• **Replace** paragraph 16 **with** the following:

16. The amount of programmable resources for new activities in 2004 and 2005 is US \$40.9 and US \$50.3 million, respectively, as indicated in Table 4 plus the carryover of US \$66 million for a total of US \$157.2 million for the remainder of the current triennium (2004 and 2005). [Note: Based on the proposed allocation of US \$237 million for 2004 and US \$178 million for 2005, programmable resources for new activities would amount to US \$86.9 million in 2004 and US \$70.3 million in 2005.]
