APERÇU DES QUESTIONS SOULEVÉES PENDANT L'EXAMEN DES PROJETS

PROJETS ET ACTIVITÉS PRÉSENTÉS À LA 56^e RÉUNION DU COMITÉ EXÉCUTIF

Introduction

1. Ce document comprend deux sections. La première contient les statistiques des propositions présentées par les agences d'exécution et bilatérales à la 56^e réunion. Elle contient également une estimation du solde des fonds disponibles par rapport aux demandes de fonds contenues dans les propositions, ainsi que les solutions proposées pour la gestion des liquidités en cas de manque à gagner. La deuxième section contient une question d'orientation relevée par le Secrétariat lors de l'examen des propositions présentées à cette réunion.

Section I. Propositions des agences bilatérales et d'exécution

2. Le Secrétariat a reçu, pour examen à la 56^e réunion, des propositions d'accords pluriannuels, de projets et d'activités d'une valeur de 104 943 767 \$US. Ce montant comprend la valeur totale des nouveaux accords pluriannuels proposés pour approbation de principe.

3. Ce montant total couvre 148 demandes de financement qui comprennent des tranches annuelles spécifiques et d'autres projets/activités s'élevant à 102 379 257 \$US (incluant les coûts d'appui d'agence, le cas échéant). Le nombre de projets et de programmes transmis au Comité exécutif, suite à l'examen du Secrétariat, s'élève à 139, soit 93,9 % des demandes de financement reçues, pour un montant de 79 853 565\$US, soit 78 % de la valeur totale des demandes.

4. La liste des projets recommandés par le Secrétariat pour approbation globale contient 81 activités, d'une valeur totale de 17 222 699 \$US. Elles représentent 54,7 % du nombre total de demandes de financement reçues et 16,8 % de la valeur des fonds demandés. Une liste de ces projets figure à l'Annexe I.

5. Le Secrétariat recommande pour examen individuel, pour diverses raisons, un total de 58 projets et activités, incluant des activités dans les programmes de travail et les amendements à ces derniers ainsi que des projets d'investissement. Pour les projets d'investissement figurant sur la liste, il s'agit, entre autres, de l'utilisation des soldes de fonds non dépensés des accords pluriannuels qui restent après achèvement jusqu'au niveau de surcoûts admissibles pour un certain nombre de projets d'élimination du CFC pour la fabrication des inhalateurs à doseur. En termes de pourcentage, ces projets représentent 39,2 % du nombre total des demandes de financement et 81,1 % de la valeur des fonds demandés. La liste des projets d'investissement recommandés pour examen individuel figure à l'Annexe II de ce document. Neuf projets/activités ont été retirés par les agences qui les avaient soumis, dont trois que le Secrétariat avait jugé comme étant des propositions incomplètes.

6. Conformément à la décision 52/3c) qui lui demandait d'établir, dans les propositions qu'il présente aux réunions, une liste séparée des activités non requises pour la conformité d'après le modèle axé sur la conformité, le Secrétariat a inclus ces projets dans l'Annexe III. Ils concernent surtout des projets dans le secteur des inhalateurs à doseur.

Situation du Fonds

7. Au moment de la rédaction du présent document, le solde du Fonds multilatéral s'élevait à 99 836 498 \$US dont 70 075 292 \$US en liquidités et 29 761 206 \$US en billets à ordre. En outre, un montant de 1 230 604 \$US est remboursé à la 56^e réunion dans le cadre du rapport sur les soldes et les ressources disponibles, ce qui donne un total approximatif de 71,2 millions \$US pour les liquidités disponibles. Par rapport à la demande totale de liquidités d'environ 79,9 millions \$US, il pourrait y avoir

un manque à gagner de quelques 8,7 millions \$US, si tous les projets recommandés pour approbation globale et pour examen individuel sont approuvés au niveau de financement demandé.

8. Il s'agit clairement d'un problème de liquidités et non d'un problème budgétaire. Toutefois, le solde de trésorerie pourrait lui aussi changer si des contributions additionnelles, en espèces, sont reçues d'ici la date de la 56^e réunion. De même, la demande de fonds pour les projets peut aussi diminuer suite à l'examen et aux approbations du Comité exécutif à la réunion.

Section II. Questions d'orientation relevées lors de l'examen des projets

Réintroduction de demandes de financement de projets antérieurement non approuvées

9. Dans le cadre de l'amendement du programme de travail de l'ONUDI, le Secrétariat a reçu une nouvelle proposition de demandes de préparation de projets pour la conversion des inhalateurs à doseur utilisant du CFC au nom des gouvernements de l'Algérie, de la Syrie et du Venezuela. Ces trois projets avaient été examinés mais non approuvés lors de la 55^e réunion du Comité exécutif.

10. Le Secrétariat a également reçu une correspondance du Gouvernement de la Syrie indiquant le désir de ce dernier d'avoir des éclaircissements sur la non approbation de sa demande, et précisant qu'il avait prié l'ONUDI de proposer de nouveau sa demande à l'examen du Comité lors de cette réunion. Le Secrétariat a informé l'ONUDI qu'il n'était pas en mesure de présenter ces demandes à la 56^e réunion parce qu'elles ne comprenaient aucune information additionnelle justifiant une nouvelle proposition. Ces demandes de l'ONUDI n'ont pas été donc présentées de nouveau au Comité exécutif pour examen.

11. Cependant, le Secrétariat a décidé d'évoquer la question dans le document d'aperçu général des projets pour deux raisons. Premièrement, une situation similaire s'est produite lors de la 54^e réunion à laquelle, sur demande du Gouvernement de la Colombie, la demande de financement pour la préparation d'une stratégie transitoire des inhalateurs à doseur qui n'avait pas été approuvée lors de la 53^e réunion a été apportée de nouveau à la réunion par le biais d'un document d'information soumis par le gouvernement de la Colombie, et cette demande a été plus tard approuvée. La différence entre ces deux scénarios est que l'agence d'exécution n'avait pas présenté de nouveau la demande dans le cas de la Colombie.

12. Deuxièmement, tandis que la pratique actuelle du Comité exécutif est de décourager la réintroduction de demandes qui n'ont pas été approuvées précédemment à moins que de nouvelles informations n'aient été fournies, il n'est pas clair jusqu'où devrait-on appliquer cette pratique, en particulier quand il y a une demande spécifique de réintroduction par le gouvernement concerné. Le cas actuel pourrait être l'occasion pour le Comité exécutif de clarifier davantage la politique relative à la réintroduction de propositions antérieures.
