APERÇU DES QUESTIONS SOULEVÉES PENDANT L'EXAMEN DES PROJETS

Les documents de présession du Comité exécutif du Fonds multilatéral aux fins d'application du Protocole de Montréal sont présentés sous réserve des décisions pouvant être prises par le Comité exécutif après leur publication. Par souci d'économie, le présent document a été imprimé en nombre limité. Aussi les participants sont-ils priés de se munir de leurs propres exemplaires et de s'abstenir de demander des copies supplémentaires.

Projets et activités présentés à la 48^e réunion du Comité exécutif

Présentations par les agences bilatérales et les agences d'exécution

1. La valeur totale des accords pluriannuels (toutes les tranches), des projets et des activités reçus par le Secrétariat du Fonds de la part des agences bilatérales et des agences d'exécution est de 74 363 909 \$US (y compris le cas échéant les coûts d'appui d'agence). Le niveau demandé de financement examiné pour approbation à la 48^e réunion s'élève à 73 407 382 \$US pour les tranches annuelles des accords pluriannuels, des projets et des activités.

Examen par le Secrétariat des activités et des projets proposés

2. L'examen des propositions de financement de projets et d'activités par le Secrétariat du Fonds a donné lieu à une recommandation d'approbation globale (voir Annexe I) d'un ensemble de 58 tranches annuelles, projets et activités s'élevant à 21 554 805 \$US. Trente-neuf projets d'investissement et autres activités d'une valeur totale de 3 322 808 \$US ont été retirés ou reportés, notamment des projets qui ne fournissaient pas les bons renseignements ou dont l'admissibilité était contestable.

3. Les surcoûts des projets d'investissement et des tranches annuelles des plans sectoriels et des plans nationaux d'élimination, correspondant ensemble à une demande de financement d'une valeur de 47 827 440 \$US, ont été convenus avec les agences d'exécution concernées et sont présentés pour examen individuel (voir Annexe II) conformément aux pratiques antérieures ou du fait que certaines questions, qui ne sont pas en rapport avec les coûts, restent en suspens.

État du Fonds et répartition des ressources

4. En date du 6 mars 2006, le total des ressources que le Fonds multilatéral pouvait engager s'élevait à 37 598 485 \$US. La valeur des soldes reversés par les agences d'exécution à la 48^e réunion étant de 828 470 \$US, le total des ressources disponibles pour les approbations est de 38 426 955 \$US (rapport sur les soldes et disponibilités des ressources, UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/48/4). La valeur des projets soumis à l'examen du Comité exécutif, à sa 48^e réunion, totalisait 70 084 574 \$US, y compris 3 899 208 \$US en tant que contribution bilatérale au Fonds, comme le montre le tableau ci-dessous. Les ressources sont donc insuffisantes pour permettre au Comité exécutif de décaisser l'ensemble des fonds correspondant aux projets proposés à sa 48^e réunion.

5. Sur la base du tableau ci-dessus, le Secrétariat prend note de ce qui suit :

- a) La demande de financement total pour les projets des groupes 1 à 6 s'élève à 20 279 166 \$US, notant que la valeur des projets soumis au titre de contribution bilatérale aux Fonds (soit 3 899 208 \$US) ne sera pas déduite des ressources disponibles pour les propositions approuvées.
- b) Sur le niveau total de financement lié à des tranches dans le secteur de production (soit 45 906 200 \$US), 17 956 200 \$US correspondent au secteur de la production de CFC dans trois pays (Argentine : 2 100 000 \$US, Chine : 13 975 000 \$US, et Venezuela : 1 881 200 \$US). Un montant supplémentaire de 27 950 000 \$US est relié à la consommation et la production de CTC dans le secteur des agents de transformation en Chine (phase I, d'un niveau de financement de 17 200 000 \$US et phase II, d'un niveau de financement de 10 750 000 \$US).

6. Le Secrétariat est actuellement en train discuter avec les agences d'exécution concernées sur les modalités de financement de tous les projets qui pourraient être approuvés à la 48^e réunion, afin de minimiser l'incidence qu'un retard de décaissement de fonds pourrait avoir sur leur mise en œuvre. Sur la base des résultats de ces discussions et en tenant compte des contributions supplémentaires qui pourraient être reçues avant la 48^e réunion, le Secrétariat proposera au Comité exécutif une procédure de décaissement de fonds pour tous les projets approuvés.

Présentation des propositions de Plan de gestion de l'élimination finale (PGEF) aux fins d'examen individuel

7. Au nom respectivement du gouvernement de la Dominique et du gouvernement de Saint-Kitts-et-Nevis, le PNUD et le PNUE ont proposé à l'examen du Comité exécutif des Plans de gestion de l'élimination finale pour l'élimination complète des CFC dans ces deux pays. Les descriptions de projet, les observations et les recommandations du Secrétariat et les accords conclus entre les deux pays concernés et le Comité exécutif sont présentés dans les documents UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/48/29 et UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/48/38.

8. Les deux propositions des PGEF ont été préparées conformément aux décisions pertinentes prises par le Comité exécutif, en particulier les décisions 31/48 (mises à jour de plan de gestion

de frigorigènes (PGF)) et 45/54 (les PGEF pour les pays à faible volume de consommation ou PFV). Bien que toutes les questions de politiques, de technique et de coûts aient été résolues et convenues entre le Secrétariat et les agences d'exécution concernées, le Secrétariat a classé ces projets comme devant faire l'objet d'un examen individuel, étant donné qu'ils représentent des plans d'élimination finale, qu'ils ont un financement pluriannuel et comprennent des projets d'accord entre les gouvernements concernés et le Comité exécutif.

9. Conformément à la décision 45/54, au cours des prochaines années, quelque 69 pays supplémentaires à faible volume de consommation pourraient proposer un PGEF visant l'élimination complète de leur consommation de CFC restante. À l'achèvement de leur PGF ou des mises à jour du PGF, la consommation restante maximum admissible au financement représentera au plus 15 % de la valeur de référence de leur consommation de CFC, qui va de 0,3 tonne PAO pour le pays ayant la plus basse valeur de référence pour les CFC à 50,0 tonnes PAO pour le pays ayant la valeur de référence la plus élevée. Le niveau de financement pour l'élimination de la consommation restante a été fixé par le Comité exécutif dans le cadre de la décision 45/54.

10. Tenant note que les niveaux de consommation pris en main par les PGEF sont relativement faibles, que les niveaux maximum de financement ont déjà été fixés et du nombre de projets qui seront probablement présentés, le Comité exécutif pourrait considérer s'il désire continuer à examiner chaque projet individuellement ou bien si le Secrétariat pourrait être prié de présenter tous les futurs PGEF pour les pays à faible volume de consommation pour une approbation globale, sous réserve qu'ils soient conformes aux politiques et décisions pertinentes du Fonds multilatéral, qu'ils ne contiennent pas de problèmes de politiques et que toutes les questions techniques et financières aient été convenues entre le Secrétariat et les agences bilatérales et/ou d'exécution concernées.
