ANNUAL TRANCHE SUBMISSION DELAYS

Pre-session documents of the Executive Committee of the Multilateral Fund for the Implementation of the Montreal Protocol are without prejudice to any decision that the Executive Committee might take following issue of the document.

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### Overview

1. This document is submitted as a follow-up to the decision taken at the 47<sup>th</sup> Meeting, which requested a separate agenda item on delays in the submission of annual tranches and disbursement of funds for tranches and obligations (decision 47/50(d)) at future meetings of the Executive Committee. This request emanates from a history of late submissions of annual tranches that result in delays in transferring funds and in fulfilling obligations to fund the activities required by the annual tranches. The agenda item is intended to enable the Executive Committee to encourage relevant countries and agencies to increase their efforts to submit annual tranches to the next meeting of the Executive Committee and to address difficulties in meeting deadlines with respect to the submission of annual tranches.

2. This document addresses delays in the submission of tranches that were due at the  $51^{st}$  Meeting and presents recommendations for consideration by the Executive Committee. At its  $50^{th}$  Meeting, the document also addressed the submission of an annual tranche that was incomplete and therefore had to be withdrawn. However, there were no such submissions to the  $51^{st}$  Meeting.

## Annual Tranche Delays (tranches due for submission to the 51<sup>st</sup> Meeting)

3. Thirty-eight annual tranches were due for submission to the  $51^{st}$  Meeting. Of these, sixteen have not been submitted, which is an increase from the  $50^{th}$  Meeting when eleven tranches were not submitted. Table 1 presents the tranches not submitted to the  $51^{st}$  Meeting, along with the reasons provided by the relevant implementing agency. The breakdown, by agency, is as follows: France (1), UNDP (5), UNEP (5), UNIDO (3) and the World Bank (2).
