning a refrigeration manufacturing sector phase out project while the World Bank is planning to prepare a MAC/compressor project. In Panama, UNIDO is planning a national ODS phase out programme while UNEP plans an RMP update. In Yemen, UNDP and UNEP would formulate the RMP and its implementation while UNIDO would address remaining CFCs in the aerosol and refrigeration manufacturing sectors. UNIDO indicated that there were no overlaps following its co-ordination with the relevant governments and agencies.

Letters

20. The Executive Committee requested UNIDO to provide letters from countries for all activities included in its final business plan for 2002. Annex I includes a list of projects for which the Secretariat was unable to correspond the entry in UNIDO's business plan with the entry in the letter from the country concerned.

Performance indicators

21. A summary of the UNIDO's investment project performance indicators is provided below in Table 1.

22. Decision 35/6(b)(i) requested UNIDO to consider modifying its investment project performance indicator targets for ODP phase-out in 2002, cost-effectiveness, and speed of first disbursement; its non-investment performance indicator targets for speed of first disbursement; and to provide targets for the non-weighted, non-investment project performance indicators, taking into account the consideration by the Sub-Committee on Monitoring, Evaluation and Finance of the report on the performance indicators and proposal on modifications (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/35/16).

23. UNIDO's performance indicators in the final business plan have changed, as follows, from those presented in the draft business plan:

- An increase in the phase out target to 2,836 from 2,500 ODP tonnes despite the fact that this would represent a 32 per cent decrease in the level of phase out indicated in UNIDO's progress report (4,189 ODP tonnes) from completed projects in 2002 as mentioned by the Secretariat in its comments on UNIDO's draft business plan.
- A cost-effectiveness for investment projects of US \$9.37/kg as opposed to the US \$9.12/kg in its draft business plan that UNIDO indicated is necessary due to the fact that national phase out and RMP implementation projects were included without a phase out; however, UNIDO indicated in its business plan that it achieved a cost-effectiveness of US \$7.10/kg in 2001.
- The target for the speed of first disbursement was changed from 12 months in the draft business plan to 10 months in the final business plan.

24. UNIDO provided targets for the two new performance indicators: number of investment projects to be completed in 2002 pursuant to Decision 28/2; and, timely submission of progress reports. UNIDO's target for the former is 35 projects which is higher than the number forecast in its progress report of 30 projects. UNIDO's target for the latter is "Deadline set by Executive Committee and 2 weeks to respond to Secretariat". It is current practice for the implementing agencies to respond to the Secretariat within five working days. UNIDO's other performance indicator targets were essentially the same as those presented in its draft business plan.

26. The Executive Committee requested UNIDO to reconsider its speed of delivery for non-investment projects in Decision 35/6. UNIDO maintained its draft business plan target which is one month longer than its experience through 2001.

27. In Decision 35/14(b), the Committee requested the agencies to apply the Secretariat's advice in identifying their target for the performance indicator "reduction in ODS consumption over and above that effected by investment projects (ODP tonnes)". The Secretariat advised the agencies to refer to the ODS phase-out indicated for non-investment projects at the time of project approval. UNIDO proposes a phase out from non-investment projects of 69 ODP tonnes as opposed to the 119 ODP tonnes indicated in its progress reports.

Policy issues

28. UNIDO indicated the projects in its business plan that may raise issues including data discrepancies, the absence of confirmation from the UN Depository as to the Copenhagen Amendment ratification by countries that have indicated that they have ratified the Amendment, and the approval of guidelines for the MDI sector.

Multi-year performance-based agreements

29. The Executive Committee has approved 9 multi-year performance agreements for the implementation of UNIDO all of them except the tobacco sector in China are for methyl bromide. The multi-year methyl bromide sector projects are in the following countries are for the total phase out of the sector: Jordan and Macedonia. The other projects are for part of the sector: Lebanon, Morocco, Syria, Turkey, Argentina, Chile, and Zimbabwe.

30. UNIDO plans on submitting new multi-year performance agreements in 2002 for the following countries and sectors: Algeria (aerosol, RMP, refrigeration), China (domestic refrigeration and compressor manufacturing), Dominican Republic (methyl bromide--soil fumigation), Egypt (methyl bromide—grain and soil), Guatemala (methyl bromide--soil fumigation), Iran (RMP), Lebanon (commercial and domestic refrigeration), Mexico (RMP and refrigeration), Pakistan (RMP). These tranches are accommodated in UNIDO's 2002 allocation.

31. UNIDO plans on submitting additional multi-year performance agreements in 2003 for the following countries and sectors: Albania (ODS), Bosnia & Herzegovina (ODS), Cameroon (ODS), China (MDIs), Egypt (ODS), India (MDIs), Indonesia (process agents), Iran (MDIs), Mexico (CFC production and solvents), Nigeria (solvents), Romania (MDIs), Syria (ODS), Turkey (solvents), Venezuela (ODS).

32. The implementing agencies were requested to identify the value of multi-year performance based agreements for 2003 and the balance until 2010. UNIDO provided estimates for all activities except for MDI, process agent and the solvent sector in Turkey. Excluding those activities for which estimates were not provided, based on the data provided by UNIDO for the 2003 tranche of planned agreements and the 2003 tranches for approved agreements, the total value of the 2003 tranche for approved and planned agreements would amount to US \$17.8 million, which represents 55 per cent of UNIDO's 2002 investment project share.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Fund Secretariat recommends that the Monitoring, Evaluation, and Finance Sub-Committee consider:

- 1. Recommending to the Executive Committee to endorse the 2002 business plan of the UNIDO, as contained in UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/36/12, while noting that endorsement did not denote approval of the projects identified therein nor their funding levels with any modifications based on the consideration of data discrepancies, project overlaps and activities without letters of support from the Article 5 countries concerned.
- 2. In light of its recommendation on the consolidated 2002 business plan, recommending to the Executive Committee to request UNIDO to indicate in the addendum to its 2002 business plan that it is to submit to the 37th Meeting, the actions it would take to expedite the implementation of approved projects and those critical to compliance.
- 3. Recommending to the Executive Committee to approve the performance indicators for UNIDO set out in Tables 1 and 2 of the Fund Secretariat's comments with modifications to the indicator for ODP phase-out in 2002, the ODP phase out from non-investment projects and timely submission of progress reports as indicated in this document.

UNIDO BUSINESS PLAN 2002

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The UNIDO 2002 Business Plan was prepared based on the requests received from Article 5 countries and taking into account the priorities established by the Executive Committee as well as decisions taken by this same body. It also reflects the discussions held in Montreal, during the Inter-agency Coordination Meeting, whereby an analysis of the compliance situation (freeze and reduction targets) provided valuable information on certain Article 5 countries in dire need of assistance. The Business Plan takes into consideration the recent developments related to strategic planning, particularly the concept of a national ODS phase-out plan. Indeed, this new approach decided by the Executive Committee on a trial basis already in 1999, and confirmed by the approval of the last meeting of four national phase-out plans, has served as a basis for our discussions with some Article 5 countries.

As a result, six (6) countries have agreed on this new approach and thus, UNIDO is proposing the preparation of national phase-out plans. In addition, fourteen (14) countries have agreed for the preparation of sectoral phase-out plans in the MDI, methyl bromide, refrigeration, solvents and process agents sectors.

These phase-out plans will include a careful review of the Country Programme, the ongoing activities and the remaining consumption of ozone depleting substances, as well as the identification of activities that will allow a terminal phaseout and finally the phase-out schedule and financial means required.

In the meantime, and in order not to disrupt activities already planned for 2002, UNIDO will prepare fifty-four (54) projects for an estimated budget of US\$35,240,000 (including support cost and 15 per cent over-programming).

Specifically, this programme will include nineteen (19) projects in the refrigeration sector (including RMPs activities namely training of trainers, training of customs officers, etc.), eight (8) projects in the foam sector, ten (10) projects in the methyl bromide sector (including second tranches for four (4) multi-year projects already approved), six (6) projects in the solvents sector, four (4) projects in the process agent sector, five (5) projects in the aerosol sector, one (1) project in the halon sector, and, finally, one (1) project classified as other.

In addition, two (2) awareness workshops in the methyl bromide sector are planned in order to prevent the re-introduction of methyl bromide, one (1) country programme updates and a phase-out strategy in the methyl bromide sector. Finally, ODS phase-out plans will be prepared in six (6) countries, and sectoral phase-out plans in fourteen (14) countries. These plans are expected to be ready for submission between July and December 2003, or possibly earlier.

The budget estimated for the non-investment activities is US\$701,000 (including support cost).

 This Business Plan, after careful review of all the data available on Article 5 countries, has the aim to reflect this need for compliance, as well as the need to keep the momentum in certain countries well advanced in their respective phase-out programmes.

The analysis of the investment project portfolio proposed in this Business Plan shows (see Annex A) that in average 73 % of the projects in various sectors will be carried out in countries which are facing difficulties in reaching either their 1999 freeze or/and their 2005 reduction target.

In order to eventually replace projects with policy issues, UNIDO will prepare seventeen (17) projects for a value of US\$ 4,872,000 (including support costs and 15 per cent overprogramming) and an ODP phase-out of 287.8 tonnes.

BUSINESS PLAN NARRATIVE

A. Multilateral Fund targets

1. Introduction

In 2002, fifty-four (54) investment projects will be prepared for a value of US\$35,240,000 (including support costs and 15 per cent over-programming), phasing out 2,917 ODP tonnes.

In addition, seventeen (17) projects will be prepared and be in reserve for submission for a value of US\$4,872,000 (including support costs and 15 per cent overprogramming) and an ODP of 287.8 tonnes.

UNIDO will also include in its Business Plan funding for the second tranches for multi-year methyl bromide projects in Lebanon, Morocco, Syria and Turkey while keeping on using the partial funding concept for new projects in the Dominican Republic, Egypt, Guatemala and Honduras.

In addition, six (6) national phase-out plans and fourteen (14) sectoral plans will be initiated serving as a basis for the preparation of future Business Plans.

Finally it is worth to note that UNIDO has received requests from China, India, Iran and Romania to initiate the preparation of phase-out projects in the metered dose inhalers (MDI) sector.

3. Geographical distribution

In 2002, UNIDO will again cover all the regions (Latin America and the Caribbean, Africa, Asia and Pacific, Europe) with planned activities in various sectors for thirty-three (33) countries (including non-investment activities and contingency list).

4. **Programme expansion**

a. Background

At an inter-agency coordination meeting held in Montreal in September 2001, it was agreed that the Business Plan should be prepared based on requests received from ozone offices in Article 5 countries, and the analysis presented by the Multilateral Fund Secretariat on the status of compliance of the respective countries.

This analysis tried to identify a group of countries in need of immediate assistance in order to comply with the various phase-out schedules (CFCs, Halons, CTC, Methyl Bromide, etc.), as well as countries that are well advanced in their respective phase-out programmes.

In that respect, requests have been jointly reviewed by the Agencies and the Multilateral Fund Secretariat, and whenever it was felt that additional activities could be included, Agencies agreed to alert Ozone Officers in order to have a better coverage of the effective needs.

Therefore, this Business Plan was prepared taking into account these elements, and bearing in mind the usefulness of including activities for countries in compliance in order to keep the momentum.

It is also worth to note that, in consultation with the Multilateral Fund Secretariat, it was agreed that funds for project preparation in a new sector, i.e. the MDI sector, could be requested.

b. Project preparation of investment projects

Annexes II, III and IV indicate that 54 projects in eight (8) sectors, estimated at a value of US\$35,240,000 (including 15% over-programming, including support costs) for an ODP of 2,917.8 tonnes, are foreseen for submission in 2002. In addition, 17 projects for a value of US\$4,872,000 and an ODP of 287.8 tonnes will be kept in reserve in order to replace projects with policy issues.

This Business Plan shows the following main points:

- The refrigeration sector is still a predominant sector, including refrigerant management plans.
- A significant decrease in the foam and aerosol sectors.
- A progressive increase in the methyl bromide sector.
- One emerging new sector, i.e. the MDI sector with four requests for a programme development.
- The preparation of the first UNIDO project in the production sector.
- The preparation of national ODS phase-out plan as well as sectoral phase-out plan.

This Business Plan has the objective to assist Article 5 countries in meeting their obligations under the Montreal Protocol, by suggesting phase-out projects as well as technical assistance activities. It is expected that tonnages to be eliminated will at least coincide with the forthcoming targets of 2005 for CFCs, Halons, CTC and Methyl Bromide while helping a group of countries to maintain the momentum in their phase-out efforts.

Africa

In Africa, 11 projects in six (6) countries, with a value of US\$4,047,000 and an ODP of 395.9 tonnes will be submitted in 2002. In addition, two (2) national phase-out plans and three (3) sectoral plans will be prepared.

An amount of US\$320,000 is requested for the development of these activities.

Asia

In Asia, twenty-nine (29) projects in ten (10) countries, with a value of US\$20,367,000 and an ODP of 1,949.9 tonnes will be submitted in 2002. In addition, one (1) national phase-out plan and four (4) sectoral plans will be prepared.

An amount of US\$665,000 is requested for the development of these activities.

Europe

In Europe, seven (7) projects in seven (7) countries, with a value of US\$2,180,000 and an ODP of 178 tonnes will be submitted in 2002. In addition, two (2) national phase-out plans and three (3) sectoral plans will be prepared.

An amount of US\$260,000 is requested for the development of these activities.

Latin America and the Caribbean

In Latin America and the Caribbean, seven (7) projects in six (6) countries, with a value of US\$4,870,000 and an ODP of 394 tonnes. In addition, one (1) national phase out plan and four (4) sectoral plans will be prepared.

An amount of US\$415,000 is requested for the development of these activities.

c. Non-investment projects

In 2002, UNIDO is planning the organization of two (2) awareness workshops in order to prevent the use or reintroduction of methyl bromide in Mali and Panama, the preparation of a phase-out strategy in the methyl bromide sector in China, one (1) Country Program update for Romania, one (1) strategy for the preparation of a Refrigerant Management Plan in Argentina and one (1) training of customs officers in Egypt.

The total amount requested for these activities is estimated to US\$701,000 including support costs.

The cost effectiveness of project submission (US\$/kg ODP) is expected to be higher than in the previous year. The projects will be submitted in line with the Article 5 countries' demand, in accordance with the approved country-driven approach. Accordingly, the sectoral distribution is determined by the request of the countries. The analysis of the projects in this Business Plan shows that sectors with high cost effectiveness (halon, aerosol and foam) are representing a smaller share, whereas the share of projects belonging to sectors with lower cost effectiveness (refrigeration, CTC/TCA solvents, methyl bromide) had to be increased as shown in Annex B. This results in higher cost effectives figures.

D. New initiative

At the last meeting of the Executive Committee, four (4) national phase-out plans have been approved following the preparation of phase-out strategies approved in 1999 and 2000 on a trial basis.


Since this approach seems to be favoured by certain Article 5 countries and is welcomed by the Executive Committee, UNIDO took the endeavour to suggest it to a number of Article 5 countries, by explaining the objectives to be achieved and the new implementation modalities to be put in place. As a result of such discussions, six (6) Article 5 countries have accepted the preparation of national ODS phase-out plans and fourteen (14) countries the sectoral phase-out plans.


These phase-out plans will include a careful review of the latest ODS consumption in all sectors (based on country programme update), activities that will help the countries to achieve full compliance with the Montreal Protocol provisions, the phase-out schedule and the financial assistance required from the Multilateral Fund.

UNIDO will make necessary arrangements and adjustments specific to the implementation of national phase-out plans. In doing so, a greater emphasis will be given to further involvement of local experts and institutions.

Finally, UNIDO and UNEP agreed to jointly implement activities identified in national phase-out plans to be prepared by both agencies with the understanding that non-investment activities will be implemented by UNEP, while UNIDO will implement investment activities.
