#### REPORT ON BALANCES AND AVAILABILITY OF RESOURCES

Pre-session documents of the Executive Committee of the Multilateral Fund for the Implementation of the Montreal Protocol are without prejudice to any decision that the Executive Committee might take following issuance of the document.

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#### Introduction

1. This document presents a summary of the financial adjustments indicated by the implementing agencies and agreed to by the Fund Secretariat. The document includes statistical data from projects with balances that have been held for over the allowable 12-month period following completion of the project, as required by decision 28/7. The data presented are based on the reporting format that has been developed pursuant to decision 31/2 and include both obligated and un-obligated balances. Further to decision 41/92, this document also indicates the level of resources available to the Executive Committee in cash and promissory notes as recorded in the Status of Contributions (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/53/3), plus the amount of funds returned from projects as stated in the report on balances. With the addition of balances returned from projects that may be cancelled at this meeting and ongoing projects, the total balances addressed in this report amounts to US \$15,288,092.

## Funds being returned to the 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting

- 2. Information supplied by the implementing agencies indicates that a total of US \$292,961 plus agency support costs will be returned to the 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting. This amount is calculated taking into account completed projects with balances.
- 3. Table 1 indicates the level of funds being returned by each agency.

#### Projects with balances by year of completion

4. Table 2 presents the number of projects with balances that are still being held by the implementing agencies and the years in which those projects were completed. It shows that for projects completed up to and including 30 September 2006 (at least 12 months previously) implementing agencies had balances that totalled US \$15,095,663.

- 5. At its 47<sup>th</sup> Meeting, the Executive Committee requested the Fund Secretariat to continue to monitor multi-year annual tranches in the context of documents on implementation delays and project balances (decision 47/50(b)(ii)).
- 6. The World Bank holds the highest reported balance (US \$11,929,010) all of which is attributable to multi-year annual tranches. UNEP holds a total balance of US \$1,820,696, of which US \$200,532 is attributable to multi-year agreements (MYAs). UNIDO holds a total balance of US \$835,377, of which US \$222,308 is attributable to MYAs. UNDP has the lowest reported balance (US \$703,009) none of which is attributable to MYAs. UNEP has the highest number of projects with balances (80) followed by UNDP (36), the World Bank (22), and UNIDO (21).
- 7. All agencies have projects that were completed over two years ago that have remaining balances. Most of the funds (US \$7,888,725 of US \$9,576,651) are attributed to the World Bank's 12 reported projects that were completed over two years ago. UNEP has 39 projects that were completed over two years ago, with balances totalling US \$899,062.
- 8. Agencies have been asked to clarify why obligated balances remained for projects completed over three years ago. The World Bank holds balances amounting to US \$3,049,354 for projects that had been completed by December 2003. These balances were from six early MYAs. The lowest balance stands at US \$178,000 (for the Malaysia CFC project, which had been approved at the 37<sup>th</sup> Meeting) and the largest at US \$775,117 (for the Philippines CFC project, which had been approved at the 38<sup>th</sup> Meeting). The MYA tranches had been considered completed when the next tranche was approved. In several cases, the funds were allocated for activities that would be conducted over a period of several years, and in other cases the balances represent savings that would be reallocated using the flexibility clause. The Bank indicated that

for the Argentina Production Closure project the annual plan balance had been allocated for technical assistance activities by the Government associated with the closure of FIASA, the production facility. These funds are used to carry out annual financial and technical audits and other activities associated with the closure by the Government.

- 9. UNEP indicated that the main reasons for balances still remaining for those projects that had been completed by the end of 2003, is that final reports of expenditures are difficult to get for some of the projects implemented in countries with difficult administrations such as Liberia, Guinea Bissau, Nepal or Democratic Republic of Congo and/or the replies to UNEP's queries are provided at a slow pace. In several cases, there are delays in receiving confirmation of payments from UN country offices. With respect to the US \$193,959 left to be disbursed against the 2005 CAP budget, UNEP indicates that US \$146,864 has been obligated under sub-contracts. There are also US \$23,295 in travel costs of CAP staff and US \$23,800 related to personnel that have not been liquidated. UNEP stated that most of the balances related to meetings and sub-contracts remained as commitments pending the submission of final expenditures reports and in some cases the submission of outputs. UNEP indicated that it would closely follow up on the issue to obtain the pending reports/outputs to expedite the pending payments.
- 10. UNDP had a balance of US \$12,168 still obligated for projects that had been completed by December 2003. UNDP indicated that the balances totalling US \$12,168 were reported as obligated because the projects in question are implemented by the government. As the balance of funds that are related to cash advances has not yet been returned by the government, UNDP is either waiting for a payment from the government prior to returning the funds, which would then be returned to the Multilateral Fund, or the government could submit a financial report which would require that additional expenditure be recorded by UNDP. UNDP is asking its country offices to resolve these issues.
- 11. UNIDO had a balance of US \$11,148 still obligated for projects that had been completed by December 2003. These balances are being held because the obligation to UNDP's country office has not been terminated (mainly because of the war and political instability during the years 2005 and 2006). UNIDO is monitoring the obligations, but since the balance is for a multi-year project, no funds are expected to be returned.

#### Obligated and un-obligated balances

12. The level of balances classified as obligated and un-obligated for the four implementing agencies are as follows:

- 13. Of the total balance of US \$15,288,092 from completed, cancelled and ongoing projects, US \$15,167,390 is obligated (which means that these funds are expected to be spent) and US \$120,702 has not been obligated. Implementing agencies are required to report reasons why any un-obligated balances could not be returned within the required time-frame, and to indicate when they will be returned (decision 31/2(a)(ii)). Annex I presents additional information on obligated and un-obligated balances, by agency.
- 14. UNDP has 35 completed projects and one closed project. It has no un-obligated balances. The overall number of projects with balances has decreased from 39 projects reported to the 52<sup>nd</sup> Meeting to 36 reported to the 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting. The overall level of balances has increased from US \$608,083 to US \$703,009.
- 15. UNEP has 78 completed projects and two ongoing projects. It has no un-obligated balances. The overall number of projects with balances has increased from 76 projects reported to the 52<sup>nd</sup> Meeting to 80 reported to the 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting. The overall level of balances has decreased from US \$1.85 million to US \$1.82 million. At its 52<sup>nd</sup> Meeting, the Executive Committee urged UNEP to resolve the US \$1,680,292 in un-obligated balances and report thereon to the 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting. UNEP reported that at the end of its two-year audit cycle, all obligated balances are cancelled and become un-obligated until they can be re-obligated. It indicated that this was the case for the un-obligated balances reported to the 52<sup>nd</sup> Meeting and now those sums have either been re-obligated or they have become project balances.
- 16. UNIDO has 20 completed projects, one ongoing project, and un-obligated balances of US \$120,702. The overall number of projects with balances has increased from 18 projects reported to the 52<sup>nd</sup> Meeting to 21 reported to the 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting, and the overall level of balances has increased from US \$803,385 to US \$835,377.
- 17. The World Bank holds US \$11,929,010 in obligated balances for completed projects, of which all were for multi-year projects. It has no un-obligated balances. The overall number of projects with balances has decreased from 25 projects reported to the 52<sup>nd</sup> Meeting to 22 reported to the 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting, and the overall level of balances has decreased from US \$25,837,831 to US \$11,929,010.

#### **Agency support costs**

18. At its 35<sup>th</sup> Meeting, the Executive Committee requested that implementing agencies return all agency support costs associated with remaining funds from completed projects. If expenditures had been incurred from these costs, the implementing agencies should provide an explanation and return the balance of funds (decision 35/13(k)). Table 4 indicates that a total of US \$24,787 in agency support costs will be returned at the 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting.

#### **Project transfers**

- 19. The Government of Kenya requested that the national methyl bromide projects (KEN/FUM/44/INV/38 and KEN/FUM/50/INV/40) should be transferred from UNDP to UNIDO. UNDP indicated that the unspent balance of funds for the two tranches amounts to US \$510,659. Since a new agreement is needed to effect the transfer to UNIDO, the approval of the agreement is addressed in the Overview Paper (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/53/15).
- 20. The Government of Niger requested that the TPMP project preparation approved at the 48<sup>th</sup> Meeting (NER/PHA/48/PRP/17) should be transferred from UNDP to UNIDO. Since none of the funds have been disbursed, the full amount of the approval can be transferred to UNIDO.
- 21. Through its decision 52/33, the Executive Committee approved the transition strategy and the project for the phase-out of CFC consumption in the manufacture of MDIs in the Islamic Republic of Iran subject to a deduction of US \$465,500 to be applied to the approved amount of the MDI conversion project or to the national phase-out plan (NPP) for Iran, or both, at the country's discretion, in order to eliminate double-counting of funds. UNIDO was requested to report back to the Executive Committee at its 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting on the choice made. The Government of the Islamic Republic of Iran has agreed to deduct half of the amount from the MDI conversion project. Therefore, UNIDO is returning US \$232,750 plus agency support costs of US \$17,456 for UNIDO to the 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting of the Executive Committee. Since this modification involves a modification of the agreement, this issue is also addressed in the Overview of Issues Identified during Project Review (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/53/15).

## Total resources available for the 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting

22. The status of contributions and disbursements as of 22 October 2007 indicates that the Treasurer had an available balance amounting to US \$102,052,565 in cash and promissory notes. The total level of balances returned by multilateral implementing agencies, including agency support costs, is US \$317,748. Therefore, as of 22 October 2007, the total level of resources available for approvals by the Executive Committee at its 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting is US \$102,370,313. The issue of resources available for the 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting, in light of the value of potential approvals, is addressed in the document "Overview of issues identified during project review" (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/53/15).

#### **COMMENTS**

23. Of the US \$15.3 million in projects with balances in this report, about US \$12.3 million is for MYAs and of that amount US \$11.9 million is under World Bank implementation. The issue of balances from MYAs is therefore mostly an issue for the World Bank, noting that UNDP had zero balances for MYAs and the other agencies had balances for MYAs that were less than US \$223,000. As explained by the Bank, most of the balances from its oldest projects are from projects savings to be used for future activities. The issue of balances appears most likely related to the issue of the definition of completion for the annual tranches of MYAs and perhaps the original design, that in the case of savings lead to an overestimation of the costs for the annual tranche or, in the case of activities lasting over several years, reported a completion date that was not related to when the anticipated funding activities were to be completed, but rather was related to when the next tranche would be approved.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- 24. The Executive Committee may wish to:
  - (a) Note the report on balances and availability of resources contained in UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/53/4;
  - (b) Note the net level of funds being returned by the multilateral implementing agencies to the 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting amounting to US \$292,961 against project balances. This takes into account a reimbursement to UNIDO of US \$280,915, and returns of US \$551,168 from UNDP and US \$22,708 from UNEP;
  - (c) Note the net level of support costs being returned by the multilateral implementing agencies to the 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting amounting to US \$24,787 against project support cost balances. This takes into account a US \$20,934 reimbursement to UNIDO, and the return of US \$42,769 from UNDP and US \$2,952 from UNEP;
  - (d) Note that multilateral implementing agencies had balances totalling US \$9,576,651 excluding support costs from projects completed over two years ago. This includes US \$119,512 from UNDP, US \$899,062 from UNEP, US \$669,352 from UNIDO, and US \$7,888,725 from the World Bank;
  - (e) Note the transfer of US \$510,659 plus agency fees from UNDP to UNIDO for national methyl bromide projects in Kenya (KEN/FUM/44/INV/38 and KEN/FUM/50/INV/40);
  - (f) Note the transfer of US \$12,000 plus agency fees from UNDP to UNIDO for the TPMP project in Niger (NER/PHA/48/PRP/17); and
  - (g) Note that US \$102,370,313 (to be updated at the meeting) was available to the Executive Committee for approvals at the 53<sup>rd</sup> Meeting.
