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EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE MULTILATERAL FUND FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE MONTREAL PROTOCOL Thirty-seventh Meeting Montreal, 17-19 July 2002

SELECTION OF OPTIONS PURSUANT TO DECISION 35/57

Introduction

- 1. The Executive Committee was informed at its 36th Meeting that the Secretariat had requested 93 of the 99 Article 5 countries listed in document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/35/61 and Corr.1 to choose an option for a starting point to determine the remaining national aggregate CFC consumption which would be eligible for funding, and that the other 6 countries (Bahamas, China, Malaysia, Mexico, Thailand and Turkey) are parties to agreements with the Executive Committee determining their remaining consumption.
- 2. To date, 61 countries have responded to the Secretariat's first request and subsequent reminders.
- 3. The responses received are summarized below.

Countries with confirmed starting point

4. Annex I presents the 44 countries that confirmed their starting point based on their choice of one of the two options. The total remaining CFC consumption of these countries as at the 35th Meeting amounts to 15,249.1 ODP tonnes. This annex includes the six countries referred to in paragraph 1 above; however, their remaining consumption is not included in the abovementioned sum.

Countries with unconfirmed starting point

- 5. A total of seven countries have indicated to the Secretariat a preferred option for the determination of their starting points. These countries are listed in Annex II along with their choice of options, as well as a summary of their exchanges with the Secretariat.
- 6. Four (Argentina, Brazil, Costa Rica, India) of the seven countries requested details of the data used to calculate the options, especially data on approved but not implemented projects. India requested that its starting point calculated under option 2 in document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/35/61/Corr.1 should be revised upward. Two countries (Fiji and Samoa) have provisionally selected their starting points. One country (Syria) in selecting the starting point intimated the possibility of adjusting it pending the completion of a survey for the preparation of its national phase-out plan.
- 7. India informed the Secretariat, directly and through UNDP and the World Bank, that three of its projects were completed as of 31 December 2000 and therefore should not have been included in the calculation of option 2. The projects, which belonged to the foam, refrigeration and aerosol sectors, were approved for the phase-out of 290, 351.7 and 125 ODP tonnes, respectively. The Secretariat relied on the information provided in the 2000 progress reports of the implementing agencies for determining whether an approved project was completed or was still ongoing.
 - According to the progress report submitted by UNDP as of 31 December 2000, 145 of the 290 ODP tonnes from the foam project were reported as phased out. This amount was, therefore, not included in the calculation by the Secretariat of option 2.

It is to be noted that in its progress report submitted to the 37th Meeting (as of 31 December 2001), UNDP indicated that this foam project was completed, and that it had experienced some delays due to the appearance of technical problems early on, which were solved by suppliers by March of 2001. Experts confirmed the completion of the project in November of 2001.

- As for the refrigeration project, the World Bank reported its status as ongoing, as of 31 December 2000, indicating that "the foaming machine was delivered and was being commissioned and the suppliers for the refrigerant component had been identified and purchased orders placed". As a result, the consumption of the project -which was established at project approval at 351.7 ODP/tonnes- was included as "CFC approved by not implemented" in the calculation by the Secretariat of option 2. In its 2001 progress report submitted to the 37th Meeting (as of 31 December 2001), the World Bank indicated that the project was ongoing. The report does not however list any ODP phased out.
- Regarding the aerosol project, UNDP indicated in its 2000 progress report that the workshop for the aerosol technical assistance project was completed, despite the fact that there was no phase-out recorded. This amount was therefore deducted from India's remaining funding eligibility. It is to be noted that UNDP listed in its 2001 progress report that the aerosol technical assistance project as ongoing, with a planned completion date of December 2002, despite the fact that all of the tonnage was reported as phased-out. It should be noted that through 2001, UNDP disbursed US \$50,236 of a total of US \$155,000 for this project's budget.
- India has requested that its starting point should be revised from 2,172.2 ODP tonnes to 2,891.2 ODP tonnes. It should be noted however that this revised consumption includes 145 ODP tonnes from the foam project and 47.7 ODP tonnes from the refrigeration project which is not admissible.

Countries with pending starting points

8. Annex III lists ten countries which have responded to the Secretariat seeking more information on how the options were calculated or claiming changes in either their baseline or latest consumption data. The annex also provides a summary of the requests from the countries and the Secretariat's responses, as pertinent.

Additional countries with calculated starting point

9. The Secretariat also wishes to inform the Executive Committee of the addition of another five countries to the list of the 99 countries which were covered in the analysis on the starting points in document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/35/61 and Corr.1. These countries have only recently reported complete data pursuant to Article 7. The Secretariat applied the same methodology and data, as it had done with the earlier analysis. The Secretariat has written to the five countries in order to inform them of Decision 35/57 and requested a final decision on the

options. Details of the five countries are presented in Annex IV. The D.R. Congo has already decided in option 2 and is therefore included in Annex I.

Action expected from the Executive Committee

- 10. The Executive Committee may wish to:
 - (a) Take note, with appreciation of the countries in Annex I which have confirmed their starting points;
 - (b) Consider the admissibility of the request by India in Annex II for change of its starting point data under option 2;
 - (c) Consider the appropriate course of action for those countries in Annex II which have not confirmed their final selection of the options, and the countries in Annex III which have not made their selection to date; and
 - (d) Take note of the five additional countries in Annex IV.
