REPORT ON BALANCES AND AVAILABILITY OF RESOURCES

Pre-session documents of the Executive Committee of the Multilateral Fund for the Implementation of the Montreal Protocol are without prejudice to any decision that the Executive Committee might take following issue of the document.

For reasons of economy, this document is printed in a limited number. Delegates are kindly requested to bring their copies to the meeting and not to request additional copies.

Introduction

1. This document presents a summary of the financial adjustments indicated by the implementing agencies, and agreed by the Fund Secretariat. It includes statistical data from projects with balances held for more than the 12 months allowed following completion of the project, as required by decision 28/7. The data presented are based on the reporting format developed pursuant to decision 31/2 and include both obligated and un-obligated balances. Further to decision 41/92, this document also indicates the level of resources available to the Executive Committee in cash and promissory notes as recorded in the Status of Contributions (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/51/3) plus the amount of funds returned from projects as stated in the report on balances.

Funds being returned to the 51st Meeting

- 2. Information supplied by the implementing agencies indicates that a total of US \$206,668, plus agency support costs, will be returned to the 51st Meeting. This total amount is calculated taking into account completed projects with balances.
- 3. Table 1 indicates the level of funds being returned from each agency.

4. The balance of funds from transferred projects is a negative figure because it consists of a bilateral contribution recorded as a payment by Canada. Once the transfer is approved, the Treasurer may remove the US \$222,464 from bilateral contributions thereby reducing the amount of overall contributions. The Treasurer then could add the US \$206,668 in funds from completed projects to resource availability. The net effect on the level of funds available indicated prior to the decision on the transfer in the Status of Contributions (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/51/3) shows a negative figure of US \$15,796 as shown in Table 1.

Projects with Balances by Year of Completion

5. Table 2 indicates the number of projects with balances that are still being held by the implementing agencies and the years in which those projects were completed. It shows that for projects completed up to and including 31 December 2005 (at least 12 months previously) implementing agencies had balances totalling US \$5,516,869.

- 6. At its 47th Meeting, the Executive Committee requested that the Fund Secretariat continue to monitor multi-year annual tranches in the context of documents on implementation delays and project balances (decision 47/50(b)(ii)). The World Bank did not report on 26 multi-year agreements (MYAs) with balances amounting to US \$41,784,594. Without reporting on these MYAs, the Bank has the lowest reported balance (US \$375,028).
- 7. UNEP holds the highest reported balance (US \$2,182,153) with US \$16,134 attributable to multi-year annual tranches. UNIDO holds a total balance valued at US \$1,941,140 with US \$358,295 attributable to multi-year agreements. UNDP holds a total balance of US \$952,493 of which US \$140,625 is attributable to multi-year agreements. UNEP also has the highest number of projects with balances (84) as well as the highest total balance at US \$2,182,153. The other agencies have 72 or fewer projects with balances.
- 8. All agencies have projects that were completed over two years ago that have remaining balances. Most of the funds (US \$1,562,328 of US \$3,077,442) are attributed to UNIDO's nine reported projects that were completed over two years ago. UNEP has 48 projects that were completed over two years ago, with balances totalling US \$868,125.

Obligated and Un-obligated Balances

9. The level of balances classified as obligated and un-obligated for the four implementing agencies are as follows:

- 10. Of the total balance of US \$5,516,869 from completed, cancelled and ongoing projects, US \$4,846,417 is obligated (which means that these funds are expected to be spent) and US \$670,452 has not been obligated. Implementing agencies are required to report reasons why any un-obligated balances could not be returned within the required time-frame and to indicate when they will be returned (decision 31/2(a)(ii)). Annex I presents additional information on obligated and un-obligated balances, by agency.
- 11. UNDP has 71 completed projects and one cancelled project. It has no un-obligated balances. The overall number of projects with balances has increased from 64 projects reported to the 50th Meeting to 72 reported to the 51st Meeting. The overall level of balances has increased from US \$649,618 to US \$987,972.
- 12. UNEP has 84 completed projects and total un-obligated balances of US \$282,919 and one cancelled project. The overall number of projects with balances has increased from 70 projects reported to the 50th Meeting to 85 reported to the 51st Meeting, and the overall level of balances has increased from US \$1.9 million to US \$2.2 million.
- 13. UNIDO has 24 completed projects and un-obligated balances amounting to US \$126,930 and one ongoing project. The overall number of projects with balances has increased from 20 projects reported to the 50th Meeting to 25 reported to the 51st Meeting. However, the overall level of balances remained roughly the same at US \$1.9 million.
- 14. The World Bank has 4 completed projects and US \$260,603 in un-obligated balances. The overall number of projects with balances has decreased from 8 individual projects (excluding the balances from 15 MYAs that were reported to the 50th Meeting) to 4 individual projects reported to the 51st Meeting. During that time the level of balances has increased from US \$327,350 for individual projects (US \$20 million including MYAs) to US \$375,028 for individual projects.

Agency Support Costs

15. At its 35th Meeting, the Executive Committee requested that implementing agencies return all agency support costs associated with remaining funds from projects. If expenditures had been incurred from these costs, the implementing agencies should provide an explanation and return the balance of funds (decision 35/13(k)). Table 4 indicates that a total of US \$24,678 in agency support costs will be returned at the 51st Meeting.

Total Resources Available for the 51st Meeting

16. The status of contributions and disbursements as at 16 February 2007 indicates that the Treasurer had a balance available amounting to US \$45,368,160 in cash and promissory notes. The total level of balances returned by multilateral implementing agencies, including agency support costs, is US \$8,882 since the balance provided by the Treasurer contains the Canada's to be adjusted transfer. Therefore, as of 16 February 2007, the total level of resources available for approvals by the Executive Committee at its 51st Meeting is US \$45,377,042. However, the value of submissions to the Meeting, excluding withdrawals, is US \$68,911,963 of which US \$64,489,263 is requested at the current meeting. Therefore, based on the full value of submissions received by the Fund Secretariat, there will not be sufficient resources to enable the Executive Committee to approve all projects submitted to its 51st Meeting.

Comments

17. The Governments of Cuba and Canada are requesting that the Executive Committee approve the transfer of the Cuban chiller project (CUB/REF/47/DEM/35) from Canada to UNDP. A total of US \$222,464 was approved in bilateral contributions for Canada for this project and this amount should be deducted from Canada's bilateral contributions. Since no funds have been disbursed, the project funding amounting to US \$196,871 (plus nine per cent agency fees amounting to US \$17,718) should be transferred to UNDP. Since Canada received 13 per cent agency fees amounting to US \$25,593, the transfer will cost the Multilateral Fund US \$7,875 less.

- 18. As mentioned above, the World Bank did not report on 26 annual tranches that had been classified as completed and, according to the records of the Fund Secretariat, were to be addressed in the Bank's submission of completed projects with balances. The Bank indicated that it had interpreted decision 49/12(b) as requiring the Bank to change the completion dates and the Bank has done so based on the proposed completion dates that it submitted to the 50th Meeting. The Bank had, in the past, declared tranches to be completed upon approval of subsequent tranches (providing that performance requirements under the Executive Committee/country agreements had been met). This took place usually within one year.
- 19. In decision 49/12(b) the Committee requested that the World Bank define completion dates for tranches of MYAs according to the completion of activities associated with the annual tranches. The Executive Committee asked that these dates for those annual tranches for which funds still had to be disbursed be submitted to it for approval at its 50th Meeting. In response to this decision the Bank changed the status of completion for these tranches and submitted them to the 50th Meeting. It should be noted that the Executive Committee did not adopt the Bank's proposed revised completion dates when considering at the 50th Meeting. This is consistent with the Committee's decision from its 47th Meeting that the Fund Secretariat continue to monitor multi-year annual tranches in the context of documents on implementation delays and project balances (decision 47/50(b)(ii)).
- 20. At the 51st Meeting, the Executive Committee will consider the paper on *Issues related to monitoring and reporting on Multi-year Agreements* (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/51/14). This paper proposes a new system for tracking implementation delays for MYAs since the existing system did not function properly with respect to the completion dates proposed by the World Bank. All implementing agencies except the World Bank report on balances from completed tranches of MYAs. Decision 47/50 requires implementing agencies to provide financial information in their annual tranche submission in addition to the information provided in balances reports. However, the document on balances is the only document that presents the total value of the balances from projects and MYAs, by agency. If the balances document did not monitor MYAs, the Executive Committee would no longer receive information on total balances held for MYAs.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 21. The Executive Committee may wish to:
 - (a) Note the report on balances and availability of resources contained in UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/51/5;
 - (b) Note the net level of funds being returned by the multilateral implementing agencies to the 51st Meeting against project balances totalling US \$206,668. This includes the return of US \$115,285 from UNDP, US \$755 from UNEP, US \$58,499 from UNIDO, and US \$32,129 from the World Bank.
 - (c) Note the net level of support costs being returned by the multilateral implementing agencies to the 51st Meeting against project support cost balances

- totalling US \$24,678. This includes the return of US \$14,058 from UNDP, US \$44 from UNEP, US \$6,399 from UNIDO, and US \$4,177 from the World Bank;
- (d) Note that implementing agencies had balances totalling US \$3,077,442 excluding support costs from projects completed over two years ago. This includes US \$408,173 plus support costs from UNDP, US \$868,125 plus support costs from UNEP, US \$1,562,328 plus support costs from UNIDO, and US \$238,816 plus support costs from the World Bank;
- (e) Approve the transfer of US \$196,871 in project costs and US \$17,718 in support costs for the chiller project in Cuba (CUB/REF/47/DEM/35) from Canada to UNDP and reduce the level of Canada's bilateral contributions, accordingly;
- (f) Note that US \$45,377,042 (to be updated at the meeting) was available to the Executive Committee for approvals at the 51st Meeting; and
- (g) Request the World Bank to report on balances from completed tranches of MYAs, in line with the other implementing agencies.
