

OVERVIEW OF ISSUES IDENTIFIED DURING PROJECT REVIEW

PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES PRESENTED TO THE 56^{TH} MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Introduction

1. This document has two sections. Section I provides the statistics on the submissions to the 56th Meeting received from implementing and bilateral agencies. It also has an assessment of the fund balance available against the demand for funds from the submissions, and proposed solutions for managing the cash flow in case of a short fall. Section II presents a policy issue identified by the Secretariat from the review of the submissions to the meeting.

Section I. Submissions by bilateral and implementing agencies

- 2. The Secretariat received for consideration at the 56th Meeting multi-year agreements, projects and activities amounting to US \$104,943,767. This amount includes the total value of new multi-year agreements proposed for approval in principle.
- 3. The total covers 148 funding requests, which include specific annual tranches and other projects/activities amounting to US \$102,379,257 (including agency support costs where applicable). Following review by the Secretariat, the number of projects and programmes which are being forwarded to the Executive Committee for consideration is 139 or 93.9 per cent of the total number of the funding requests received, with a value of US \$79,853,565 or 78 per cent of the total value of the requests.
- 4. The list of projects recommended by the Secretariat for blanket approval contains 81 activities with a total value of US \$17,222,699. These represent 54.7 per cent of the total number of funding requests received and 16.8 per cent of the value of the funding requested. A list of these projects is contained in Annex I.
- 5. A total of 58 projects and activities, which include activities under work programmes and work programme amendments, as well as investment projects, are recommended by the Secretariat for individual consideration for a number of reasons. For investment projects on the list, the issues range from the use of unspent fund balances from multi-year agreements (MYAs) remaining after completion to the level of eligible incremental costs for a number of projects for phasing out CFCs for the manufacture of metered dose inhalers (MDIs). In terms of percentage, these projects are 39.2 per cent of the total number of requests and 81.1 per cent of the value of the funding requested. The list of investment projects for individual consideration is contained in Annex II to this document. Nine projects/activities were withdrawn by the agencies submitting them, three of which were considered by the Secretariat as incomplete submissions.
- 6. In line with decision 52/3 (c), which requests the Secretariat to list separately in its submissions to the meetings, projects not required for compliance as per the compliance-oriented model, the Secretariat has included these projects in Annex III. These concern mostly projects in the MDI sector.

Status of the Fund

7. At the time of writing this paper, the fund balance of the Multilateral Fund stood at US \$99,836,498 which breaks down into US \$70,075,292 in cash and US \$29,761,206 in promissory notes. In addition, another US \$1,230,604 is being returned to the 56th Meeting in the context of the report on balances and availability of resources, which brings the total cash availability to approximately US \$71.2 million. Measured against the total demand for cash funds which would be approximately US \$79.9 million, assuming that the projects on the list for blanket approval and for individual consideration be approved at the funding level proposed, there could be a shortfall of approximately US\$ 8.7 million.

8. Clearly this is not a budgetary problem but a cash flow problem. However, the cash balance may also change if additional contributions are received in cash between now and the time of the 56th Meeting. At the same time, the demand for project funds may also decrease as a result of review and approvals by the Executive Committee at the meeting.

Section II. Policy issues identified during project review

Resubmission of requests for project funding which were not approved

- 9. The Secretariat received, as part of UNIDO's work programme amendment, a resubmission of requests for project preparation for CFC MDI conversion on behalf the governments of Algeria, Syria and Venezuela. These three projects had been considered but not approved at the 55th Meeting of the Executive Committee.
- 10. The Secretariat also received a letter from the Government of Syria indicating its desire to seek clarifications for its request not being approved, and informed the Secretariat that it had requested UNIDO to resubmit its request for the Committee's consideration at this meeting. The Secretariat advised UNIDO that it was unable to present these requests to the 56th Meeting because they did not include any additional information to justify their resubmission. These requests from UNIDO have therefore not been resubmitted for the Executive Committee's consideration.
- 11. However the Secretariat decided to bring the issue up in the overview paper for two reasons. Firstly a similar situation had occurred at the 54th Meeting at which, upon the request from the Government of Columbia, the funding request for preparing an MDI transitional strategy that had not been approved at the 53rd Meeting was brought back to the meeting through an information document submitted by the Government of Colombia and was subsequently approved. The difference between these two situations is that the implementing agency had not resubmitted the request in the case of the Colombia.
- 12. Secondly while the current practice of the Executive Committee is to discourage the resubmission of requests which were not approved previously unless new information was provided, it is not clear about the extent that this should be enforced, especially when there is a specific request from the government concerned for resubmission. This could be the opportunity for the Executive Committee to further clarify the policy on resubmissions.
