Progress report

1. The institutional strengthening project for Argentina has enabled the Government to continue the successful implementation of the Montreal Protocol in the country. During phase III of the institutional strengthening project the National Ozone Unit (NOU) continued its monitoring of the country's compliance status with the Montreal Protocol through data collection and monitoring of ODS consumption. The licensing system to control ODS imports and exports is being successfully enforced through commencement of activities such as: registration of importers/exporters; assigning quotas for 2005; and issuing of licenses. In addition, Argentina achieved enactment and is enforcing complementary regulation for compliance with the

Montreal Protocol control measures. The NOU continued implementation activities for on-going projects (investment and non-investment) and development of new ones. Significant progress was achieved in the implementation of methyl bromide phase-out projects in soil fumigation: the Misiones Province was the first province to be declared as "Free of MeBr". Furthermore, Argentina continued awareness activities, participated in Executive Committee meetings and in the Extraordinary Meeting of the Parties as well as regional meetings for Ozone Officers. Argentina also hosted a policy meeting on methyl bromide issues.

2. OPROZ (Oficina Programa Ozono) was created by a Presidential decree. It is comprised of representatives from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Secretariat of Sustainable Development and Environmental Policy and the Secretariat of Industry. Work has started in preparation of modifications to the legislation in order to include the Agriculture, Livestock, Fishing and Foodstuffs Secretariat. Meanwhile, an ad-hoc working group has been established. In addition, two consultative working groups have been created to assist in the halon and methyl bromide sub-sectors and an additional one on CFCs in the refrigeration sector is underway. OPROZ holds regular meetings with other Government entities to discuss matters under joint competence.

Plan of action

3. The NOU of Argentina has planned various activities that contribute to the achievement of the objectives set for the new phase of the institutional strengthening project. These objectives include: continuation of planning, organization, implementation and coordination of all actions required from the Argentine Government through OPROZ, to implement the National Strategy to eliminate Ozone Depleting Substances in accordance with the Montreal Protocol. The NOU of Argentina has developed a thorough plan of action with main activities highlighted as follows: management and co-ordination of programme implementation through various Government policy actions pertaining to the different sectors; monitoring of established policy development and enforcement programs, covering various legislative, regulatory, incentive, disincentive and punitive actions to enable the Government to exercise the required mandates in order to ensure compliance by the industry with the phase-out obligations. The NOU will continue to raise public awareness through various activities.

Annex II

VIEWS EXPRESSED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE ON RENEWALS OF INSTITUTIONAL STRENGTHENING PROJECTS SUBMITTED TO THE 46TH MEETING

Argentina

1. The Executive Committee has reviewed the report presented with the institutional strengthening project renewal request for Argentina. The Committee notes with appreciation that Argentina has successfully complied with all its current Montreal Protocol control measures. The Executive Committee also notes that Argentina has taken some significant steps towards a more complete legal framework for the control of ODS, as well as several other important initiatives. The Executive Committee greatly appreciates the measures that have been taken by the Government to reduce its ODS consumption and is hopeful that, in the next two years, Argentina will continue its strategic approach to ODS phase-out, including the implementation of ongoing sector and national plans, with outstanding success, to achieve rapid and permanent reductions in its current levels of ODS consumption.
