OVERVIEW OF ISSUES IDENTIFIED DURING PROJECT REVIEW

Pre-session documents of the Executive Committee of the Multilateral Fund for the Implementation of the Montreal Protocol are without prejudice to any decision that the Executive Committee might take following issue of the document.

For reasons of economy, this document is printed in a limited number. Delegates are kindly requested to bring their copies to the meeting and not to request additional copies.

Projects and activities presented to the 50th Meeting of the Executive Committee

Submissions by Bilateral and Implementing Agencies

- 1. The Secretariat received for consideration at the 50th Meeting, multi-year agreements, projects and activities amounting to a total of US \$126,386,842. This includes the total value of new multi-year agreements proposed for approval in principle.
- 2. Of this, 152 submissions amounting to US \$119,180,830 refer to specific annual tranches and other projects/activities submitted for funding at this Meeting (including agency support costs where applicable). The number of projects and programmes submitted which are being forwarded by the Secretariat to the Executive Committee for consideration is 130, or 85.5 per cent of the total number of submissions, with a value amounting to US \$68,717,583, or 57.7 per cent of the total value of funding requests made.
- 3. The list of projects recommended by the Secretariat for blanket approval contains 105 activities with a total value of US \$28,299,867. They represent 80.8 per cent of the total number of submissions and 41.2 per cent of the value of the submissions forwarded to the Executive Committee for funding at this Meeting. The list is contained in Annex I.
- 4. A total of 28 projects/activities are recommended by the Secretariat for individual consideration for a number of reasons ranging from project cost to the traditional practice of noting a new multi-year agreement being approved. In terms of percentage, these projects are 21.5 per cent of the total number of submissions and 12.4 per cent of the value of submissions forwarded to the Executive Committee for funding at this Meeting. The list of investment projects for individual consideration is contained in Annex II.
- 5. A new list of incomplete submissions has been introduced at this meeting, which contain a project proposal that does not meet the submission requirements in terms of conducting the verification to confirm the performance of the programme in the previous year. The issue of incomplete submission is further elaborated under the next section on policy issues.
- 6. 19 projects/activities have been withdrawn by the agencies submitting them.

Status of the Fund

7. At the time of writing this paper, the fund balance of the Multilateral Fund stands at US \$47,649,071 which should not be sufficient to cover all the projects and activities submitted for consideration at the 50th Meeting, assuming that those projects on the list for individual consideration would be cleared for approval.

Policy issues identified in project review

Conditional approval of annual work programmes of multi-year agreements (MYAs)

8. There have been a number of cases where the Executive Committee approved the funding requests of annual work programmes of MYAs on the proviso that some unfulfilled requirements are met prior to fund disbursement. These unfulfilled requirements include the submission of data, the submission of the verification report and the enactment of national legislation. The

concerned projects are not referred back to the Committee, as in the case of most of the conditional approvals the Executive Committee decisions specify that the party responsible should ensure that the requirements have been met and disbursement could then proceed. However there are cases where the Executive Committee decision does not designate unambiguously the party responsible for the follow up and the 2006 annual work programme, and the Libyan a national CFC phase-out plan submitted to the 50th Meeting is such a case.

- 9. In approving the 2005 annual work programme of the Libyan national CFC phase-out plan (decision 45/50), the Executive Committee set three conditions for the disbursement of funds (US \$720,000 plus US \$54,000 as support cost):
 - (a) Submission of the 2004 Article 7 data to the Ozone Secretariat;
 - (b) Submission of the 2002 and 2003 country programme implementation reports to the Fund Secretariat; and
 - (c) Written confirmation received on the enactment of legislation establishing a system for ODS imports and exports.
- 10. The first two conditions were met. However there is a difference of opinion between UNIDO, as the implementing agency, and the Fund Secretariat as to whether Libya has met the last condition. Evidently a judgement is needed but the party responsible for making that judgement has not been identified in the decision. The result is that UNIDO has disbursed US \$500,000 based on its interpretation of the language of the decision and based on the information regarding the enactment of the legislation in Libya.
- 11. To obviate the possibility that an agency could inadvertently authorise the release of funds in circumstances where compliance with the Committee's requirements may be at issue, the Executive Committee might wish to clarify that in all cases where conditions have been placed on the release of approved funds, the agency concerned should coordinate with, and confirm with the Secretariat that the conditions for release of funds have been met, prior to the funds being released.

Audit of ongoing TPMPs in LVC countries

- 11. Decision 45/54 establishing the conditions for preparation and funding of TPMPs contains the requirement that a randomly selected sample of 10 per cent of on-going TPMPs in LVCs be audited on an annual basis and the costs of the audits should be added to the work programme of the lead implementing agency which will carry it out.
- 12. 19 TPMPs have been approved and are ongoing. Accordingly, the Secretariat wishes to inform the Committee that a random selection of two TPMPs has been made and the relevant agencies are invited to present requests for funding for audits in these countries to the 51st Meeting in the context of their work programmes for 2007. The countries and projects concerned are: TPMPs in Croatia and Trinidad and Tobago. The implementing agencies will be UNDP and UNIDO.
- 13. For the information of the Committee, the selection process was undertaken on the basis of the following principles:

- (a) Case studies of RMPs and RPM updates have been conducted in 10 countries in the context of the evaluation programme. In view of the information already available about progress in these countries they were not included in the first random selection for audit;
- (b) TPMPs under implementation through the Government of Germany as bilateral implementing agency were not included in the first random selection because there is currently no scope for Germany to submit a request for additional bilateral cooperation funds to cover the cost of an audit; and
- (c) The TPMPs for Croatia and Trinidad and Tobago were selected randomly from the remaining five candidates.
- 14. The Executive Committee may wish to note that the first random audits of 10 per cent of ongoing TPMPs are programmed for consideration of funding at the 51st Meeting.

Submissions that do not conform to Executive Committee requirements

- 15. The Executive Committee has from time to time indicated the requirements that should be applied to the content and quality of project submissions. The most recent of these was decision 44/12 which requested agencies to ensure that "all verification procedures required under the relevant agreement had been completed and were included in the project document prior to submission".
- 16. A significant number of projects and activities submitted to the Secretariat for presentation at the 50th meeting failed to contain one or more basic elements necessary for them to be considered as potentially approvable. For example, 7 tranche requests either did not contain any verification reports or contained draft or preliminary reports that did not meet, prima facie, fundamental verification requirements. Some of these projects are listed in document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/50/13 (annual tranche submission delays).
- 17. In each case, once submitted, the Secretariat commences its review activity and enters into discussions with the relevant agency about the adequacy or otherwise of the relevant submission, including pointing out the failure to meet the Committee's requirements for the documentation to be submitted.
- 18. This has provided a continual challenge to the Secretariat for completing the review of the submissions within the deadlines sought by the Committee and to the standard established over the life of the Multilateral Fund. The necessity to review and negotiate the submission, or otherwise of the material that fails to meet basic requirements, including those explicitly defined in Committee decisions, is becoming a significant factor in placing considerable pressure on the time available to the Secretariat to complete all the tasks prior to the meeting.
- 19. Therefore the Committee might at this stage consider the merits of strengthening its previous detailed requests for submissions to be complete and for these to meet the basic requirements for approval, by explicitly requesting the Secretariat not to include in meeting documentation proposals for projects and activities that do not contain by the submission deadline before each meeting the information or components necessary for the submission to be considered as potentially approvable. The Secretariat could be requested to provide to the

Committee a list of all proposals that were received but were not included in meeting documentation, together with the reasons for non-inclusion. Such an arrangement could be applied for a trial period of 18 months, following which the Secretariat, in consultation with agencies, could provide a brief report on its efficacy at the 55th Meeting.
