OVERVIEW OF ISSUES IDENTIFIED DURING PROJECT REVIEW

Pre-session documents of the Executive Committee of the Multilateral Fund for the Implementation of the Montreal Protocol are without prejudice to any decision that the Executive Committee might take following issuance of the document.

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PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES PRESENTED TO THE 54TH MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Introduction

1. This document has three sections. Section I provides the statistics on the submissions to the 54th Meeting received from implementing and bilateral agencies. It also has an assessment of the fund balance available against the demand for funds from the submissions, and proposed solutions for managing the cash flow in case of a short fall. Section II presents two policy issues identified by the Secretariat from the review of the submissions to the meeting. Section III, which is a new addition introduced from the 52nd Meeting, presents proposed amendments to approved projects or annual tranches of multi-year agreements (MYAs) does not have a submission at this meeting.

Section I. Submissions by bilateral and implementing agencies

- 2. The Secretariat received for consideration at the 54th Meeting multi-year agreements, projects and activities amounting to US \$64,188,678. This amount includes the total value of new multi-year agreements proposed for approval in principle.
- 3. The total also covers 239 funding requests, which include specific annual tranches and other projects/activities amounting to US \$55,522,883 (including agency support costs where applicable). Following review by the Secretariat, the number of projects and programmes which are being forwarded to the Executive Committee for consideration is 206 or 86.2 per cent of the total number of the funding requests that had been received, with a value of US \$48,853,430 or 88 per cent of the total value of the requests.
- 4. The list of projects recommended by the Secretariat for blanket approval contains 41 activities with a total value of US \$20,108,786. These represent 17.2 per cent of the total number of funding requests received and 36.2 per cent of the value of the requested funding level. A list of these projects is contained in Annex I.
- 5. A total of 165 projects and activities, which include activities under work programme and work programme amendments, as well as investment projects, are recommended by the Secretariat for individual consideration for a number of reasons. These range from continuing discussion on remaining issues between the Secretariat and the responsible implementing agencies to the need for a coordinated solution between CFC production and consumption phase out to assist the country concerned in achieving the required reduction targets. In terms of percentage, these projects are 69 per cent of the total number of funding requests and 51.4 per cent of the value of the requested funding level. The list of investment projects for individual consideration is contained in Annex II.
- 6. In compliance with decision 52/3 (c), which requests the Secretariat to list projects not required for compliance separately as per the compliance-oriented model in its submissions to the meetings, the Secretariat has included these projects in Annex III, that contains non-CAP related activities from UNEP, projects in the MDI sector, methyl bromide sector, and HCFCs. The HCFC projects, which are the majority in this long list, are included therein because HCFCs are not currently covered by the compliance-oriented model, and will therefore remain on the list for the time being. This issue is addressed in the context of Agenda Item 7(a), "Consolidated

business plan of the Multilateral Fund and consideration of the updated model rolling three-year phase-out plan for 2008-2010". Following decision 52/5 that requires the submission of data on the implementation of the country programme for the approval of funding, Eritrea has not complied with the requirement and its TPMP is placed in the list of projects for individual consideration for various reasons including the absence of this data.

7. There is no incomplete submission as per the definition in decision 50/14. Thirty-three projects/activities have been withdrawn by the agencies submitting them.

Status of the Fund

- 8. At the time of writing this paper, the fund balance of the Multilateral Fund stood at US \$84,352,512 which breaks down into US \$45,007,865 in cash and US \$39,344,647 in promissory notes. Also, US \$532,906 is being returned to the 54th Meeting in the context of the report on balances and availability of resources. Measured against the total demand for cash funds which would be approximately US \$48.85 million, assuming that the projects on the list for blanket approval and for individual consideration be approved at the funding level proposed, there could be a shortfall of approximately US\$ 3.3 million.
- 9. Clearly this is not a budgetary problem but a cash flow problem. However the cash balance may also change if additional contributions are received in cash between now and the time of the 54th Meeting. At the same time, the demand for project funds may also decrease as a result of review and approvals by the Executive Committee at the Meeting.

Section II. Policy issues identified during project review

Work programme and work programme amendments for project preparation for investment and demonstration projects for phasing out HCFC

- 10. A total of 148 requests for HCFC projects were received from UNDP, UNEP and UNIDO as part of their work programme and work programme amendments for the 54th Meeting. These include 108 requests for preparation of HCFC phase out management plans from the three agencies, 22 requests for project preparation for HCFC investment projects from UNIDO, and 18 requests for demonstration projects in ten countries from UNDP.
- 11. The Secretariat is presenting to this meeting the requests from the agencies for funding the preparation of HCFC phase out management plans in the work programme documents of the implementing agencies (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/54/18, 19 and 20). The reason the Secretariat has done so is based on the discussion of the Executive Committee at the 53rd Meeting and the decision to give first priority to the formulation of a national HCFC phase out plan by each Article 5 country. However the Secretariat did not review the reasonableness of the level of funding being requested, or make any recommendations thereon, pending the decision of the Executive Committee on the content and modality of these management plans. That decision hopefully will be made in the context of discussing the draft guidelines for preparing these plans contained in document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/54/53, since there is an expressed intent of the Executive Committee to "do its utmost to approve the guidelines at the 54th Meeting."

- 12. The Secretariat however considers that requesting preparation funds for investment and demonstration projects at this meeting is premature because there are quite a number of policy issues that need to be addressed and decided upon by the Committee before funding of such projects could be agreed. These issues are covered in the draft guidelines for preparing HCFC phase out management plans referred to above and the document on cost related issues (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/54/54). Since all of these projects are included in the consolidated business plan document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/54/6, they will be considered by the Committee at the 54th Meeting. The Secretariat tried to convince the submitting agencies UNDP and UNIDO that they should remove these requests from their work programmes, using the above arguments. UNDP complied with the request but UNIDO declined and insisted that they be programme. As a result UNDP's included in their work work (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/54/19) does not contain these requests while UNIDO's work programme (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/54/20) does.
- 13. The Executive Committee may wish to consider the timing of such requests in the context of its discussion under agenda item 11(a) Draft guidelines for the preparation of HCFC phase-out management plans incorporating HCFC surveys (decision 53/37 (h)); and 11(b) on the preliminary discussion paper providing analysis on all relevant cost considerations surrounding the financing of HCFC phase-out (decision 53/37 (i)).

Compensation for losses from war situations

14. On behalf of the Government of Lebanon, UNDP and UNIDO submitted the 2007 progress report on the implementation of the projects for the phase-out of all remaining soil uses of MB used in the production of cut flowers and tobacco (UNDP), and the phase-out of MB for soil fumigation in strawberry production (UNIDO), for consideration by the Executive Committee at its 54th Meeting. Together with these progress reports, UNDP and UNIDO submitted a request by the Government of Lebanon that the Executive Committee consider approving, on an exceptional basis, an additional US \$62,200 to cover the losses incurred by the project as a result of the critical situation in the country in July 2006. A break-down of the losses is as follows:

15. In addition UNDP is requesting US \$4,298 as support cost (against US\$57,300 additional funding) and UNIDO is requesting US\$368 as support cost (against US\$4,900 additional funding). The Executive Committee may wish to consider the admissibility of funding for losses resulting from war situations. A more detailed description of the request is contained in Annex IV.

Annex IV

LEBANON: PROGRESS REPORT ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROJECTS FOR THE PHASE-OUT OF ALL REMAINING SOIL USES OF MB USED IN THE PRODUCTION OF CUT FLOWERS AND TOBACCO, AND THE PHASE-OUT OF MB FOR SOIL FUMIGATION IN STRAWBERRY PRODUCTION

Background

1. At its 34th Meeting, the Executive Committee approved in principle US \$4,421,945 (US \$2,600,000 and US \$1,821,945 for the projects to be implemented through UNDP and UNIDO respectively) as the total funding available to the Government of Lebanon to achieve the complete phase-out of MB used as a soil fumigant in the production of vegetables, cut flowers, tobacco and strawberries (236.5 ODP tonnes). At its 43rd Meeting, the Executive Committee approved a change of technology in the UNIDO project covering the phase-out of MB for soil fumigation in strawberry production and amended the agreement between the Government of Lebanon and the Executive Committee. At its 52nd Meeting, the Executive Committee approved a revision to the agreement extending the phase-out schedule to 2008. All funding tranches have been disbursed by the Executive Committee to UNDP and UNIDO for the implementation of the two investment projects.

2007 progress report

- 2. During 2007, meetings and discussions took place with farmers and farmers' associations active in the tobacco and cut flowers sectors. Pilot tests were conducted on the application of the new alternative chemicals approved in the cut flowers sector and the bidding process for the procurement of pumps and equipment for the alternative chemicals was initiated, and several awareness and information dissemination activities were implemented.
- 3. Despite pilot sites where alternatives to MB in the tobacco sector had been tested having been destroyed as a result of the 2006 conflicts in the country, as well as the following critical situation in almost all agricultural regions of Lebanon, the project resumed its activities in early 2007. A limited number of pools were constructed for the implementation of the floating tray system at the different tobacco growing regions of Lebanon. However, difficulties in following up on activities at these sites, and the extraordinary stormy weather hindered the continuation of the project, and no tangible results were obtained. Project management has reinitiated its activities in this sector, and is currently preparing to implement a new growing season in coordination with the Lebanese Tobacco Authorities and other major stakeholders.
- 4. Several MB alternatives have been applied as a soil fumigant in strawberry crops, including soil solarization, chemicals and crop rotation. However, these technologies could not be applied in one production area in the North of Lebanon which was inaccessible due to military actions in spring and summer 2007. Several other activities have been implemented, including the optimization of MB alternatives and the setting up of field plots for evaluation in all relevant strawberry producing regions; development of a technical manual and brochures on application of MB alternatives in the strawberry sector and integrated pest management (IPM) practices; and implementation of training workshops for farmers on MB alternatives and IPM practices.

5. The following activities are proposed to be implemented until the project is completed: procurement of 100 dosing pumps and their distribution to farmers; equipment and farm materials for the introduction of the floating tray system and alternative chemicals and implementation of farmer awareness and training activities.

Request for funding compensation

6. Given the impact of the 2006 events on the implementation of the MB phase-out projects in Lebanon, the Government of Lebanon, through its Ministry of the Environment, has requested, that the Executive Committee consider approving an additional US \$62,200 on an exceptional basis to cover the losses incurred by the projects as a result of the critical situation in the country in July 2006.

Secretariat's comments

- 7. The Government of Lebanon submitted comprehensive reports on the implementation of phase VI (year 2007) of the two MB phase-out projects under current implementation.
- 8. The request by the Government of Lebanon for the approval of US \$62,200 to cover the financial loss incurred in the tobacco and strawberry sectors was first submitted to the 52nd Meeting. Noting that at that time it was not possible to assess the overall impact of the 2006 crisis on the MB phase-out projects, the Executive Committee requested the UNDP and UNIDO to submit a report on the implementation of the projects with an assessment of the financial losses that might have occurred for consideration at the 54th Meeting (decision 52/17(g)(iv)).
