Addendum

REVISED RESOURCE ALLOCATION FOR THE 2003-2005 TRIENNIUM (DECISION 39/5)

This addendum is issued to incorporate the submissions of the Governments of Hungary and the United States of America.

• **Replace** paragraph 2 **with** the following:

2. On 17 April 2003, the Secretariat sent letters to 42 non-Article 5 countries requesting them to submit an annual business plan for 2003 and/or a three-year business plan to the 40th Meeting. As of this writing, 16 June 2003, Canada, the Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary, Spain and the United States of America submitted business plans and/or amendments to their business plans for the triennium. According to these supplementary submissions, the total value of bilateral activities during the 2003-2005 triennium amounts to US \$34.5 million.

• **Replace** Table 1 **with** the following table:

• **Add** the following paragraphs:

Hungary

*

15 (bis). The Government of Hungary submitted a business plan letter indicating that it would like to amend its business plan submitted to the 39th Meeting by allocating 20 per cent of its contributions to the Multilateral Fund in the years 2004 and 2005 for the regional network for Europe/Central Asia.

United States of America

18 (bis). The United States of America sent a business plan letter to the Secretariat requesting that US \$10 million of its total contributions for the 2003-2005 triennium should be reserved for the acceleration of phase-out in one or more Article 5 countries. 20 per cent of the total contributions of the United States for 2003 were allocated to 2003 and the balance of the US \$10 million was allocated to 2004.

• **Replace** the first sentence of paragraph 19 **with** the following:

19. Following the submissions to the 40th Meeting, there is US \$12.9 million that was not allocated in business plans of bilateral agencies.

• **Replace** the recommendations **with** the following:

- 1. To note with appreciation the 2003-2005 business plan letters submitted by the Governments of Spain and the United States of America and the amendments to the 2003-2005 business plans of Canada, the Czech Republic, Germany and Hungary as contained in UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/40/11 and Add.1.
- 2. To redeploy US \$12.9 million from the bilateral allocation to a funding window for maintaining momentum and accelerating ODS phase-out.
