OVERVIEW OF ISSUES IDENTIFIED DURING PROJECT REVIEW

Projects and activities presented to the 42nd Meeting

Submissions by Implementing and Bilateral Agencies

1. The total value of multi-year agreements (all tranches), projects and activities received by the Fund Secretariat from implementing and bilateral agencies is US \$124,207,405 (including agency support costs where applicable). The requested level of funding to be considered for approval at the 42nd Meeting amounts to US \$85,207,744 for annual tranches of multi-year agreements, projects, and activities.

Secretariat's review of proposed projects and activities

- 2. The review by the Fund Secretariat of proposals for the funding of projects and activities has resulted in a recommendation for blanket approval of a total of 47 annual tranches, projects and activities amounting to US 27,598,859. Eighteen investment projects and other activities with a total value of US \$3,011,055 have been withdrawn or deferred, including projects which did not provide adequate information or the eligibility of which was in doubt.
- 3. The incremental costs of investment projects and annual tranches of sector plans and national phase-out plans, with a total value of requested funds amounting to US \$50,158,309 have been agreed with the relevant implementing agencies, and are submitted for individual consideration in keeping with past practice or because other non cost-related issues are pending. For four projects incremental costs remain under discussion.

Status of the Fund

4. At the time of preparation of this paper, Multilateral Fund resources available for commitment amount to some US \$82 million.

Issues arising from project review

Priority for funding a study on HCFC use in China

The Government of Germany has submitted a request for approval of US \$300,300 to develop a strategy for the long term management of HCFC-22 and other HCFCs in China. The proposal and the Secretariat's comments on it can be found in document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/42/17, Bilateral Cooperation. In addition to specific, project related matters, the submission raises the policy issue of the priority to be accorded at the present time to the funding of projects addressing HCFCs. No such project has so far been approved and Fund policy specifically excludes funding of any second-stage industrial conversions from HCFCs to non-ODS substances (Decision 19/2). This proposal is in a separate category, since it is a long term strategic study, the aim of which is to explore means by which the very rapid growth in consumption of HCFCs in a very large-consuming country might be addressed. HCFCS were not addressed in TEAP's study on the replenishment for the 2003-2005 triennium.

6. The Indicative List of incremental costs does not include policy or institutional support activities, although this project might be considered to fall within item (c)(iii), End Use: cost of providing technical assistance to reduce consumption and unintended emission of ozone depleting substances. Taking the foregoing into account, the Executive Committee might consider whether it wishes to give priority at the present time to a technical assistance project on a strategy for HCFC management.

Support for data reporting in Article-5 countries

- 7. A number of countries for whom institutional strengthening requests have been submitted to the 42nd Meeting have been found to be non-compliant or are at risk of becoming non-compliant because they have failed to report any data in one or more of the reporting categories or years (for example, Dominica, St. Kitts and Nevis and St. Vincent and the Grenadines). In some cases the countries may not have levels of consumption in excess of Montreal Protocol requirements, but are non-compliant simply because data has not been reported.
- 8. In view of the urgent requirement for countries to minimise or eliminate non-compliance, it remains of the highest priority to ensure that needless examples arising from a lack of completion of reporting obligations are prevented. The first point of contact for reporting activities is frequently the implementing agency responsible for the institutional strengthening project in the country concerned. Whenever the Secretariat is reviewing projects in which data reporting is an issue, the Secretariat advises the relevant implementing agency to assist the country to establish and report the relevant data. The Executive Committee might wish to consider urging implementing agencies to provide all assistance possible to countries for whom they are implementing the institutional strengthening project, to eliminate instances of non-reporting of data.
