执行蒙特利尔议定书 多边基金执行委员会 第五十六次会议 2008年11月8日至12日,多哈

项目审查期间所发现的问题概览

提交执行委员会第五十六次会议的项目和活动

导言

1. 本文件分为两节。第一节载有关于执行机构和双边机构向第五十六次会议提交的呈件的统计数字。该节还对照这些文件要求提供的资金,评估了可供使用的资金余额,并提出了在资金短缺的情况下管理现金流转的解决办法。第二节提出了秘书处在审查提交会议文件的过程中,查明的一项政策问题。

第一节: 双边机构和执行机构的呈件

- 2. 秘书处收到的供第五十六次会议审议的各种多年期协定、项目和活动的资金总额为104.943.767 美元。这一数额包括提议在原则上核准的新的多年期协定的总额。
- 3. 这个总数还涵盖 148 项供资申请,其中包括总额为 102,379,257 美元的具体年度付款和其他项目/活动(包括相应的机构支助费用)。在秘书处进行审查之后,呈送执行委员会审议的项目和方案共有 139 项,占所收到供资申请总数的 93.9 %,金额为 79,853,565 美元,占所有申请资金总额的 78%。
- 4. 秘书处建议一揽子核准的项目清单中列有81项活动,总金额为17,222,699美元。这些活动占所收到供资申请总数的54.7%,占所申请供资额的16.8%。这些项目清单载于附件一。
- 5. 秘书处基于各项理由建议进行单独审议的项目和活动共有 58 项,其中包括工作方案和工作方案修正案内的活动以及投资项目。对于清单上的投资项目,其问题的范围从多年期协定完成后仍剩余的未动用资金余额的使用,到淘汰计量吸入器制造中的氟氯化碳的若干项目的符合条件的增支费用的数额。按百分比计算,这些项目占申请总数的 39.2 %,占所申请供资额的 81.1 %。本文件附件二载有供单独审议的投资项目的清单。有 9 个项目/活动已由提交机构撤回,其中 3 份呈件被秘书处认为不完整。
- 6. 第 52/3 (c)号决定要求秘书处在其提交会议的文件中将不需要履约的项目按面向履约的模式单独列出。根据这一规定,秘书处将这些活动列入了附件三。这些项目主要涉及计量吸入器行业。

基金状况

7. 本文件编写之际,多边基金的资金余额为99,836,498美元,其中70,075,292美元为现金,29,761,206美元为期票。此外,根据资源余额和供应情况的报告,现正将1,230,604美元退还第五十六次会议,因此,可动用现金总额达到了约7,120万美元。假设供一揽子核准和供单独审议的清单上的项目都按拟议供资的数额核准,则所需的现金总额大约为7,990万美元,按此计算可能出现大约870万美元的短缺。

8. 显然这不属预算问题,而是现金流转问题。但如果从现在至第五十六次会议时又收到捐款,则现金余额还可能发生变化。同时,经过执行委员会会议的审查和核准,对项目资金的需求也有可能减少。

第二节:项目审查期间发现的政策问题

重新提交未被核准的项目供资申请

- 9. 秘书处收到了代表阿尔及利亚、叙利亚和委内瑞拉政府重新提交的,作为工发组织工作方案修正的一部分的氟氯化碳计量吸入器改造项目编制的申请。在执行委员会第五十五次会议上,对这三个项目作了审议,但未予核准。
- 10. 秘书处还收到了叙利亚政府的信函,该信函表示该国政府希望请求对其申请未获核准作出澄清,并告知秘书处,该国政府已请工发组织再次提出其申请,供委员会在本次会议审议。秘书处告知工发组织,秘书处无法将这些申请提交第五十六次会议,原因是这些申请没有提供更多的信息说明重新提交是正当的。因此,工发组织的这些申请没有再次提交给执行委员会审议。
- 11. 但出于两项理由,秘书处决定将问题在概览文件中提出。首先,第五十四次会议发生过类似的情况,当时,在哥伦比亚政府的请求下,在第五十三次会议上未获核准的为编制计量吸入器过渡战略供资的申请,因哥伦比亚政府提交了资料文件,又重新提交给会议,嗣后并获得核准。这两种情况的不同之处是,就哥伦比亚而言,执行机构没有再次提交申请。
- 12. 其次,执行委员会当前的做法是不鼓励重新提交以往未被核准的申请,除非提供了新的信息,但尽管如此,应该如何执行这种做法还不很清楚,特别是当有关国家政府提出了再次提交的具体要求时。这可能是执行委员会进一步澄清关于再次提交申请的政策的一次机会。
